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## PREFACE.

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This volume has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 (1) of the Census Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, and is designed for use in conjunction with the 1926 topographical index in order to facilitate reference to the statistics given in the reports on the census taken on the 28th February, 1937.

The following volumes were published in connection with the 1926 census :—

1. SEVEN COUNTY VOLUMES, including a volume for Belfast County Borough. These volumes contain population and housing figures for administrative areas and townlands, and tables dealing with age, marital condition, education, occupation, industry, birthplace, religious profession, orphanhood, and infirmities, together with statistical notes on some of the more outstanding features disclosed.
2. A GENERAL REPORT for the whole country, covering in more detail the statistics shown in the county volumes, and containing, in addition, tables showing :—
  - i. the occupational distribution of persons engaged in each of 51 groups of industries ;
  - ii. the distribution of the foreign born population by nationality, age, marital condition, and occupation ;
  - iii. the distribution of families of dependent children under 16 years of age, by age, sex, marital condition, and occupation of parent ;
  - iv. the occupational distribution of persons suffering from infirmities.
3. A TOPOGRAPHICAL INDEX, dealing in separate alphabetical sections with each type of area for which statistics are published in the county volumes. The particulars given for each territorial unit include references to the 6 inch Ordnance Survey maps and to tables 3, 4, or 5 of the county volumes.

The net prices of the 1926 census publications are 5s. 0d. for each county volume, and 10s. 0d. each for the general report and the topographical index. A complete set of the nine volumes may be obtained directly from the Superintendent, H.M. Stationery Office, 80 Chichester Street, Belfast, at the special inclusive price of £2 2s. 0d. net.

Northern Ireland life tables and rates of mortality (1926) were included in the Registrar-General's Review of Vital Statistics published in 1931 at the price of 5s. 0d. net.

The 1937 census publications will consist of :—

1. SEVEN COUNTY VOLUMES, including a volume for Belfast County Borough. These volumes contain population and housing figures for district electoral divisions and larger administrative areas. Figures for townlands have not been printed, but they have been prepared in the Census Office and are available for reference upon application to the Registrar-General. The county volumes also contain tables dealing with age, sex, marital condition, usual residence, birthplace, and religion, together with statistical notes.
2. A GENERAL REPORT for the whole country, covering in more detail the statistics shown in the county volumes, and containing, in addition, tables on fertility.
3. THIS SUPPLEMENT, arranged in separate alphabetical sections corresponding to those contained in the 1926 topographical index, and including particulars as at the date of the 1937 census for each area which has changed in name, constitution, or boundary during the intercensal period.

The seven county volumes have already been published, and the general report is now in course of preparation.

The net prices of the 1937 census publications are 2s. 6d. each for the county volumes, 5s. 0d. for the general report, and 1s. 0d. for the topographical index supplement.

The Registrar-General is empowered by Section 6 (2) of the Census Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, to prepare and supply from the census returns statistics other than those published in the census reports, at the request and cost of any local authority or person. Any special demands for statistics more detailed than those published (either as regards subject matter or area) can thus, as far as office records permit, be satisfied. Requests for special compilation of census statistics should be addressed to the Registrar-General, who will be pleased to advise and furnish an estimate of cost.

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## INTRODUCTION.

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Following the census of 1926 a topographical index was published in order to facilitate reference to the statistics contained in the 1926 census county volumes, and it covered the following territorial divisions of Northern Ireland as they existed at the date of the 1926 census (18th April):—

1. Parliamentary Constituencies.
2. Poor Law Unions (or Superintendent Registrars' Districts).
3. County (i.e., Urban and Rural) Districts.
4. County Boroughs.
5. County Electoral Divisions.
6. Dispensary (or Registrars') Districts.
7. District Electoral Divisions (including Wards).
8. Towns.
9. Townlands.

Complete topographical particulars, with references to Ordnance Survey maps and tables in the census county volumes, were given for each of the areas numbered 2 to 9. In addition, the sections of the index for the areas numbered 8 and 9 contained references to the territorial units of barony and parish, and section 9 also showed the acreage of each townland.

The present volume is supplementary to the 1926 topographical index, and contains particulars, as at the date of the 1937 census (28th February), of all administrative areas which have been affected by changes in name, constitution, or boundary in the intercensal period. The opportunity has also been taken to include the corrected particulars for a few areas which were shown incorrectly in some small respect in the 1926 index. This supplementary index should, therefore, be used in conjunction with the 1926 full index, particulars being taken from the 1937 supplementary index, if contained therein, or from the 1926 index in the case of areas which were not changed during the intercensal period, and, consequently, do not appear in the supplementary index.

