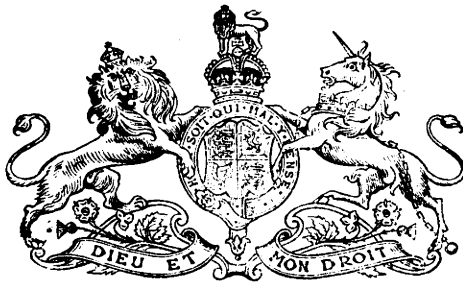

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY :

I have the honour to submit to Your Excellency a Report and Summary Tables relating to the Marriages, Births, and Deaths registered in Ireland during the ten years ended on the 31st December, 1900.

The registration of Births and Deaths was instituted in Ireland in 1864. The registration of Marriages, other than those celebrated by the Roman Catholic clergy was provided for under the Act 7 and 8 Vic., cap. 81, which came into force on the 1st April, 1845, but Roman Catholic Marriages were not registered until the year 1864, when the Act 26 and 27 Vic., cap. 90, for the registration of those Marriages came into operation.

The following Acts relating to Marriages came into operation during the period from the 1st January, 1891, to 31st December, 1900, viz. :—

(1.) The Foreign Marriage Acts 1891 and 1892 (54 and 55 Vic., cap. 74, and 55 and 56 Vic., cap. 23), the Orders in Council made in pursuance of which provide that where, in the case of Marriages to take place before British Marriage Officers abroad, one of the parties is resident in Ireland, notice shall be given to, and a Certificate for Marriage obtained from, the Registrar of the District in which such party resides.

(2.) The Marriage Validity Act, 1899 (62 and 63 Vic., cap. 27), validating certain Marriages solemnized, or to be thereafter solemnized, in England, where one of the parties was resident in Ireland, and certain Marriages in Ireland where one of the parties was resident in England, and in which banns were published, in a church of the parish or place in which such party was resident, according to the law or custom there prevailing, and not in the manner required for the publication of banns in the part of the United Kingdom in which the Marriage has been solemnized.

The following Acts of Parliament, which came into operation during the decade 1891-1900, have also more or less affected this Department :—

Stamp Act, 54 and 55 Vic., cap. 39 (1891).

Factory and Workshops Acts, 54 and 55 Vic., cap. 75 (1891), and 58 and 59 Vic., cap. 37 (1895).

Irish Education Act, 55 and 56 Vic., cap. 42 (1892).

Friendly Societies Act, 59 and 60 Vic., cap. 25 (1896).

Collecting Societies and Industrial Assurance Companies Act, 59 and 60 Vic. cap. 26 (1896).

Local Government (Ireland) Act, 61 and 62 Vic., cap. 37 (1898).

GENERAL SUMMARY.

Table I. gives a general summary of the numbers of Marriages, Births, and Deaths registered in Ireland from the commencement of the Registration Acts in 1864, to the close of the year 1900, and of the amount of emigration during the same period, with the yearly averages for the three decennial periods 1871-80, 1881-90, and 1891-1900.

An examination of Table I. shows that the estimated population of Ireland had diminished to the extent of 249,458, or at the rate of 5·29 per cent. between the middle of the year 1890 and the middle of the year 1900. This decrease was uninterrupted from year to year.

The total number of Marriages registered during the ten years 1891-1900 was 221,608 as compared with 213,095 during the previous decade, showing an increase of 8,513, or 4·0 per cent. in a decreasing population. The average annual marriage rates per 1,000 of the population were, for the two decades, 4·31 for the earlier and 4·84 for the later. The largest number of Marriages which took place in any one year was 23,120, or at the rate of 5·07 per 1,000 in the year 1895, the smallest was for the year 1900 when the number was 21,330, or at the rate of 4·77 per 1,000 of the population.

The total number of Births registered during the decade was 1,055,020, as compared with 1,150,463 for the previous ten years, being 95,443, or 8·3 per cent. less. The average annual birth-rate for the earlier period was 23·3, and for the later 23·0 per 1,000 living. The greatest number of births in any one year during the ten years 1891-1900 took place in the year 1891, when there were 108,116, and the smallest number in 1900, namely, 101,459, or at the respective rates of 23·1 and 22·7 per 1,000 of the population.

The Deaths for the period under consideration numbered 836,035 as compared with 883,156 for the previous ten years, thus showing a decrease of 47,121 or 5·3 per cent., but an increase in the average annual death-rate from 17·9 in the earlier to 18·2 per 1,000 living in the later period. The greatest annual number of Deaths during the decade occurred in the year 1892, when there were 90,044, and the smallest in 1896, when there were 75,700 only, the respective rates being 19·4 and 16·7 per 1,000 living.

As the Births numbered 1,055,020 and the Deaths 836,035, the former exceeded the latter by 218,985, indicating a natural increase in the population of Ireland to this amount. During the decade 433,526 emigrants, or 9·5 per 1,000 of the mean population, left Ireland. The number of emigrants would thus appear to have exceeded the excess of Births over Deaths by 214,541. The number of emigrants in the preceding decennium was 770,706. The actual decrease in the population from the Census date (5th April) 1891 to the Census date (31st March) 1901, was 245,975.

In selecting the areas for which the abstract tables should be compiled, it was not considered necessary to give statistics for areas smaller than Superintendent Registrars' districts, which coincide with the districts of the Registrars of Marriages under 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81, and with the Poor Law Unions. Of these there are 159, having in 1901 an average population of 28,043. The Registrars' districts, of which there are 827, with an average population of 5,392 in 1901, appear to be too small in area and population to warrant separate abstracts being made for each.

In the remarks which follow I beg to submit for your Excellency's consideration, some of the more important features connected with the Returns of Marriages, Births and Deaths during the decennial period, 1891-1900.

MARRIAGES.

The number of Marriages registered during the decade was 221,608, or at the average annual rate of 4·84 per 1,000 of the mean population. The greatest annual number registered was 23,120, or at the rate of 5·07 per 1,000 of the estimated population, in the year 1895, and the smallest number was in 1900, when but 21,330 were recorded, being at the rate of 4·77 per 1,000 of the population.

Of the marriages registered during the decade, 152,227 were according to the rites and ceremonies of the Roman Catholic Church ; 36,466 were celebrated according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of Ireland ; 23,969 were in Registered Presbyterian Meeting-houses ; 4,935 in "Registered Buildings" belonging to various religious denominations ; 3,819 by Civil Contract in District Registrars' Offices ; 92 according to the usages of the Society of Friends ; and 100 according to the Jewish rite. The relative average annual rates of these marriages to every 1,000 of the corresponding mean population were :—Roman Catholics, 4·44 ; all others, 6·01.

Comparing the foregoing statement with the corresponding figures for the previous decade, it appears that the number of marriages registered increased by 8,513, or 4·0 per cent., and the average annual marriage-rate per 1,000 of the population from 4·31 to 4·84.

The Roman Catholic marriages registered increased from 146,159 to 152,227 or 4·15 per cent., the rate having risen from 3·90 to 4·44 per 1,000 persons. Those according to the rites of the Church of Ireland rose from 36,008 to 36,466, or 1·27 per cent., the rate having risen from 5·81 to 6·17. Those in Registered Presbyterian Meeting-houses rose from 22,441 to 23,969, being an increase of 1,528, or 6·81 per cent., the rate having risen from 4·90 to 5·40.

The marriages in Registered Buildings belonging to various religious denominations (under the Act 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81) rose from 3,715 to 4,935, being an increase of 1,220, or 32·84 per cent. Marriages by Civil Contract decreased from 4,645 to 3,819, or 17·78 per cent. The marriages among members of the Society of Friends rose from 82 to 92. Among the Jews marriages increased from 45 to 100, or more than double, which accords with what might have been anticipated from the large proportional increase in the number of the Jewish community in Ireland shown by the Census of 1901.

I desire here to express my thanks to the Clergy of all Religious Denominations for the very kind assistance which they have afforded me in the discharge of my duties, in carrying out the complicated provisions of the Irish Marriage Acts.

As in many parts of the country about one-half of the annual number of Roman Catholic Marriages take place between Christmas and Shrovetide, the number of marriages recorded in the first quarter of the year is much greater than that in any other, as shown in the following Table.

From this it appears that the average proportion per cent. of all the marriages in Ireland which took place in the first quarter of the year was 31·3, while in the other quarters the percentages were respectively 23·0, 22·8, and 22·9, in other words the percentage was nearly constant during each of the last three quarters of the year. The table shows that the average proportion of Roman Catholic marriages during the first quarter of the year was 35·9 per cent. of the total marriages according to the rites of that Church, and that during the other three quarters the proportions varied from 20·8 to 22·3 per cent. only. The marriages of persons of other denominations were more numerous in the last than in any other quarter.

The distribution of marriages registered in Ireland is shown by Provinces and Counties in Table II. where the actual number registered in each area, and the rate per 1,000 of the population, are given. The average marriage rates for the Provinces were—Leinster, 5·3; Munster, 4·2; Ulster, 5·5; Connaught, 3·5; compared with 4·9, 3·8, 4·8, and 3·1 respectively for the previous decade, showing an increase in rate for each province. Comparing the rates for the Counties in the last decade with those in the previous decade it appears that there was an increase in the marriage rate in every county in Ireland.

The five counties in which the Marriage rate was highest were, Antrim County and Belfast Co. Borough, part of, 7·6, Dublin Co. and Co. Borough, 7·0, Armagh 5·3, Down Co. and Belfast Co. Borough, part of, 5·3, and Londonderry Co. and Co. Borough 5·3; and those in which it was lowest were, Galway 3·3, Clare 3·4, Mayo 3·4, Sligo 3·6, and Queen's 3·6.

Table V. shows for the decade the number and proportion per cent. of persons who wrote their names in the Registers, of minors, of widowers, and of widows who were married.

EDUCATION OF PERSONS MARRIED.

The proportion of persons who “signed their names in writing” as compared with those who signed “by mark” in the marriage registers and certificates affords an interesting indication of the degree of elementary education of persons married, and when these indications are compared from period to period they furnish a useful test of the progress of education. Thus—

In 1864, 61.4 per cent. of the men and 49.7 per cent. of the women signed in writing; in 1871 the proportions were—men 62.5 per cent., women 54.8 per cent.; in 1880, men 73.8 per cent., women 69.1; in 1890, men 79.6, women 79.1; in 1900, men 86.8, women 89.3. It is interesting to note that while there has been a steady increase in both sexes in the proportion signing by writing, the proportion among women, which was much below that for men in 1864, became equal to the rate for men in 1891, and has each year since exceeded it. It is curious to note that while in Leinster, Munster, and Connaught, taking the figures for each year of the decade, the married women seem to be better educated than the men, in Ulster the reverse was the case until the year 1900, when 85.5 per cent. of the men, and 86.3 per cent. of the women, signed their names in writing.

EARLY MARRIAGES.

During the last forty years there has been a well marked decrease in early marriages in Ireland. In the year 1864 of the males married 3·77 per cent. were under full age, in 1880 the proportion was 2·64 per cent., in 1890 it was 2·02 per cent., and in 1900 it was but 1·56 per cent., and only once during the interval between 1890 and 1900 was the percentage of 2·02 reached, viz., in 1896, when it was 2·08. Among females the decrease of early marriages is more marked; in 1864 the proportion of minors was 18·16 per cent. of all the women married; in 1880 it was only 11·79 per cent., or less than two-thirds of the proportion in the former year; in 1890 it fell to 8·75 per cent., or less than one-half of the percentage for 1864; and in 1900 it was only 6·84. The highest proportion of minors married in 1900 was in Ulster, and the lowest in Connaught. In the former province the husbands who were not of age formed 1·98 per cent. of the males married, and the wives under age constituted 8·22 per cent. of the total; and in Connaught the corresponding percentages were 0·64 for the males and 4·65 for the females married. During the decade 1881-90 the proportion of marriages of minors in Connaught decreased among males from 2·51 per cent. in 1881 to 1·50 per cent. in 1890, and among females from 13·03 per cent. to 9·42 for the same years, and during the decade 1891-1900 the proportion decreased among males from 0·72 per cent. in 1891 to 0·64 per cent. in 1900, and among females from 8·09 per cent. in 1891 to 4·65 per cent. in 1900. It would thus appear that since 1864 through Ireland generally, and especially in the West, very early marriages have become less frequent.

BIRTHS.

The number of Births registered in Ireland during the decade was 1,055,020, being an annual average of 105,502, or at the rate of 23·0 per 1,000 of the mean population. The largest number of births occurred in the year 1891, viz., 108,116, or at the rate of 23·1 per 1,000 of the population, and the smallest number in 1900, when there were only 101,459 registered, or at the rate of 22·7 per 1,000 of the population.

Of the 1,055,020 Births registered in Ireland during the ten years 1891-1900, 1,027,126, or 97·4 per cent. were legitimate—this number being equivalent to an average annual rate of 22·4 per 1,000 of the mean population, and representing an average annual rate of 293·5 per 1,000 of the mean number of married women aged 15 and under 45 years.

As regards the distribution of the Births in Ireland, the following statement shows the four provinces arranged according to the average annual rate per 1,000 of the mean population represented by the births registered during the ten years 1891-1900 :—

ILLEGITIMACY.

The 1,055,020 births registered in Ireland during the decade, comprised 27,894 or 2·6 per cent. which were illegitimate. In the preceding decennium the corresponding percentage was 2·7. The illegitimate births registered during the decennial period equalled an average yearly rate of 0·6 per 1,000 of the mean population, and were equivalent to an average annual rate of 4·1 per 1,000 of the mean number of unmarried women aged 15 and under 45 years.

In the following Table the proportion of illegitimate births is set out by Provinces.

From the foregoing (Table VI.) it will be observed that the proportion of illegitimate births to the total births registered was greatest in the Province of Ulster, where it reached 3·7 per cent., and least in the province of Connaught, where the percentage was only 0·6. From Table VIII. it will be noticed that illegitimate births were proportionately more numerous in some of the districts comprising manufacturing towns. It is also observed that in the rural districts of Ulster and Leinster the percentage of illegitimate births is only slightly below that in the civic districts, while in the other two provinces, where the rural population is more largely in excess of the town population than in either Leinster or Ulster, the difference between the rates for the civic and rural districts is more marked.

The number and relative proportion of births in each quarter are shown in Table VII., from which it appears that the birth-rate is higher in the first two than in the last two quarters of the year.

Table VIII. has been constructed mainly with the view of showing the relation between the number of marriages registered and the number of legitimate births registered in Ireland, and in the more important groups of districts, distinguishing Civic districts from Rural districts.

Taking the whole of Ireland it will be observed that the average annual rate throughout the decade 1891-1900 per 1,000 of the mean population was—for marriages 4·8 and for births 23·0, and that the average number of legitimate births to each marriage registered was 4·6. For the previous decade 1881-1900 the respective rates were 4·3, 23·3, and 5·3, showing an increase for the marriage rate, but a decrease for the birth rate, and for the average number of births to each marriage in the last, as compared with the former decade. In the decade 1871-80 the respective rates were 4·7, 26·5, and 5·5.

With regard to the number of legitimate births registered as compared with the number of marriages recorded, the four provinces come in the following order :—Connaught, 6·1 births to one marriage ; Munster, 5·1 ; Leinster, 4·3 ; and Ulster, 4·2, as compared with 4·6 for the whole of Ireland. Thus the provinces of Leinster and Ulster, with their large town population, are under the average of Ireland, while Munster and Connaught, with their large rural population, are over the average. It will be observed that the group with the highest rate is that comprising the rural districts of Connaught, where the ratio is 6·2, and the lowest are the civic groups of Leinster and Munster, where it is but 3·9.

If the relation between the number of legitimate births to marriages, and the death-rate of the population be compared, it will be found that where the death-rates are highest the proportion of births to marriages is lowest, and *vice versa*. A comparison between columns 6 and 10 of Table VIII. shows that this rule is almost invariable, and that it is most strongly marked in the contrast between town and country groups of districts.

The legitimate births have fallen from 1,119,301 for the decade 1881-90 to 1,027,126 for the decade 1891-1900, being a decrease of 92,175, or 8·2 per cent., while during the same period the number of marriages rose from 213,095 to 221,608, being an increase of 8,513, or 4·0 per cent.

DEATHS.

The deaths registered in Ireland during the decade 1891-1900 amounted to 836,035, a number equal to an average annual death-rate of 18·25 per 1,000 of the population ; but, as will be seen further on, the variations in death-rate were very great in different parts of the country. The death-rate also varied considerably during different years of the decade ; thus in 1900 it was 19·6, but in 1896 it was only 16·7 per 1,000.

The above Table shows the number of deaths registered in each quarter during the decade, with the average rates for the ten years, and the average percentage of deaths registered during each of the four quarters. The average percentage of the annual number of deaths registered in the first quarter was 30·6, and the average annual rate represented 22·3 per 1,000 of the mean population ; for the second, 25·8 per cent., with a rate of 18·9 per 1,000 ; for the third, 20·4 per cent., with a rate of 14·9 per 1000 ; and for the fourth quarter, 23·2 per cent., with a rate of 16·9 per 1,000, the highest rate being in the first quarter, when the cold weather and the continued privations of the winter months have the greatest effect on the health of the people.

DISTRIBUTION OF DEATHS IN IRELAND.

Arranging the provinces from the lowest death-rate to the highest, it appears that the average annual rates per 1,000 living were as follow :—

It will be here again observed that the counties containing large towns occupy unfavourable positions on the list.

This is especially noticeable when Mayo and Dublin, which occupy the extremes of the list, are contrasted with one another; the rate of mortality in the former being 43 per cent. below that in the latter.

In Tables X. and XI., pages 19 and 20, the Superintendent Registrars' districts have been classified into those containing towns with over 10,000 inhabitants, and those which do not contain any large towns. The former may for convenience be called "Civic," the latter "Rural" Unions.

If the death-rates in those two groups of districts be contrasted, it will be observed that the average annual death-rate for the "Civic" group is 219.2 per 10,000 inhabitants per annum; whereas in the "Rural" group it is but 164.6, or 54.6 less. In round numbers, therefore, the deaths among a million of inhabitants of such an urban population would exceed those in a rural population of the same amount by over 5,000 per annum. If the rural population of Ireland died at the same rate as the urban there would be an average increase of about 17,000 deaths in Ireland per annum.

In considering the causes of death and their distribution throughout Ireland, a further and more detailed reference will be made to these remarkable contrasts between civic and rural death-rates.

URBAN DISTRICTS.

Separate statistics for the Urban Districts, compiled from Weekly and Quarterly Numerical Returns furnished by the various Registrars, are given in Table XII.

The average annual death-rate per 1,000 of the mean population (1891-1901) in these districts, which contain more than one-fourth of the total population of the country, was 22.9, and the birth-rate 28.3; in the remainder of the country the death-rate was 16.6, and the birth-rate 21.2 per 1000.

The average annual rates represented by the deaths from the Zymotic Diseases† shown in this Table were:—for the Urban districts 2.3 per 1,000 of the mean population of the ten years; and for the remainder 0.8 per 1,000.

CAUSES OF DEATH.

ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

Of the 836,035 deaths from all causes registered in Ireland during the ten years 1891-1900, 86,231 (41,379 males and 44,852 females) were caused by the diseases which in the classification adopted for the decade were grouped under the heading "Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases." This number constitutes 10·3 per cent. of all the deaths recorded, and is equivalent to an annual rate of 18·8 per 10,000 of the mean population. It is composed of 62,087 deaths from Miasmatic Diseases, 17,223 from Diarrhoeal Diseases, 5,851 (1,603 males and 4,248 females) from Septic Diseases, and 1,070 from other diseases included in this class.

The principal Zymotic (epidemic) diseases are small-pox, measles, scarlet fever, whooping-cough, diphtheria, fever (including enteric fever, typhus, and simple continued and ill-defined forms of fever), and diarrhoeal diseases (diarrhoea, dysentery, and simple cholera). The total number of deaths from these diseases for the three complete decades for which records are available, is 243,102, or 9·1 per cent. of the deaths from all causes. In the decade 1891-1900, the number was 57,338, or 6·9 per cent. of all the deaths registered, and equal to an annual rate of 12·5 per 10,000 of the mean population. In the decade 1881-1890, the deaths numbered 70,717, or 8·0 per cent. of the total deaths, and were equal to an annual average rate of 14·3 per 10,000 of the mean population. In the decade 1871-1880, there were 115,047 deaths from this group of diseases, which number was 11·9 per cent. of the total deaths during that period, and equalled an annual average rate of 21·7 per 10,000.

It will be seen from the following comparative tabular statement that, with the exception of deaths from diphtheria and diarrhoeal diseases, the absolute number of deaths from each of the principal Zymotic diseases during the decade now under review was less than that for either of the preceding decades, and that, as shown in the figures given above, there has been a great decline in the mortality from these causes taken collectively.

When the average death rates for civic Unions are compared with those for rural Unions, it is found that the observation made in previous Decennial Reports, with regard to the much higher death-rate from these causes, taken collectively, in the civic than in rural Unions, still applies, the average annual rate for the civic Unions during the last Decennium being 21·3 per 10,000 of the mean population, against 8·2 per 10,000 for the rural Unions.

The figures for the three Decennia, with reference to influenza, are so remarkable that it may be allowable to refer to them here, although the malady is not included in "the principal Zymotic diseases." In the decade 1871-1880, 972 deaths only were assigned to influenza, in the decade 1881-1890, 2,096 deaths were returned, and in the decade ending with the year 1900, the deaths attributed to influenza amounted to 20,805.

SMALL-POX.

The deaths from Small-pox registered in Ireland during the Decennium 1871-1880, amounted to 7,550; in the following 10 years there were only 241 deaths from this cause, and in the Decennium ending with 1900, there were 235 deaths only (132 males and 103 females), or an average of but 5 deaths per annum in every million of the population. Of these 235 deaths, 69 were of persons stated to have been vaccinated, 97 were of unvaccinated persons, and concerning the remaining 69, the condition as to vaccination was not stated.

In the civic Unions there were 215 deaths from small-pox, of which number 199 took place in the province of Leinster (including 135 in the Union of Dublin South, and 60 in the Union of Dublin North), and 15 in the province of Ulster, including 10 in Newry Union and 3 in Belfast Union. There were only 20 deaths in rural Unions. No death from small-pox was registered in the province of Munster during the decade, and there were only two fatal cases of the disease in Connaught.

In the year 1895, the deaths from small-pox numbered 146; in 1894 there were 72; in 1891, 7; in 1896, 4; in 1897, 3; and in each of the years 1893, 1899, and 1900, one; there were no deaths from the disease registered in either 1892 or 1898.

From the foregoing remarks it is apparent that there was no general epidemic of small-pox during the decade, that the only years in which deaths from the disease were at all numerous, were 1894 and 1895, and that the only place where the disease prevailed to any considerable extent was Dublin.

Regular quarterly records of vaccinations are collected and published in my Quarterly Returns of the vital statistics of the country. From these records it appears that, during the 10 years 1891-1900, there were 911,725 successful primary vaccinations in Ireland, and also, that in the same period the deaths of 63,554 unvaccinated children under 3 months old were registered. The number of births registered during the 10 years was 1,055,020.

MEASLES.