It may be noted that, except in cases where it has been necessary to clarify a reference, entries have not been included in this supplementary index for areas which, although situated in other areas which have changed in name or constitution, have not themselves suffered change. For example, an entry appears for Bangor Municipal Borough (created a municipal borough in 1928), but no entries have been included for the several district electoral divisions or wards of Bangor which are shown in the 1926 index as being situated in Bangor Urban District. It is only on the occasion of a general revision of the index that it would be practicable to cover all such consequential effects of changes in name or constitution of areas.

**Counties.**—Of the six counties in Northern Ireland all but Antrim and Down (the origins of which are uncertain) were formed in or about the year 1584. The largest county is Tyrone, with 779,548 acres, and the smallest is Armagh, with 312,767 acres, excluding in each case the area covered by the larger rivers and lakes.

The powers of the county councils have been considerably extended in recent years, and, besides being the sole rating authorities for rural areas, these councils are invested with comprehensive and important functions in connection with road maintenance and repair, drainage, planning, education, and public health. The county councils receive from the municipal borough and urban district councils in their areas contributions in respect of poor rate and county-at-large charges.

**County Districts.**—There are three classes of county districts, viz., municipal boroughs, urban districts, and rural districts.

Municipal borough status may be conferred on urban districts by the grant of a charter under the Municipal Corporations (Ireland), Act, 1840, and borough councils possess certain privileges extended to them under that Act, while retaining the powers of urban district councils. There are two municipal boroughs, viz., Bangor and Coleraine.

Urban districts and rural districts were formed pursuant to the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, from the sanitary districts established by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878. They consist of one or more district electoral divisions and each has a separate council.

Urban district councils are the sole rating authorities within their respective jurisdictions, and have full administrative powers in matters pertaining to public health. They are also responsible for road maintenance and repair; they may formulate and execute schemes for the housing of the working classes; and they are authorised to provide water and gas supplies. The rates levied by urban district councils include rates in respect of poor relief and county-at-large charges which are transmitted to the county councils. There are 30 urban districts.

Rural district councils have no powers to raise money by way of rate, though their areas form the units of taxation for county purposes. They are represented on and financed by the county councils to whom in each year they make a demand for moneys required by them to carry out their services. They are primarily public health authorities, their functions in this respect being virtually as great as those of urban district councils. They are the authorities controlling unclassified roads. They have also extensive powers in connection with the erection and supervision of houses for agricultural labourers, and have certain functions under the Housing and Small Dwellings Acts and the Planning and Housing Act, 1931. There are 32 rural districts.

**County Boroughs.**—The two county boroughs (Belfast and Londonderry) were established by the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, and their councils possess the same powers and perform the same duties as both county councils and urban district councils. In addition, they possess greatly extended powers under local acts.

**Wards.**—These are sub-divisions of county boroughs, municipal boroughs, and urban districts, and they form the territorial units for the purpose of elections to the councils of these areas. Of the 34 urban areas, 17 are divided into wards, and in all cases but one the ward, or the entire urban district if not divided into wards, is co-extensive with the urban district electoral division. The exception referred to is Newcastle Urban District, which comprises one district electoral division, but is divided into two wards.

**Parliamentary Constituencies.**—The nine territorial constituencies for United Kingdom elections were created by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the forty-eight territorial constituencies for Northern Ireland elections were created by the House of Commons (Method of Voting and Redistribution of Seats) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929. Complete indexes to parliamentary constituencies are included in this volume.

**County Electoral Divisions.**—Each county (but not county borough) is divided into a number of county electoral divisions, each comprising a number of district electoral divisions. The county electoral division is the territorial unit for the election of members of county councils under the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898. In 1923 the county electoral divisions were reconstituted and they now number 129.

**District Electoral Divisions.**—These were originally established under the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1838, as poor law electoral divisions, their present name being fixed by the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898. In rural districts they generally comprise groups of entire townlands and form the territorial units for the election of poor law guardians and rural district councillors. In county boroughs, municipal boroughs and urban districts the unit for the election of poor law guardians is the district electoral division, but the unit for the purpose of municipal elections is the ward, or, in the case of urban districts which are not divided into wards, the entire urban district. Urban district electoral divisions are, however, co-extensive with wards, or with entire urban districts if not divided into wards (except in the case of Newcastle referred to previously). Both the urban and the rural district electoral divisions were reconstituted in 1923, and now number 699.