The number of deaths from measles during the 10 years 1891-1900, was 8,095, being equal to an annual rate of 1·8 per 10,000 of the population, as compared with a total of 9,429, and an average annual rate of 1·9 per 10,000 in the previous decade; there were 11,118 deaths, equivalent to an annual rate of 2·1 per 10,000 of the population, in the 10 years 1871-1880. The highest rate for any of the 10 years 1891-1900 was 3·4 deaths per 10,000 of the population in 1899, and the lowest 0·5 per 10,000 in the year 1891.

The respective average annual rates represented by the deaths from measles in the four provinces during the ten years 1891-1900 were:—Leinster 2·2 per 10,000 of the population at all ages; Munster 1·4; Ulster 2·1; and Connaught 1·9.

With regard to the distribution of deaths from measles in civic and rural Unions, it will be observed that the average annual death-rate from measles during the decade 1891-1900, was 3·3 per 10,000 of the population in civic, and 1·0 per 10,000 in rural Unions. The disease was relatively most fatal in the civic Unions of Dublin (North and South), Belfast, Lurgan and Waterford, in which there was a total of 3,910 deaths, or nearly 50 per cent. of all the deaths from measles recorded in Ireland during the decade, although the population of these 5 Unions is less than 18 per cent. of the population of the country. The average annual rate for Belfast Union was 5·4 per 10,000 of the population, and that for Dublin South Union, 5·2 per 10,000.

With respect to the ages of the 8,095 persons who died from measles, 6,849 (3,545 males and 3,304 females) were children under 5 years of age, of whom 2,704 (1,447 males and 1,257 females) were in their second year.

The number of deaths from measles, of children under 2 years of age, was 4,472, equal to an annual average rate of 26·2 per 10,000 children living at that age, and forming 55 per cent. of all the deaths from the disease. As life advances, deaths from measles are not very numerous.

SCARLET FEVER.

The deaths from scarlet fever in Ireland during the decade 1871-1880, amounted to 23,077, being equal to an annual rate of 4·4 per 10,000 of the mean population; in the following decade the deaths fell to 10,311, and the rate was 2·1 per 10,000, and in the Decennium 1891-1900, the number of deaths further declined to 4,422, and the rate to 1·0 per 10,000 of the population; so that after allowing for the decrease in the population, the mortality from scarlet fever during the ten years now under review, did not amount to one-fourth of the mortality in the Decennium ending with the year 1880.

Of the 4,422 persons who died from scarlet fever in the decade 1891-1900, 2,193 were males and 2,229 were females. The deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 2,021, or nearly one half of all the deaths from the disease, and 1,179 deaths, or more than one-fourth of the total, were of children 5 years but under 10 years of age.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age from this cause are equal to an annual rate of 4·4 per 10,000 of the mean population of that age, and the deaths under 10 years are equal to a rate of 3·4 per 10,000 of the children under 10 years old.

As regards the geographical distribution of deaths from scarlet fever, in the civic Unions there were 1,953 deaths equal to an annual rate of 1·3 per 10,000 of the population, and in the rural Unions 2,469 deaths—the rate being 0·8 per 10,000.

In the province of Leinster there were 1,326 deaths, 403 of these being in Dublin South Union, (a number yielding the highest average annual rate—1·9 per 10,000—for any of the civic Unions), and 185 in Dublin North Union; in Munster there were 625 deaths, including 89 in Cork Union, 86 in Limerick Union, and 70 in Waterford Union; in Ulster there were 1,846 deaths, of which 546 were in Belfast Union, 86 in Lurgan, and 77 in Ballymena; and in Connaught there were 625 deaths, of which nearly all were in rural Unions.

The highest mortality from scarlet fever in any one year during the decade was in 1896, when there were 752 deaths, a number equivalent to 1·66 per 10,000 of the population, and the lowest was in 1899, the number of deaths being 205, or 0·45 per 10,000.

FEVERS.

The aggregate number of deaths from the several forms of continued fever—typhus, enteric (typhoid) and simple continued fever—registered in Ireland during the decade 1891-1900, was 11,875, the totals for the preceding decades being 18,067 for the years 1881-1890, and 30,092 for the years 1871-1880. The annual rates represented by the total mortality from these causes in each succeeding decade, beginning with the 10 years 1871-80, were 56·88, 36·57, and 25·92 per 100,000 of the mean population. From these figures the fact is deduced that allowing for the decrease in the population, the deaths from continued fevers during the Decennium ending with the year 1900, show a decline of 54 per cent. when compared with the mortality in the 10 years 1871-1880.

TYPHUS.

There were only 1,904 deaths from typhus registered in Ireland during the 10 years 1891-1900, as compared with 5,457 in the preceding decade, and 7,495 in the 10 years ending with 1880, and a comparison of the rates shows that the mortality fell from an average annual rate of 14·17 deaths per 100,000 of the mean population, in the decade 1871-1880, to 11·05 in the ten years 1881-1890, and to 4·16 in the 10 years 1891-1900, so that the relative mortality in the last named period did not amount to one-third of that for the 10 years 1871-1880. The highest annual number of deaths from this disease during the decade 1891-1900, was 268 in the year 1892, and the lowest, 117 in the year 1899.

Turning to the Abstract on pp. 118-119, it will be seen that the deaths of males from typhus, registered in the 10 years 1891-1900 were 1,049 in number, and those of females 855; and referring to Table XIV. on page 27, it will be observed that the age periods at which typhus proved most fatal, both numerically and proportionally, are 35 and under 45 years, and 45 and under 55 years; the deaths for the former period being 362, equal to an annual rate of 7·46 per 100,000 persons of that age in the population, and for the latter 318 or 7·29 per annum in every 100,000 persons aged 45 and under 55 years.

The distribution of the mortality from typhus, in the Provinces, Counties and Unions of Ireland, will be found in the Abstracts, commencing on page 128; from these it appears that in the province of Munster, there were 766 deaths; in Connaught, 439; in Ulster, 403; and in Leinster 296 deaths; the respective average annual rates represented by these numbers are:—Munster, 0·7 per 10,000 of the mean population of the province; Connaught, 0·6; Ulster 0·2; and Leinster, 0·2.

The death rates for typhus in the civic and rural Unions given in Table XI., show that in the civic Unions of Leinster, the highest rate was in the Union of Drogheda, namely, 1·4 per 10,000, and the lowest in the Union of Rathdown, 0·1 per 10,000, the rate for the Province being 0·2 per 10,000; the rate for the province of Munster was 0·7 per 10,000; there were no deaths from typhus in Clonmel Union, and the rate for each of the three other civic Unions (Cork, Limerick and Waterford) was 0·8. In Ulster the rate was 0·2 per 10,000, and this was also the highest rate for any of the civic Unions in the Province. In Connaught the rate was 0·6 per 10,000, the rate for each of the civic Unions (Galway and Sligo) in the Province being 1·3, the highest rate of any of the civic Unions in Ireland, except Drogheda, the rate for which as before stated was 1·4 per 10,000.

ENTERIC FEVER.

Both absolutely and in proportion to the population the registered mortality from enteric fever was greater during the decade 1891-1900 than in the preceding Decennium, the number of deaths being 8,692, equal to an annual rate of 1·9 per 10,000 of the mean population, against 7,995 deaths and an average rate of 1·6 per 10,000 for the 10 years 1881-1890.

Compared with statistics for the 10 years 1871-1880, there was a decrease in the number of deaths, but the rate shows a slight increase.

Of the 8,692 persons whose deaths from enteric fever were registered during the Decennium, 4,604 were males and 4,088 females.

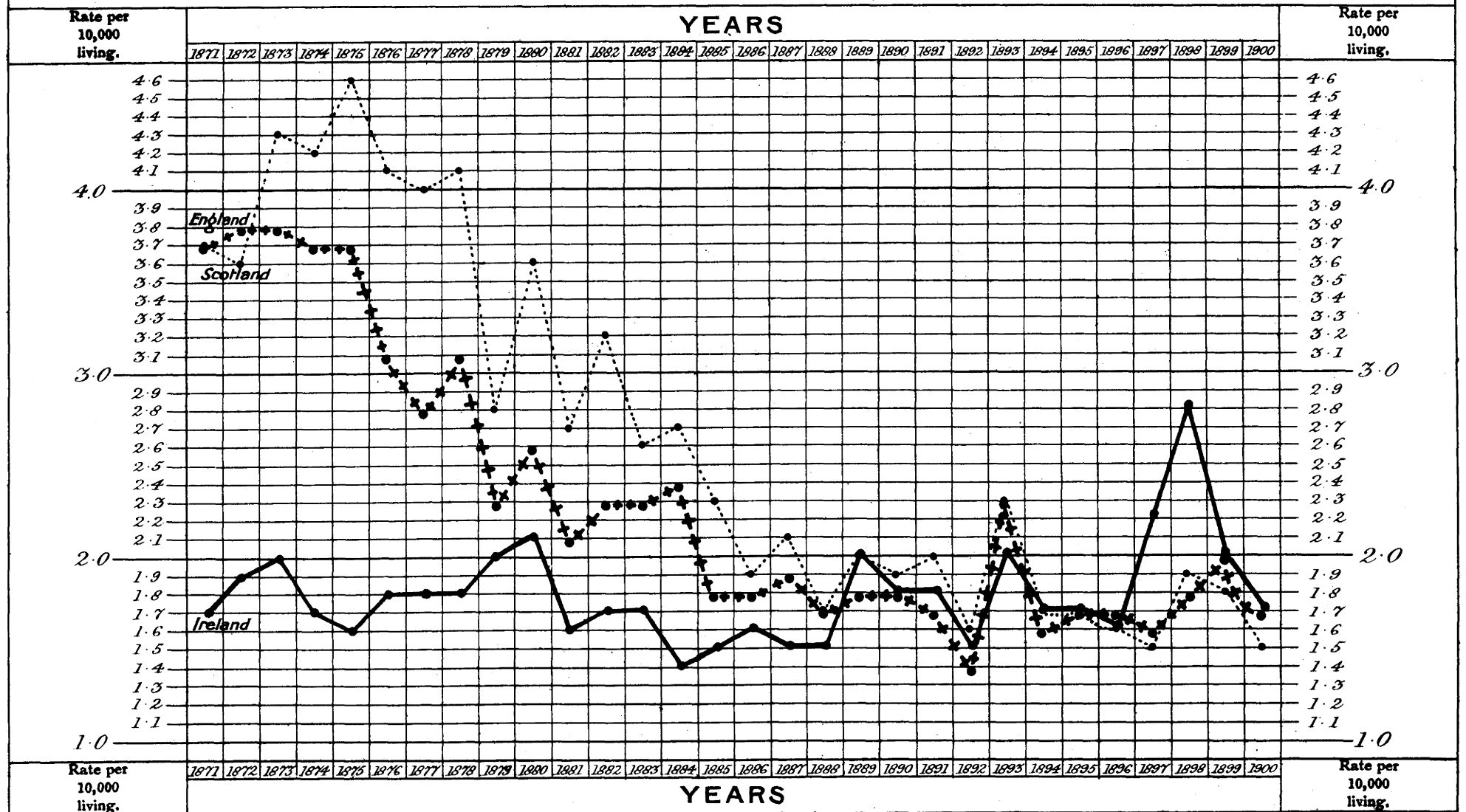
With regard to age-distribution, the highest rates are those for the age-periods 20 years and under 25 years, and 15 years and under 20 years, the respective rates being 33·21 and 25·65 deaths per 100,000 living at these age-periods.

An investigation of the geographical distribution of enteric fever, shows that 4,142 of the deaths registered occurred in the province of Ulster, this number being equal to an average annual rate of 2·6 per 10,000 of the mean population of the Province; 2,601, or an annual average rate of 2·2 per 10,000 in Leinster; 1,369, or an annual average rate of 1·2 per 10,000 in Munster; and 580, or an annual average rate of 0·9 per 10,000 in Connaught.

Deaths from enteric fever were recorded in every Union in Ireland, with the exception of Castletown in the County of Cork.

Table XI. shows that while the average annual death-rate for enteric fever in the civic Unions, during the decade, was 3·6 per 10,000 of the mean population, in rural Districts the rate was only 1·1 per 10,000.

It will have been noted that in the case of typhus, the civic and the rural rates were equal.

In the province of Leinster, the civic Union with the highest average annual death rate from enteric fever, was Dublin North, 4·8 per 10,000; in Munster, Waterford heads the list, with 1·8 per 10,000; in Ulster, the highest rate is that for Belfast, which amounts to 7·7 per 10,000; and in the province of Connaught the rates for the civic Unions of Galway and Sligo, are identical, namely, 1·2 per 10,000.

The deaths from enteric fever in the three Unions of Dublin North, Dublin South, and Belfast combined, constitute 48 per cent. of the deaths from the disease in the whole of the country.

A reference to Table XIII., pages 24-25, shows that as regards both actual numbers and proportional rate, the mortality from enteric fever was lowest in the year 1892, and highest in the year 1898, the deaths in the former year being 714, or 15·4 per 100,000 of the estimated population, and in the latter, 1,284, or 28·4 per 100,000.

It will be observed from the Tables of Meteorological observations on pp. 41-42, that in the year 1892, the rainfall in Dublin was 25·644 inches, and the mean temperature was 48·1°, and that in the year 1898, the rainfall was 27·048 inches, and the mean temperature was 51·6°.

Diagram No. 1, facing page 28, shows the rate per 10,000 of the population represented by the deaths from enteric fever registered in Ireland, England, and Scotland, respectively, in each of the thirty years, 1871-1900.

WHOOPIING-COUGH.

The number of deaths from whooping-cough, registered during the 10 years 1891-1900, was 12,048, which is equivalent to an average annual rate of 2·6 per 10,000 of the mean population. In the preceding decade there were 14,339 deaths from the disease, the rate being 2·9 per 10,000, and in the 10 years 1871-1880, the deaths numbered 18,434, the annual rate represented being 3·5 per 10,000 of the population. From Tables X. and XI., it will be observed that during the 10 years 1891-1900, there were 5,678 deaths from whooping-cough in civic, and 6,370 deaths in rural Unions, the average annual death-rates being, respectively, 3·8 and 2·1 per 10,000 of the population. The highest mortality in civic Unions was in Belfast, and Dublin South, in which the annual rate represented was 5·4 per 10,000 of the population; in Dublin North Union the rate was 4·5; in Waterford, 3·9; in Lurgan, 3·7; in Cork, 3·3; and in Londonderry, 3·1. During each of the two preceding decades, also, the heaviest mortality from whooping-cough was in the Unions comprising the cities of Dublin and Belfast.

In the province of Leinster the average annual rate represented by the deaths from whooping-cough during the 10 years was 3·0 per 10,000 of the mean population; in Munster, 2·5 per 10,000; in Ulster, 2·8; and in Connaught, 1·9.

During the first six years of the decade, there was not much fluctuation in the annual mortality from whooping-cough, and the annual average rate for that period was about 2·5 per 10,000 of the population at all ages. In 1897 the deaths from this cause amounted to 1,851, or 4·09 per 10,000; subsequently, there was a gradual decline to 689 deaths, or 1·54 per 10,000 in the year 1900.

As regards the ages of the 12,048 persons who died from whooping-cough, those under 1 year old numbered 5,032, constituting about 42 per cent. of the total, and the deaths of children under 5 years were 11,105, or 92 per cent. of the total, and equal to an annual rate of 24·3 per 10,000 of the living at that age.

Of the 12,048 persons who died from whooping-cough, 5,315 were males and 6,733 females. This heavy mortality among females, is not peculiar to the decade now under consideration; it is shown also by the statistics of deaths from whooping-

cough, in each of the two preceding decennia. Limiting the investigation on this point to deaths among children under 10 years of age—during which period of life the great bulk of the deaths from whooping-cough occur—we find that in the 10 years ending with 1880, the average annual rate per 10,000 of the mean number of boys of that age in the population, represented by the deaths of males under 10 years old from whooping-cough, was 13·0, while the corresponding rate for girls was 16·5; for the 10 years 1881-1890, the respective average rates were:—boys, 11·4 per 10,000, girls 14·7; and for the decade ending with 1900, they were:—boys, 11·1, and girls, 14·5.

DIPHtheria.

Taking the absolute numbers, there was but very slight variation in the mortality from diphtheria during the last three decades, the number of deaths for the 10 years 1871-1880 being 3,403, for the following 10 years 3,465, and for the last decade 3,440; however, in relation to population, the mortality shows a decided tendency to increase, the average annual rate for the first period being 64; for the second, 70; and for the third, 75 per million of the population.

The deaths from diphtheria in Connaught during the 10 years 1891-1900, represent an average annual mortality of 0·3 per 10,000 of the mean population; in Munster, 0·4; in Leinster, 0·7; and in Ulster, 1·2.

The average rate (1·1 per 10,000 of the population) for the civic Unions was almost double that (0·6) for the rural, but in a few of the rural Unions the rate was comparatively high; thus in Larne Union it was 1·9 per 10,000 of the population; in Antrim, 2·1, and in Strabane, 1·6.

The highest death-rates in civic Unions were in Ballymena, 2·5 per 10,000; Belfast, 1·8; Kilkenny, 1·7; Lurgan, 1·5; Lisburn, 1·4; Londonderry, 1·3; and Dublin South, 1·2 per 10,000.

Of the 3,440 deaths from diphtheria, 1,781, or more than 50 per cent. of the total were of children under 5 years of age, the average annual rate represented being 3·9 per 10,000 children living at that age-period. The deaths during the age-period 5 and under 10 years numbered 965, or 28 per cent. of the total, the rate being equal to 2·0 per 10,000 children of that age in the population.

The highest mortality from diphtheria during the 10 years was in 1893, when there were 411 deaths, equal to 0·89 per 10,000 of the population, and the lowest was in 1891, the number of deaths recorded being 281, or 0·60 per 10,000 living.

Diagram No. 2, facing this page, shows the rate per 10,000 of the population represented by the deaths from diphtheria registered in Ireland, England, and Scotland, respectively, during each of the thirty years, 1871-1900.

INFLUENZA.

The increase during recent years in the mortality recorded in Ireland as having been caused by "influenza" is very remarkable. In the decade 1871-1880, there were only 972 deaths thus registered, being an average annual mortality at the rate of only 0·2 per 10,000 of the population, and in the whole period from the commencement of death registration in Ireland, in 1864, up to the year 1890, the average number of deaths, so assigned, was only 103 per annum.

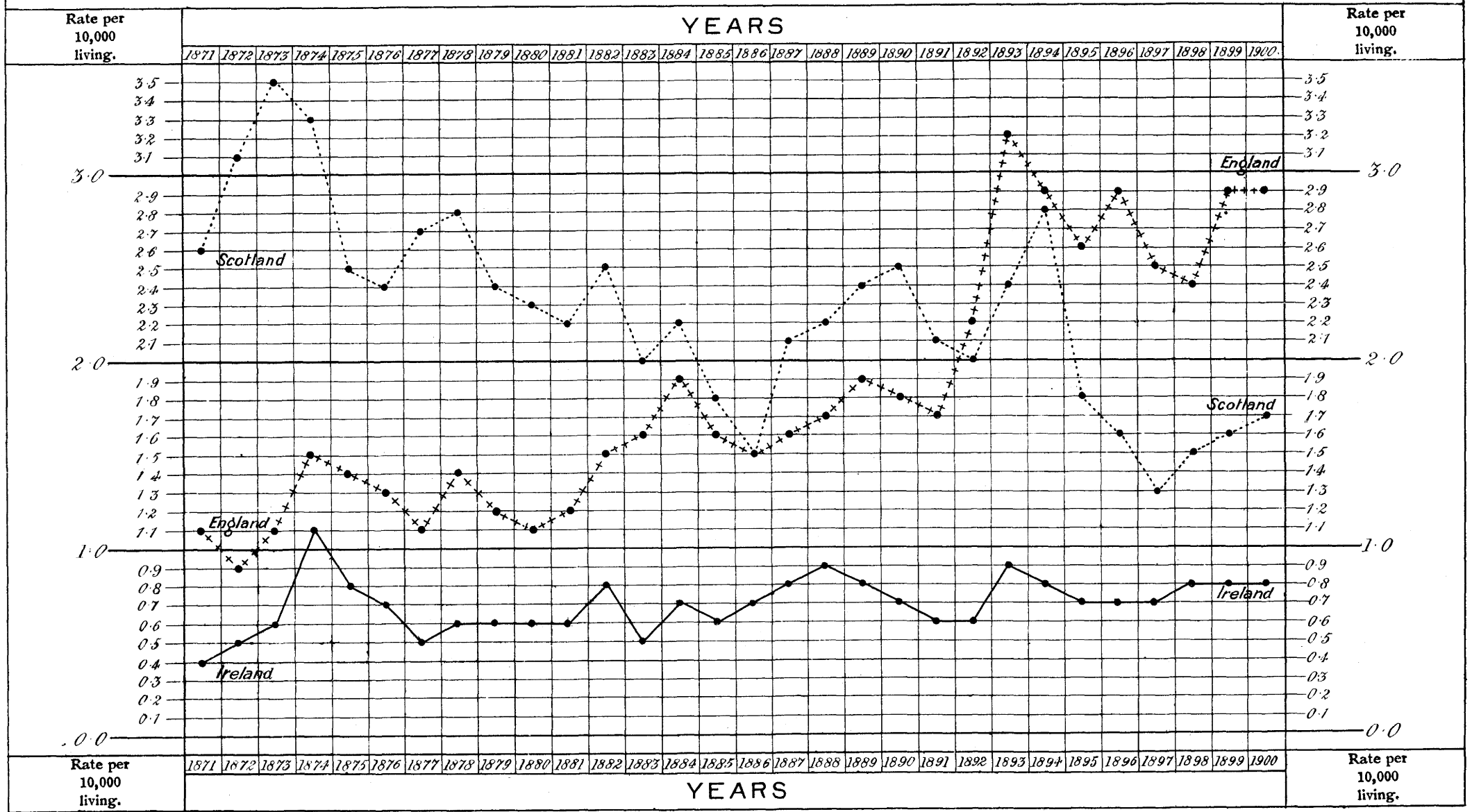
During those years there was not any epidemic of influenza in Ireland, but in the year 1890, the disease prevailed as an epidemic, causing 1,712 deaths, or 3·6 per 10,000 of the estimated population.

In the decade 1891-1900 the number of deaths from influenza recorded amounted to 20,805 (males 10,067; females 10,738) which corresponds to an annual average rate of 4·5 per 10,000 of the population.