The reference numbers given to district electoral divisions in the 1937 county volumes are the same as those given in the 1926 county volumes, except in the cases of Counties Antrim and Armagh, where it has been necessary to make a small alteration in the numbering owing to the creation of Whitehead Urban District and the amalgamation of the electoral divisions in Portadown Urban District.

**Poor Law Unions (or Superintendent Registrars' Districts.)**—Poor law unions were established as the area of administration for poor relief by the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1838, and usually comprise one or more urban districts together with the adjoining rural district. They are divided into a number of dispensary districts, each of which comprises a number of district electoral divisions or parts thereof. The district electoral divisions form units for the purpose of the election of poor law guardians. As the guardians levied their own rates prior to the passing of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, it was unnecessary, when unions were being delimited, to pay any regard to county boundaries, and in the case of seven poor law unions out of a total of twenty-seven the union is situated in more than one county or in a county and a county borough. Since 1898 the guardians have been financed by the county councils, to whom they make demands for moneys necessary to meet their expenditure.

The superintendent registrars' districts formed under the Births and Deaths Registration (Ireland) Act, 1863, which established general registration of births and deaths in Ireland, are in all cases identical with the poor law unions, the clerks of the unions being *ex-officio* superintendent registrars. The districts of the registrars of marriages under the Marriages (Ireland) Act, 1844, are also co-extensive with the superintendent registrars' districts and the poor law unions.

**Dispensary (or Registrars') Districts.**—Dispensary districts were created under the Medical Charities Act, 1851. They are sub-divisions of poor law unions, and each comprises a number of entire townlands. Some dispensary districts have been divided into sub-districts, but as each sub-district has a medical officer and is in all but name equivalent to a district, it has not been considered necessary in the census reports to differentiate between them and the districts.

Under the Registration Act of 1863, dispensary districts were adopted by the Registrar-General as registrars' districts, subject to such alterations as might be deemed necessary. At the date of the 1937 census the dispensary districts numbered 178 and the registrars' districts 179, the dispensary district in one case (Belleek) forming two registrars' districts (Belleek and Church Hill).

**Towns.**—(a) TOWNS UNDER THE TOWNS IMPROVEMENT (IRELAND) ACT, 1854.—These towns, which must have a population of 1,500 or more when created, are under the authority of town commissioners, who are limited in the amount of rate they may levy, and whose functions are limited to supervision and carrying out of works of a minor character. As regards public health matters generally these towns are under the control of the councils of the rural districts in which they are respectively situated, and each is subject to rating by the county council in common with the remainder of the rural district. Four towns possess this form of government.

(b) TOWNS OR VILLAGES HAVING FIFTY OR MORE HOUSES BUT NO LEGALLY DEFINED BOUNDARIES.—For census purposes separate statistics are prepared for towns or villages, which in the opinion of the census enumerators, form a "cluster" of houses. Towns or villages of this description number 159, of which 17 contain 1,000 persons or more.

**Townlands.**—The townland is one of the most ancient divisions in the country, and while originally it comprised a number of smaller divisions, such as ploughlands and gneeves, these have now disappeared from use, leaving the townland as the smallest recognised rural division. The establishment of the townland as the unit from which all other rural territorial divisions can be built up can perhaps be said to have commenced with the passing of the Act 6 Geo. IV, cap. 99, which provided for ascertaining the boundaries of townlands and for the collection of grand jury rates and cess by these areas. Townlands which become absorbed by the creation and extension of urban areas cease to have significance and fall into disuse as separate divisions. At the date of the 1937 census the total number of townlands situated in rural districts was 9,416. In size they vary considerably, but on an average they contain about 350 acres each.

**Baronies.**—The barony, which is of considerable antiquity, was originally a feudal and military jurisdiction, but in course of time came to be used for fiscal and administrative purposes only. Later, as the various modern territorial divisions came into existence these gradually displaced baronies as divisions for administrative purposes, and very little use is now made of these ancient divisions. The number of baronies is 58.

**Parishes.**—The parish was originally a purely ecclesiastical division, and it generally bore the name of the townland in which the church was built. Later it came to be used for civil purposes also, and continued to be used in this way until late in the nineteenth century. In many cases, however, the ecclesiastical parish differed from the parish as used for civil purposes owing to alterations of boundary made from time to time by the Privy Council. As in the case of baronies, the parishes as divisions for civil administration have been almost completely displaced by other more recently created divisions. The number of parishes is 268.