No age period affords protection from the fatal tendency of this malady. Before the first year of life was attained, 1,541 infants (males 880, and females 661) were its victims; the deaths decreased to 584 in the second year, to 352 in the third, to 215 in the fourth, and to 116 in the fifth year of life; the number of deaths in the succeeding age-period (5 years and under 10 years) was 475, it fell to 345 in the age-period 10 years and under 15 years, rising in the succeeding 5-year period to 591, and slightly declining in the period 20 years

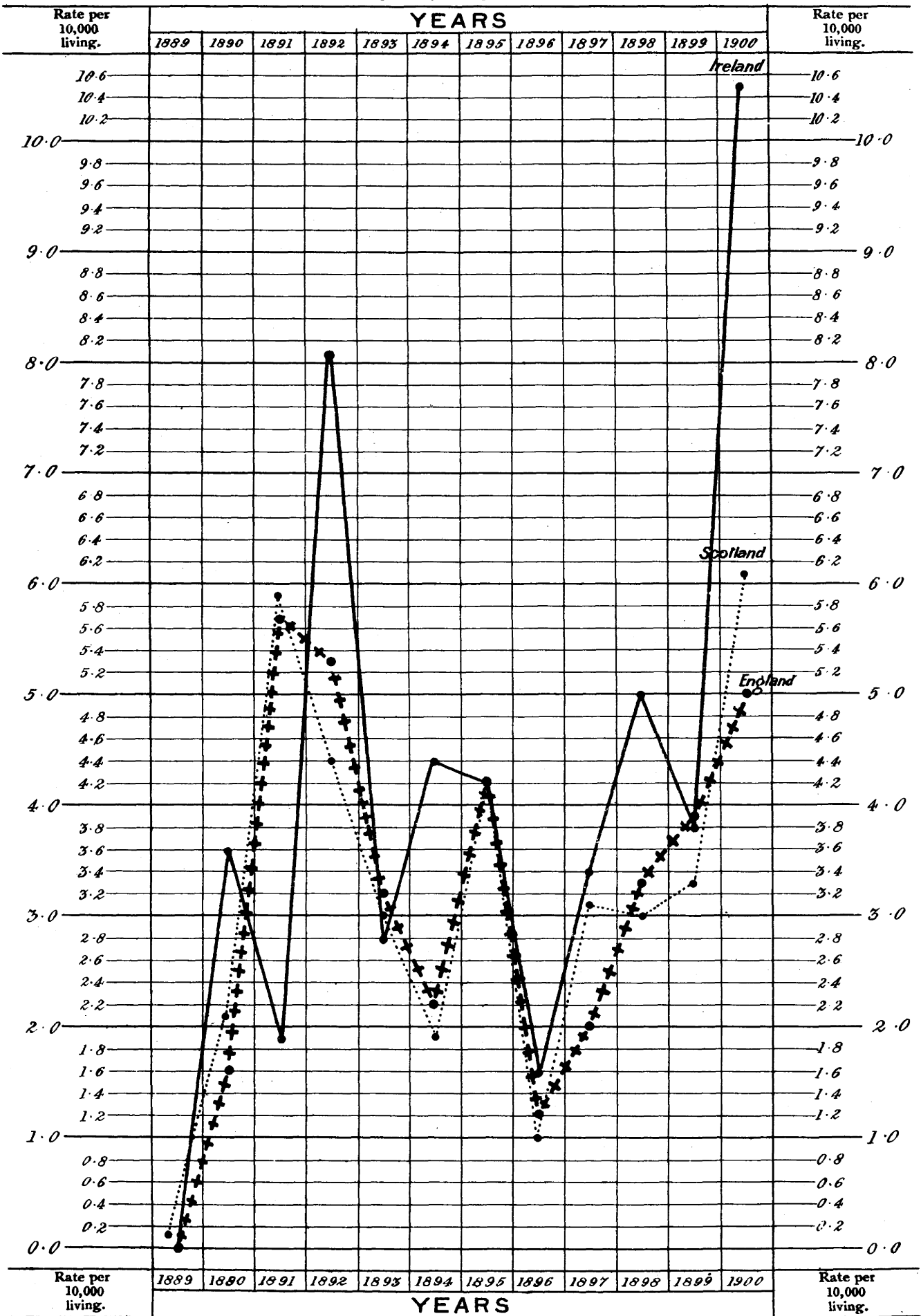

and under 25 years to 563; in the five ten-year periods which follow, the respective numbers of deaths were, 958, 1,258, 2,274, 4,097 and 4,242, the last number being for the age-period 65 years and under 75 years. It thus appears that in the early years of life, the mortality was relatively highest before the termination of the first year, and lowest in the fifth year of life, and that taking all ages up to 75 years, the ten-year period in which influenza was most fatal is that of 65 years and under 75 years.

Passing on to the topographical distribution of deaths from influenza, as might be expected, no Union in Ireland can claim that its Registration Records are free from the history of an attack of the disease.

The deaths registered in the provincial divisions of Ireland, during the decade, number, for Leinster, 6,087; for Munster, 4,412; for Ulster, 7,103; and for Connaught 3,203, corresponding respectively to the following average annual rates per 10,000 of the population, viz.: 5·2, 3·9, 4·4, and 4·7.

As regards the average annual death-rates from influenza in the counties, the five highest rates are the following:—Carlow 7·9, King's 6·7, Meath 6·6, Mayo 6·2, and Wicklow 6·2 per 10,000 of the mean population; and the five lowest are:—Clare 2·8, Antrim 3·1, Limerick 3·1, Sligo 3·5, and Roscommon 3·6 per 10,000.

In the civic Unions of the whole of Ireland the average annual mortality from influenza for the decade was at the rate of 3·8 per 10,000 of the population, being lower than the rate in the rural Unions, which was 4·9 per 10,000.

In the civic Unions in the provinces of Leinster, Munster, and Ulster, the rates were also lower than those for the rural Unions, the respective rates being: for Leinster 4·6 and 5·7; for Munster 3·2 and 4·2; and for Ulster 3·1 and 5·3 per 10,000 of the population; but in Connaught the rate for the civic Unions was higher than that for the rural, viz.: 5·0 against 4·6 per 10,000 of the population.

The yearly mortality during the decade was remarkably irregular—increase and decrease alternating in the annual numbers. The lowest yearly number was 729 or 16·0 in every 100,000 of the estimated population in the year 1896, and the highest 4,677 or 104·7 per 100,000 in the year 1900. The 891 deaths in the year 1891 followed 1,712 in the last year of the preceding decade, and were followed by 3,742 deaths in the year 1892, and the 4,677 fatal cases in the year 1900 were preceded by 1,716 deaths in the year 1899.

Diagram No. 3, facing this page, shows the rate per 10,000 of the population represented by the deaths from influenza registered in Ireland, England, and Scotland, respectively, during each of the twelve years, 1889-1900.

DIARRHOEAL DISEASES.

Deaths from diarrhoeal diseases were tabulated under the headings (*a*) "Simple Cholera," and (*b*) "Diarrhoea and Dysentery." During the 10 years 1891-1900, as in the two preceding decades, Ireland was free from Asiatic cholera. The mortality from diarrhoeal diseases reached the total of 17,223 deaths during the decade 1891-1900, equal to an average annual rate of 3·7 per 10,000 of the mean population; 15,797 deaths were assigned to diarrhoea and dysentery, equal to an annual rate of 3·4 per 10,000, and 1,426 to simple cholera, equal to a rate of 0·3 per 10,000.

In the decade 1871-1880, deaths from diarrhoeal diseases numbered 21,373, corresponding to a rate of 4·0 per 10,000 of the mean population, and in the decade 1881-1890, the total deaths from this group of diseases declined to 14,865, the rate being 3·0 per 10,000 of the mean population.

Tables X. and XI. show that the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases was much greater in proportion in the town than in the country districts, being at the respective rates of 7·5 and 1·9 deaths per 10,000 of the mean population, or nearly four times the rate in the former as compared with the latter. The excess of the town rate over the country rate is more marked in the case of diarrhoeal diseases than in that of any other form of zymotic disease.

In the Unions which include the large towns of Dublin, Belfast, and Cork, no less than 8,279, or 48·1 per cent. of all deaths from diarrhoeal diseases were registered, namely, in Belfast 4,101, in Dublin North and Dublin South 3,382, and in Cork 796. In Belfast Union the deaths were equal to an average annual rate of 12·4 per 10,000, as compared with a rate of 8·5 for that Union in the preceding decade. The deaths in Belfast Union constitute 23·8 per cent. of all deaths registered in Ireland from these diseases. In several other civic Unions, also, the death rate from diarrhoeal diseases was high, thus: in Dublin North it

was 9·7 per 10,000 of the population, in Dublin South 8·9, in Clonmel 6·8, in Waterford 6·7, in Londonderry 6·5, in Cork 6·0, in Kilkenny 5·8, in Lisburn 5·0, and in Lurgan 4·8.

No less than 65 per cent. of deaths from diarrhoeal diseases occurred in the civic Unions, although these contain only 33 per cent. of the population, and the mortality among young children was high.

The age-periods at which deaths from diarrhoeal diseases occur are shown at pages 116-119 of the Abstracts; 8,673, or 50·4 per cent. of the total deaths were of infants under one year of age, which figure is equal to a rate of 82·2 per 10,000 of the births registered in the decade; 2,090 children died between the ages of one and two years. There were 11,799 deaths from diarrhoeal diseases in children under 5 years of age, being 68·5 per cent., or more than two-thirds of the total mortality from these diseases, and equivalent to an average annual rate of 25·8 per 10,000 children living at that age-period. These 11,799 deaths mainly occurred among the children of the large town populations.

After the first decade of life and up to 75 years, persons of the age-periods 55 and under 65 years, and 65-75 years appear to be more susceptible to fatal attacks of diarrhoeal diseases than those of any other age-period.

The general result of a comparison of the number of deaths from these diseases during the decades 1871-80, 1881-90, and 1891-1900, is that a marked diminution in the rate occurred in the decade 1881-1890, but that in the succeeding decade, now the subject of review, the rate rose to 3·7 per 10,000 of the mean population, which latter rate is, however, below that of the decade 1871-80, which was 4·0 per 10,000 of the mean population.

PUERPERAL FEVER AND CHILDBIRTH.

During the Decennial period 6,954 women, aged 15 and under 55 years, were registered as having died from circumstances connected with the births of their offspring.

These deaths are equal to an annual rate of 14·2 per 10,000 of married women living between the ages of 15 and 55 years. Of the 6,954 deaths, 2,763, equal to a rate of 5·6 per 10,000 of married women between the ages of 15 and 55 years, were assigned to puerperal fever; the other deaths from parturition numbered 4,191, or at the rate of 8·6 per 10,000 married women of the above-stated age-periods.

The deaths from puerperal fever were at the rate of 2·6 per 1,000 births registered, and those from the accidents of childbirth at the rate of 4·0 per 1,000, the total of the two being at the rate of one in 152, or 6·6 per 1,000 of the births registered during the Decennium.

The death-rate for puerperal fever and childbirth combined for the decade 1871-1880, was 15·3 per 10,000 of married women within the ages of 15 and 55 years; the death-rate for puerperal fever was 5·8 per 10,000, and the other deaths at childbirth were at the rate of 9·5 per 10,000 of the married women living between the ages of 15 and 55 years. In the decade 1881-1890, the average annual death-rate from puerperal fever and childbirth was 15·0 per 10,000 of married women between the ages of 15 and 55 years, the deaths from puerperal fever being at the rate of 6·0 per 10,000, and the other deaths from childbirth at the rate of 9·0 per 10,000 married women living between the ages of 15 and 55 years.

The following statement shows for three Decennia the total death-rate from puerperal fever and accidents of childbirth, the rate for puerperal fever, and the rate for deaths from accidents of childbirth per 10,000 married women between the ages of 15 and 55 years.