**Education Areas.**—Each of the six counties and the two county boroughs forms an education authority for the area under its jurisdiction. While retaining general control, these authorities exercise most of their powers and duties through an education committee in the case of each of the two county boroughs, a regional education committee in each of the counties of Armagh, Down, and Fermanagh, and a number of regional education committees in each of the counties of Antrim, Londonderry, and Tyrone. Each regional education area in the three last named counties comprises one or more entire county districts. The functions of the education authorities embrace the provision of all forms of elementary, secondary, and technical education, either alone or in combination with other education authorities or agencies.

The constitution of each education area and regional education area is as follows :—

**Boundary Alterations.**—The Ministry of Home Affairs has statutory power to alter, by sealed order, the boundaries of local government areas, subject to the provisos that

- (a) Any alteration of a county or county borough boundary shall be confirmed by Parliament.
- (b) A union shall not, if it is conveniently possible to avoid it, extend into more than two counties, and shall not in any case extend into more than three counties.
- (c) A county district shall be situated wholly in one county.
- (d) A district electoral division shall be situated wholly in one county district.
- (e) So far as practicable, the boundaries of an area of local government shall not intersect the boundaries of any other area of local government.

**Changes in Administrative Areas.**—The following changes in the constitution or boundaries of administrative areas have taken place during the intercensal period :—

- (a) Whitehead, formerly a town under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, and forming part of Larne Rural District, was made an urban district (1st April, 1927) ;
- (b) Bangor Urban District was made a municipal borough (23rd January, 1928) ;
- (c) A portion of the North Ward of Newry Urban District was transferred to the South Ward (17th April, 1928), and the corresponding portion of Newry North Urban District Electoral Division was transferred to Newry South Urban District Electoral Division (22nd August, 1929) ;
- (d) Londonderry Dispensary and Registrars' Districts Nos. 2 and 3 were created out of Dispensary and Registrar's District No. 2 (1st January, 1929) ;
- (e) Coleraine Urban District was made a municipal borough (23rd January, 1929) ;
- (f) New parliamentary divisions for Northern Ireland elections were created by the House of Commons (Method of Voting and Redistribution of Seats) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 (16th April, 1929) ;
- (g) Approximately equal areas of less than half an acre (consisting of portions of roadway) were exchanged between Warrenpoint Urban District and Newry No. 1 Rural District (1st April, 1930) ;
- (h) A portion of Larne Rural District was transferred to Larne Urban District (25th November, 1930), and consequential changes were made to the wards, district electoral divisions, and county electoral divisions affected ;
- (i) The three wards of Portadown Urban District were abolished, and the three district electoral divisions amalgamated to form Portadown Urban District Electoral Division (24th April, 1933) ;
- (j) Kilkeel was made a town under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854 (1st August, 1934) ;



- (k) The three wards of Omagh Urban District were reconstituted (25th June, 1935), and the three district electoral divisions were made coterminous with the reconstituted wards (26th June, 1935) ;
- (l) That part of Derrymore District Electoral Division formerly situated in Ballybot Dispensary District and Registrar's District in Newry Union was transferred to Mullaghglass Dispensary District and Registrar's District in the same Union (1st April, 1936).

Changes in townland boundaries rendered necessary by the straightening of river courses, reclamation from the sea, or revision of survey, are made on the Ordnance Survey maps after approval by the Chief Boundary Surveyor. The consequential changes in the areas of townlands which have taken place in the intercensal period have not been included in this supplement, as they are for the most part small and of little importance.

**Barony and Parish References.**—In order to meet the needs of those wishing to ascertain the barony or civil parish in which any particular townland is situated, references to the barony and parish were included in the townlands and towns sections of the 1926 topographical index. If the list of townlands comprising a particular barony or civil parish is required, reference may be made to table VII of the 1891 census county volumes, or enquiry may be addressed to the Registrar-General. This table is specially useful in identifying obscure forms of place names in ancient deeds or other documents. If the parish or even the barony in which a particular place is situated is known, the names of all the townlands comprising the parish or barony can be scrutinised quickly, thereby often disclosing the early, or perhaps corrupt, form of the name.

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**PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCIES FOR NORTHERN IRELAND ELECTIONS.**

NOTES.—(1) The following table contains a full list of the parliamentary divisions created by the House of Commons (Method of Voting and Redistribution of Seats) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929. Each of these divisions returns one member to the House of Commons. In addition, four members are returned by the constituency of Queen's University of Belfast.

(2) The relationship, in Belfast, between these divisions, the constituencies for United Kingdom elections, and the wards of the County Borough is shown in a footnote to the index to parliamentary constituencies for United Kingdom elections.