It will be seen from the Abstract (pp. 130-137) that one or more deaths from puerperal fever, were registered in each union in Ireland with the exception of Castlecomer. The distribution of deaths from these diseases in the civic and the rural Unions is shown in Tables X. and XI. The rates in the civic and rural Unions are identical—0·6 per 10,000 for puerperal fever, in both divisions, and 0·9 per 10,000 for parturition. A comparison of the number of deaths from puerperal fever and from childbirth in civic and in rural Unions with the number of births registered shows the following result:—

From the foregoing it appears that the relation of deaths from puerperal fever and childbirth to births registered, for the whole of Ireland, is at the rate of 1 in 152, or 6·6 per 1,000 births registered; for puerperal fever alone it is 1 in 382, or 2·6 per 1,000; and for childbirth 1 in 252 or at the rate of 4·0 per 1,000 births. A comparison of the mortality in civic and rural Unions from puerperal fever shows that in the former the rate is 1 in 444 or 2·3 per 1,000 births, while in the latter it is 1 in 351, or 2·9 per 1,000; again, the deaths from "childbirth" are proportionally less in town than in the country; in the civic Unions the rate is 1 in 292, or at the rate of 3·4 per 1,000 births, while in the rural Unions it is 1 in 232, or 4·3 per 1,000 births registered. The deaths from puerperal fever and parturition combined are at the rate of 5·7 per 1,000 births for civic, and 7·2 per 1,000 births for rural Unions.

A comparison with the corresponding statistics for the preceding decade shows that in the civic Unions the number of deaths from puerperal fever per 1,000 births registered, fell from 3·1 to 2·3, and those from accidents of childbirth from 4·0 to 3·4; in the rural Unions the deaths from puerperal fever rose from 2·7 to 2·9 per 1,000 births, and those from accidents of childbirth fell from 4·4 to 4·3. Taking the whole country, the deaths under each head show a decline, those from puerperal fever having fallen from 2·8 per 1,000 births to 2·6, and deaths from accidents of childbirth from 4·3 to 4·0. The deaths under both heads combined fell from 7·1 to 6·6 per 1,000 births registered.

In order to show approximately the relative liability to death from puerperal fever and childbirth among married women at various periods of life, the following statement has been prepared. It has not been found practicable to exclude the deaths of the mothers of illegitimate children, but the number of such could not materially affect the calculations.

In Table XV. all the deaths registered from puerperal fever and childbirth, between the ages of 15 and 55 years, are included. It appears that during the decade, the average annual death-rate for puerperal fever and childbirth combined, at ages 15 and under 20 years, was 56·9 per 10,000 of the mean number of married women living at those ages; between the ages of 20 and 25 years the rate was 25·9; from 25 to 35 years it was 21·9; from 35 to 45 years it was 15·3; and from 45 to 55 years the rate was 1·2 per 10,000 of married women living.

The average annual death-rates from puerperal fever are: for those aged 15 and under 20 years, 25·6 per 10,000; 20 and under 25 years, 13·2; 25 and under 35 years, 9·4; 35 and under 45 years, 4·9; and for those aged 45 and under 55 years, 0·4, the average rate being 5·6 per 10,000 married women aged 15 and under 55 years. For other deaths at childbirth the rates are:—from 15 to 20 years, 31·3; from 20 to 25 years 12·7; from 25 to 35 years, 12·5; from 35 to 45 years, 10·4; and from 45 to 55 years, 0·8, the average rate being 8·6 per 10,000 married women living at the age-periods 15 to 55 years. During the preceding decade the total number of deaths registered from puerperal fever and childbirth combined, represented a rate of 15·0 per 10,000 of the mean number of married women living between the ages of 15 and 55 years, showing that the death-rate from these causes, when taken collectively, fell 0·8. The death-rate from puerperal fever fell from 6·0 in the previous, to 5·6 in the latter decade; and in deaths from accidents of childbirth the rate has fallen from 9·0 to 8·6 per 10,000.

ERYSIPELAS.

The number of deaths from erysipelas registered during the 10 years was 1,873, being equal to an average annual rate of 0·41 per 10,000 of the mean population, and somewhat under the rate for the preceding 10 years; of the deaths, 1,007 were of males, and 866 were of females, which numbers correspond to 0·45 and 0·37 per 10,000 of the male and female population, respectively.

OTHER ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

Among the zymotic diseases not dealt with separately in the foregoing observations, are chicken pox, which in the course of the decade caused 81 deaths (39 males and 42 females); epidemic rose rash (German measles) of which there were 107 fatal cases (46 males and 61 females); relapsing fever, to which the deaths of 16 persons (7 males and 9 females) were ascribed; mumps which caused 109 deaths (60 males and 49 females); cerebro-spinal fever, the deaths from which numbered 804 (441 males and 363 females); hydrophobia, which caused 35 deaths (27 males and 8 females); pyæmia, septicæmia, under which head 1,198 deaths were tabulated; &c.

PARASITIC DISEASES.

There were 189 deaths from thrush (103 males and 86 females); 4 deaths (3 males and 1 female) were assigned to "other diseases of vegetable parasites;" 4 deaths were due to hydatid disease (2 males and 2 females); and 268 deaths (116 males and 152 females) were classified under "other diseases from animal parasites."

DIETETIC DISEASES.

ALCOHOLISM.

The deaths which are attributed to the effects of alcohol, appear in the Abstracts, under the head of "Intemperance"—which includes chronic alcoholism and delirium tremens; it is generally believed that the statistical records of the deaths which are caused by over-indulgence in alcoholic beverages do not give a true representation of the facts. It is known that intemperance in the use of alcohol may produce pathological changes in many of the organs, and structures of the body, as the stomach, liver, kidneys are readily attacked by this substance, and in the case of the brain and nervous system causing insanity, and other grave results. This being so, there were, no doubt, many deaths primarily due to alcohol, which have not been recorded as having been caused by it. Also, many deaths were attributed to accidental violence, which occurred when the victims were in a state of partial or complete intoxication.

From the above Table it appears that during the decade, 1,601 deaths were attributed to the effects of alcohol; of these 1,601 persons, 1,306 were males, and 295 were females. Of the total deaths, 421 were registered as having been caused by delirium tremens (388 males and 33 females); and 1,180 persons fell victims to chronic alcoholism (918 males and 262 females). The Table also shows the comparison between the deaths of men and women for delirium tremens, and chronic alcoholism for the three Decennial periods for which information is available.

It will be observed that there was but slight variation in the number of deaths from intemperance registered during the three decades; there was a diminution of deaths in the second decade as compared with the first, but the number for the third period of ten years was practically equal to that of the first, notwithstanding the decline in the population. It will also be observed that there has been an appreciable increase in the number of deaths of females tabulated as due to chronic alcoholism.

CONSTITUTIONAL DISEASES.

CANCER, MALIGNANT DISEASE.

According to the system which obtained during the 10 years now the subject of review, the deaths classified under the head of Cancer, Malignant Disease, include those deaths which were certified as carcinoma (scirrhus, epithelioma, rodent ulcer, etc.), and sarcoma.

The total number of these deaths recorded in the decade, is 24,435, of which 11,062 were of males and 13,373 were of females. In the preceding decade the number of deaths from cancer in Ireland was 20,036, viz.: 8,964 males and 11,072 females, and in the decade which ended with the year 1880, the total number of deaths recorded was 17,790 (7,789 males and 10,001 females). The average annual rate per 10,000 of the population represented by the deaths from cancer, malignant disease, which for the decade 1871-80, was 3·4 per 10,000 of the mean population, rose to 4·1 for the following 10 years, and to 5·3 for the Decennium ending with the year 1900.

The Abstracts on pages 120-121 give the sexes and age-periods of those persons who fell victims to cancer during the Decennium. As before stated, the deaths of 11,062 males and 13,373 females were recorded, these numbers are equal respectively to the average annual rate of 4·90 and 5·76 per 10,000 of the mean population of males and females in Ireland.

As regards the question of the relation of "age-period" to the cancer death-rate, the Abstracts show that the deaths of persons under 25 years of age from cancer are not numerous, there having been only 294 (156 males and 138 females) during the Decennium, being only 1·2 per cent. of all the deaths from cancer, malignant disease, registered.

Omitting these deaths and basing the calculations on the estimated mean number of persons aged 25 years and upwards in the population, it is found that the deaths from Cancer, malignant disease during the decade were equal to an average annual rate of 11·1 per 10,000 persons, against an average rate of 8·8 per 10,000 for the preceding 10 years, and a rate of 7·3 per 10,000 for the 10 years 1871-80, so that in the 10 years 1891-1900, allowing for the decrease in the population, the registered mortality under this head of persons aged 25 years and upwards, was 52 per cent. in excess of that for the 10 years 1871-80, and 26 per cent. in excess of that for the decade 1881-90. The average rates for the sexes taken separately were:—in 10 years ending with 1880, males 6·7 per 10,000 males aged 25 years and upwards in the population; females 7·8 per 10,000; in the 10 years 1881-90, males 8·2, females 9·3; and in the decade 1891-1900, males 10·4, females 11·7 per 10,000.

The Abstracts which commence on page 128 give the number of deaths from cancer registered during the decade, by Provinces, Counties and Unions or Superintendent Registrars' Districts. In the Province of Leinster there were 7,040 deaths from this cause, a number equivalent to an average annual rate of 6·0 per 10,000 of the mean population at all ages, the highest county rate in this Province being that for Dublin County and County Borough, viz. ; 7·6 per 10,000. In the Province of Munster 4,665 deaths from cancer were registered, the average annual rate represented being 4·1 per 10,000, and the highest county rate that of Waterford and Waterford County Borough, which is 5·2 per 10,000. The deaths from cancer in the Province of Ulster, amounted to 10,276, representing an annual average rate of 6·4 per 10,000; the highest County rates being those for Armagh, (8·7 per 10,000), Londonderry (7·4), Tyrone (6·9), the County of Down with part of Belfast County Borough (6·5), and the County of Antrim with part of Belfast County Borough, 6·2 per 10,000. The number of deaths from cancer returned for the Province of Connaught is 2,454, equivalent to an average annual rate of 3·6 per 10,000 of the mean population; the highest County rate for this Province is 3·8 per 10,000, the rate for Roscommon and Sligo, respectively.

In Table XIII., pages 24-25, the number of deaths from cancer which occurred in Ireland during each year of the decade is given, also the death-rate for each year. It will be seen that in 1891 the rate was 46·2 per 100,000 of the estimated population, and that with the exception of that for the year 1895, which was slightly below the rate for 1894, the rates for the several years show a gradual rise to 60·8 the rate for the year 1900.

TUBERCULOSIS.

In the classification followed during the decade 1891-1900, deaths from tuberculosis were distributed under four heads, namely:—"Phthisis," "Tubercular Meningitis" (acute Hydrocephalus), "Tabes Mesenterica," and "other forms of Tuberculosis, Scrofula." The following tabular statement shows the number of deaths under each of these heads during each of the last three decennia, with the respective annual average rates per 10,000 of the population represented thereby:—

It will be observed that the tuberculosis death-rate has risen in Ireland since the first of the decades covered by the above statement—a fact which goes to show that the sanitary and other measures which have been undertaken for the improvement of the public health, have not as yet arrested the ravages of this formidable disease.

The Abstracts on pages 120-121 furnish information concerning the ages and sexes of those who died from the different forms of tuberculosis during the decade. The leading facts to be gained by the consideration of these figures are—with reference to “phthisis,” that no less than 73,349 (35,147 males and 38,202 females) between the ages of 15 and 45 years, succumbed to the disease, and that these deaths are equivalent to an average annual number of 35·5 in every 10,000 of the mean population at these ages.

Of the persons (9,825) who died from tubercular meningitis (5,120 males and 4,705 females), 5,590, or 57 per cent. succumbed while under the age of 5 years; and of those whose deaths were attributed to tabes mesenterica, 9,887 in number, (4,986 males and 4,901 females), 7,575 (4,003 males and 3,572 females), or 77 per cent. of the total, died under the age of 5 years.

Table XIII. on pages 24-25, shows the mortality under each of those heads during the Decennium and in each of the 10 years 1891-1900 in the whole of Ireland, with the relation of this mortality to the population; and the Abstracts on pages 128-137 give the numbers of deaths assigned to phthisis, tubercular meningitis, and tabes mesenterica, respectively, in each of the Provinces, Counties, and Poor Law Unions or Superintendent Registrars' Districts.

The average annual rate represented by the deaths from phthisis in the whole of the country was 21·3 per 10,000 of the mean population, the yearly rates ranging from 19·9 per 10,000 in 1896 to 22·5 in 1900. In Leinster the average annual rate for deaths from phthisis was 23·7 per 10,000 of the mean population for the decade; in Munster 20·4 per 10,000; in Ulster 22·4 per 10,000; and in Connaught 15·7 per 10,000. As might be inferred from the general prevalence of this disease, no Union in Ireland escaped its ravages.

A study of the figures for phthisis given in Tables X. and XI. reveals that the average annual death-rate per 10,000 for the civic Unions was 29·0, while that for the rural Unions was 17·5.

The highest rate for any of the civic Unions is 35·0 per 10,000 in South Dublin Union. The civic Unions in which the rate approached nearest to that for Dublin South, are Belfast 34·1; Cork 33·6; and Dublin North 32·1. The rate for the two Unions, Dublin North and Dublin South combined was 33·8.

In Table No. XVII. on page 38, the mortality during the 10 years 1891-1900 from (a) phthisis and (b) from inflammatory diseases of the respiratory system in the littoral Unions of Ireland, is contrasted with the deaths from these causes in the inland Unions, the Unions in each class being divided into those containing towns of 10,000 or more inhabitants, and Unions in which there are not any towns of that kind, and the littoral Unions being further sub-divided into four groups according to their position, viz. : Northern, Eastern, Southern, and Western. The Table shows that in the inland Unions in which there are not any large towns, the average annual rate represented by deaths from phthisis was 17·1 per 10,000 of the population; in the littoral Unions of this class the rate was 18·3; in inland Unions containing towns of 10,000 or more inhabitants, the rate was 23·7, and in littoral Unions of this class it was 30·1.

DEVELOPMENTAL DISEASES.

The deaths referred to this group are those returned as caused by premature birth, by congenital defects, or by old age.

To the first of these causes, "prematurity," 4,654 deaths (2,685 males and 1,969 females) were assigned during the 10 years 1891-1900; to congenital defects, (which include atelectasis, cyanosis, spina bifida, imperforate anus, cleft palate, hare lip, and other congenital defects), 1,124 deaths; and to the 3rd head, namely, "old age" 169,100 deaths (76,384 of males and 92,716 of females) or 20·2 per cent. of the deaths from all causes. In the preceding decade 177,225 deaths (80,185 males and 97,040 females) or 20·1 per cent. of the deaths from all causes were ascribed to old age; and in the Decennium 1871-80 the cause of 206,349 deaths (93,711 males and 112,638 females) was so recorded, this number forming 21·3 per cent. of all the deaths registered.

LOCAL DISEASES.

The total number of deaths referred to local diseases is 338,420, viz. : 71,250 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, 541 deaths from diseases of the organs of special sense, 62,500 deaths from diseases of the organs of circulation, 137,433 deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, 40,367 deaths from diseases of the digestive system, 630 deaths from diseases of the lymphatic system and ductless glands, 15,317 deaths from diseases of the urinary organs, 1,492 deaths from diseases of the organs of generation, 4,193 deaths at childbirth (exclusive of deaths from puerperal fever), 2,737 deaths from diseases of the locomotive system (bones, joints, etc.), and 1,960 deaths from diseases of the integumentary system.

The following tabular statement shows the deaths and death-rates from the various divisions of local diseases, for the two Decennial periods 1881-1890 and 1891-1900:—

Diseases of the Nervous System.—The diseases for which special heads are assigned in the classification of deaths from diseases of the nervous system, include:—Inflammation of the brain or its membranes, from which cause 6,404 deaths occurred (males 3,557 and females 2,847); apoplexy, which was the registered cause of death in 12,657 instances (6,236 were males and 6,421 females); softening of the brain, which was accountable for 1,866 deaths (1,031 males and 835 females); hemiplegia, to which 13,690 deaths were attributed (6,504 males and 7,186 females); paralysis agitans, which caused 195 deaths (101 males and 94 females); insanity and general paralysis of the insane, to which 3,886 deaths were assigned (2,040 of males and 1,846 of females); chorea, which caused 105 deaths (30 males and 75 females); and epilepsy, to which 3,052 deaths were attributed (1,632 males and 1,420 females). The deaths ascribed to convulsions number 23,275, of which 12,876 were of males, and 10,399 were of females.

Of the total deaths from convulsions, no less than 22,704 were those of children under 5 years of age, including 18,862 of infants in the first year of life, the latter number forming 17 per cent. of the total number of deaths of infants under one year old. In the two decades preceding the period, for which the statistics are now being reviewed, the deaths attributed to convulsions were 30,490 in the ten years ending with 1890, and 38,810 in the preceding 10 years. An improvement in the matter of certification and registration of the causes of death is evidenced by the fact that a substantial relative and absolute reduction in the number of deaths said to be due to convulsions, is shown by the records for the Decennial period extending from 1891 to 1900. The deaths from other diseases of the nervous system include 126 (78 males and 48 females) from laryngismus stridulus; 78 (48 males and 30 females) from idiopathic tetanus; and 2,506 (1,437 males and 1,069 females) from paraplegia and diseases of the spinal cord. To other and undefined diseases of the brain and nervous system, 3,410 deaths were ascribed—1,775 of males, and 1,635 of females.

Table XVIII. shows the number of deaths from convulsions, and total number of deaths from all diseases of the nervous system, in Ireland, in each of the 10 years, 1891-1900.

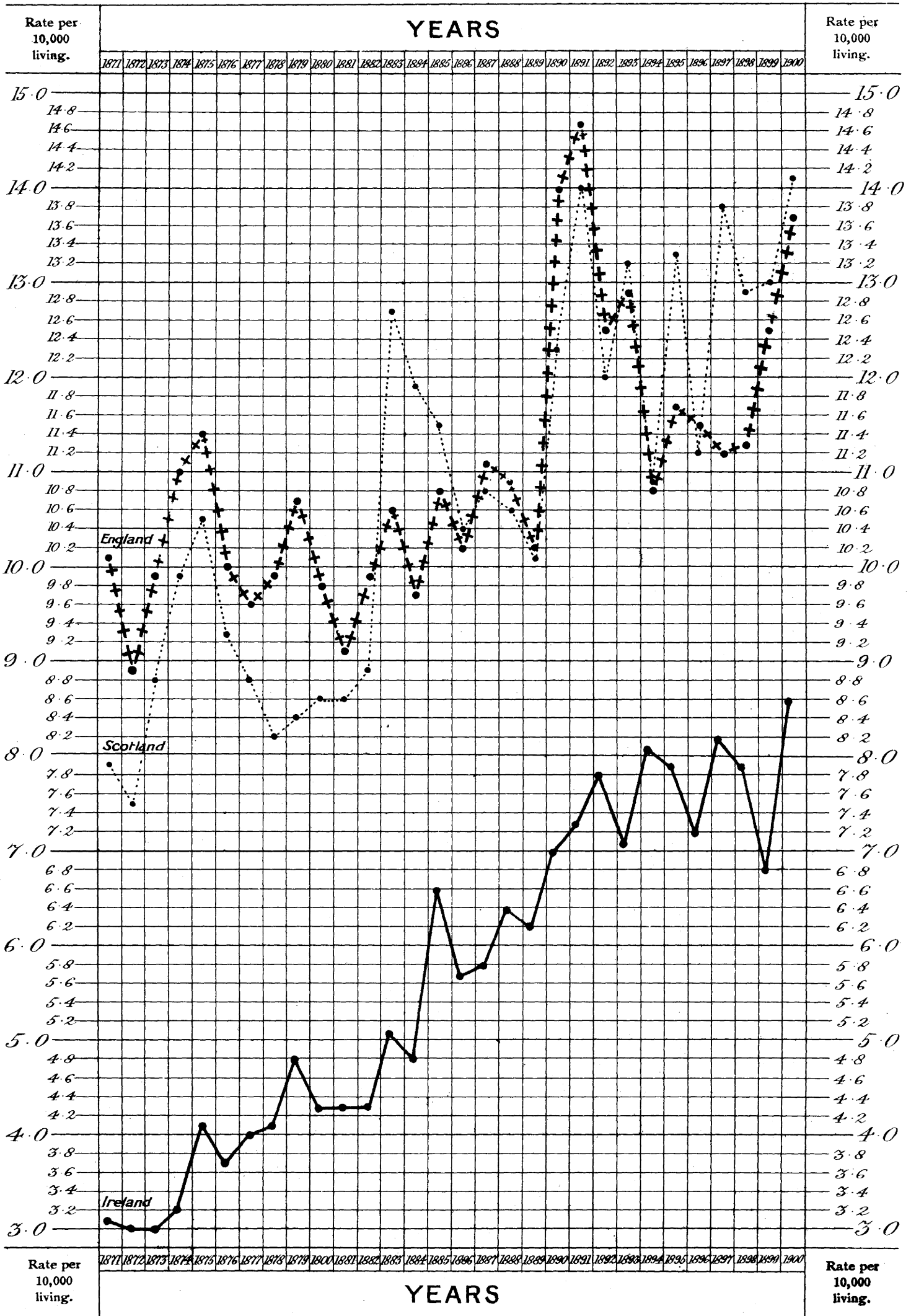

Diseases of the Circulatory System.—The deaths from these diseases registered during the decade form 7.5 per cent. of the deaths from all causes. They amount to 62,500 (31,187 males and 31,313 females) a number equivalent to an average annual rate of 13.7 per 10,000 of the mean population, against 50,800, representing an average annual rate of 10.3 per 10,000 in the preceding 10 years. Of the 62,500 deaths from diseases of this class, 8,955 were ascribed to endocarditis, valvular disease, 404 to pericarditis, 488 to angina pectoris, 3,378 to syncope (against 1,773 during the preceding 10 years), 638 to aneurysm, 1,286 to senile gangrene, 146 to phlebitis, and 47,205 to other diseases of the heart or circulatory system. Of the 638 deaths which were ascribed to aneurysm, 488 or 76.5 per cent. were of males and 150 or 23.5 per cent. were of females.

Diseases of the Respiratory System.—There were 137,433 deaths (70,458 males and 66,975 females) from diseases of the respiratory system, during the decade, being equal to an average annual rate of 30·0 per 10,000 of the mean population, as compared with 153,279 (79,591 males and 73,688 females) representing an annual rate of 31·0 per 10,000 in the preceding 10 years. The highest rate for any of the 10 years 1891-1900 was 34·6 per 10,000 of the estimated population, which was the rate for the year 1891, when 16,194 deaths from these causes were registered, and the lowest was 24·7 per 10,000 for the year 1896, the number of deaths being 11,236.

In the Abstracts, diseases of the respiratory system are arranged under eight heads, namely, laryngitis, which caused 1,156 deaths during the decade; croup with 4,859 deaths; other diseases of the larynx and trachea, 117 deaths; emphysema and asthma, 2,862; bronchitis, 86,080 (being 10·3 per cent. of the deaths from all causes), pneumonia, 35,080; pleurisy, 2,078; and other diseases of the respiratory system, 5,201. Deaths from pneumonia which numbered 19,718 in the decade 1871-1880, increased to 27,576 in the decade 1881-1890, and rose to 35,080 in the decade 1891-1900; the numbers are equal to the average annual rates of 3·7, 5·6 and 7·7 per 10,000 of the mean population for the respective decades.

Diagram No. 4, facing this page, shows the rate per 10,000 of the population represented by the deaths from pneumonia registered in Ireland, England, and Scotland, respectively, in each of the thirty years, 1871-1900.

Table XIX. shows the death-rate from all causes in Ireland, for each year of the decade, together with the maximum, minimum, and mean temperature of the air, and the yearly rainfall in Dublin, and in Table XX. is shown the mean temperature for each month during the decade.

As remarked above, the highest death-rate from diseases of the respiratory system was recorded in the year 1891, and the lowest in the year 1896. Reference to column 4 of Table XIX. shows that in the former year the mean temperature was 49·1°, which is below the average for the 10 years (50·1°) and also below the mean temperature of any other of the years except 1892 and 1895. In the year 1892 the mean temperature 48·1 was recorded, being the lowest during the decade, and in that year the death-rate for diseases of the respiratory system was 34·2 per 10,000 of the population, being the second highest rate afforded by the mortality from diseases of the respiratory system in any of the 10 years 1891-1900.

Diseases of the Digestive System.—The total number of deaths from diseases of the digestive organs registered during the ten years 1891-1900 was 40,367—20,492 males and 19,875 females—and is equal to an average annual rate of 8.8 per 10,000 of the mean population. In the preceding decade, 1881-1890, the total number of deaths from diseases of the digestive system was 46,776 (24,404 males and 22,372 females), equivalent to an average annual rate of 9.5 per 10,000 of the mean population.

The deaths enumerated under the various heads in this class of diseases, during the ten years 1891-1900, were :—From stomatitis (disease of the mouth) 360; from dentition 1,908; from sore throat, quinsy 1,065; from dyspepsia 1,291; from hæmatemesis and diseases of the stomach 10,107; from melæna, enteritis and ulceration of the intestines 4,445; from ileus, obstruction of intestine, stricture or strangulation of intestine, and intussusception of intestine 4,635; from peritonitis 3,969; from ascites 737; from gallstones 134; from cirrhosis of the liver 2,650; from other diseases of liver 6,144; and from other and un-defined diseases of the digestive system 2,922.

The abstracts on pp. 128-137 show the distribution of deaths from diseases of the digestive system, numerically, for the Provinces, Counties and Unions, or Superintendent Registrars' Districts of Ireland.

In Table XIII., on pages 24-25, the number of deaths occurring in each year of the decade from diseases of the digestive system is given, also the annual death rate per 100,000 of the estimated population represented thereby. The highest annual rate for the period was 91.9 deaths per 100,000 of the population in 1891, and the lowest 84.4 per 100,000 in 1898.

Diseases of the Urinary System.—The total number of deaths attributed to the maladies in this division of local diseases during the ten years 1891-1900 is 15,317, equal to an average annual rate of 33.4 per 100,000 of the mean population; the deaths of males numbering 10,174, and those of females being 5,143 only, or about one-half the number of deaths of males. The average rate for the preceding decade was 30.7 per 100,000 of the mean population, showing that there has been a slight increase in the relative mortality from diseases of this class. The deaths from these causes during the ten years 1891-1900 include 2,623 from acute nephritis (1,476 males and 1,147 females), 6,403 from Bright's disease, albuminuria (3,700 males and 2,703 females), 435 from uræmia (270 males and 165 females), 166 from suppression of urine (114 males and 52 females), 185 from calculus (153 males and 32 females), 129 from hæmaturia (114 males and 15 females), 2,898 from diseases of the bladder and prostate gland in males, 271 from diseases of the bladder in females, and 2,207 from other and undefined diseases of the urinary system (1,449 males and 758 females). In the decade preceding (1881-1890) the number of deaths attributed to diseases of this class was 15,156. The abstracts on pages 116-117 and 124-125 show that fatalities from diseases of this group are not numerous in the earlier years of life, 13,474 of the 15,317 deaths, during the ten years 1891-1900, occurring amongst persons aged 25 years and upwards.

Diseases of the Organs of Generation.—Deaths from diseases of the ovary, of the uterus and vagina, and from disorders of menstruation constitute the large majority of the deaths from diseases of this group during the decade, amounting as they do to 1,277 out of a total of 1,492.

Diseases of Parturition.—The deaths from these diseases which have already been referred to in the observations on puerperal fever, pp 32-34, include 236 deaths from abortion, miscarriage, 110 from puerperal mania, 359 from puerperal convulsions, 1,194 from placenta prævia, flooding, 84 from phlegmasia dolens, and 2,210 from other and undefined accidents of childbirth.

Diseases of the Organs of Locomotion.—Of the 2,737 deaths referred to diseases of the locomotive apparatus of the body (bones, joints, etc.), 1,516 were of males and 1,221 of females. The diseases include caries, necrosis, arthritis (not rheumatic, tubercular or syphilitic), ostitis and periostitis, with other or undefined diseases of the organs of locomotion.

Diseases of the Integumentary System.—According to the system of classification which obtained during the decade a total 1,960 deaths (1,073 males and 887 females), were assigned to this group as follows:—to carbuncle 227 deaths, to phlegmon, cellulitis 451, to lupus 142, to ulcer, bed sore, 543, to eczema 289, to pemphigus 57, and to other and un-defined diseases of the integumentary system, 251 deaths.

DEATHS FROM VIOLENCE.

The deaths from violence recorded during the decade numbered 19,810—13,444 males and 6,366 females. The deaths in this class include those which occurred from accident or negligence, by homicide, by suicide, and by execution.

The average annual death rate in civic Unions from these causes was 5·6 per 10,000 of the mean population, and in the rural Unions 3·7 per 10,000.

In the North Dublin Union the average rate was 7·0 per 10,000 of the mean population, in South Dublin 6·6, in Cork 6·1, and in Lisburn 6·0.

The following is a statement showing the sex distribution in the case of deaths from the various forms of violence:—

It will be observed that deaths resulting from violence were more than twice as numerous among males than among females, the deaths of males forming 67·9 per cent. of the total number.

The excess of male over female deaths obtains throughout all the four orders of this class. A comparison of the number of deaths, in each sex at different age periods, as given in the Abstract on pp. 116-117 and 126-127, shows that among children the excess of male over female deaths from violence is not great, whereas, in the more advanced periods of life, it becomes very marked.

Thus, of infants under one year old, who died from accident or negligence, 790 were males and 625 females, and of 4,040 deaths of children under five years from these causes, 2,222 were of males and 1,818 of females.

On the other hand the deaths of males, aged 25 and under 65, from accident or negligence, during the decade were 5,451 in number, while there were only 1,621 deaths of females.

The forms of accidental violence, which were accountable for the greatest number of deaths, were burns and scalds, causing 4,048 deaths (males 1,801, females 2,247); drowning, 3,477 (2,850 males and 627 females); falls, 1,897 (1,206 males and 691 females); and vehicles and horses, 1,675 (1,476 males and 199 females).

The deaths from burns (including scalds) constitute 20·4 per cent. of all the deaths from violence.

Of the total number of deaths from burns, 52 per cent., were of children under 5 years of age.

The Abstract on pages 126-127 shows that of the deaths from drowning, the greater number occurred in males at the active periods of life.

The number of violent deaths from other causes will be seen on pages 126-127 of the Abstract, where they are given by sexes and age periods; the number of deaths by the different forms of violence is given, by Provinces, Counties, and Unions, in the Abstract following.

The deaths which were attributed to homicide (631) were at the rate of 0·1 per 10,000 of the mean population for the decade; of these, 362 were males and 269 were females; in the preceding decade the deaths so resulting were 1,150, or an annual average rate of 0·2 per 10,000 of the mean population. Of the deaths which occurred from homicide during the decade 264 (120 males and 144 females), were of infants under one year.

During the decade fifteen persons (males) were executed in Ireland.

The deaths from suicide numbered 1,316—988 males and 328 females—and are equal to an average annual rate of 0·3 per 10,000 of the mean population.

In the decade which preceded, the deaths assigned to suicide were 1,126 (832 males and 294 females), equal to a rate of 0·2 per 10,000 of the mean population.

All the suicides during the ten years 1891-1900 were over 20 years of age, with the exception of 10 males and 13 females.

ILL-DEFINED AND NOT SPECIFIED CAUSES.

The deaths during the ten years 1891-1900, which come under the head of Ill-defined and not specified Causes, according to the classification in use for that period, amount to 52,510, or 6·3 per cent. of all the deaths registered. Of these 52,510 deaths, 45,232 (including 29,758 deaths of infants under one year old) were tabulated under the heading "Debility, Atrophy, Inanition," and 2,732 were deaths vaguely returned as due to "Dropsy."

In 271 of the 52,510 deaths in this class the cause of death was stated to have been "tumour," no indication being given as to the probable pathological character of the new growth, and no information afforded with regard to the organ or system in the body to which it was attached or had invaded; in 603 cases "abscess" was stated to have been the cause of death, but the returns did not disclose whether the abscess was of a tuberculous, or otherwise definite character, nor was there any statement as to its anatomical position in the body; 117 deaths were attributed to "mortification," and 228 were vaguely returned as having resulted from "hæmorrhage," neither the cause nor the locality of the hæmorrhage being stated.

AGES.

The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 109,512, being at the rate of 104 per 1,000 births registered.

Amongst children under five years of age there occurred 173,994 deaths, a mortality equal to an average annual rate of 38·1 per 1,000 of the living at that age. Of these 173,994 children, 93,403 were boys, and 80,591 girls: the death rate among boys being 40·3 per 1,000 living, and that for girls 35·9 per 1,000.

The average annual number of deaths of persons aged sixty-five years and upwards is equivalent to 9·9 per cent. of the mean number of the living at that age.

Amongst the 836,035 deaths registered during the ten years are 7,484 of persons stated to have been aged ninety-five years and upwards—3,491 males and 3,993 females.

The following statement gives a summary of the death-rates of the population of Ireland at each age period :—

From this it appears that among male children under five years of age the average annual death-rate was 402·8 per 10,000, while the corresponding rate for female children was but 358·6 per 10,000; for each of the next three quinquennial age periods the female death-rate exceeded the male rate thus :—the rate among boys aged five and under ten was 42·3 per 10,000, and that for the girls 47·0 per 10,000 ; among boys aged ten years and under fifteen the rate was 29·4, and among girls it was 40·7, and the deaths of males aged fifteen and under twenty were equal to 49·9 per 10,000, while those of females of that age equalled 61·8 per 10,000. In each of the next four age periods the male death-rate was in excess of the female ; the rates for the period twenty and under twenty-five being 76·3 (males), and 72·8 (females); for the period twenty-five and under thirty-five, 90·8 and 89·5 ; for thirty-five and under forty-five 104·6 and 103·8 ; and for the next ten year age period, 152·6 and 147·3. For the three following age periods the female death-rate exceeded the male rate thus :—for fifty-five and under sixty-five the rates were 289·1 and 293·5 ; for sixty-five and under seventy-five, 617·5 and 652·6 ; for the next ten year period, 1,375·6 and 1,394·0. Amongst persons aged eighty-five years and upwards the rates were—males 3,004·0 and females 2,862·4.

The following is a supplement to the foregoing summary of deaths by ages, showing the percentage of the total deaths which occurred during each age period :—

From this it appears that 22·7 per cent. of the deaths of males and 19·0 per cent. of those of females occurred amongst children under five years of age. The deaths of males aged five and under twenty-five years formed 11·5 per cent. of the total number of deaths of males, and those of females of that age 12·6 per cent. of the total female mortality ; 12·5 per cent. of the deaths of males and 13·1 per cent. of those of females occurred among persons aged twenty-five and under forty-five ; 19·3 per cent. of the male mortality was amongst men aged forty-five and under sixty-five, and 20·2 per cent. of the female mortality amongst women of those ages ; and 34·0 per cent. of the deaths of males and 35·1 per cent. of those of females occurred among persons aged sixty-five years and upwards.

EMIGRATION.

According to the Returns obtained by the Royal Irish Constabulary and the Metropolitan Police who acted as enumerators at the several Irish seaports, the number of emigrants who left Ireland during the ten years 1891-1900 amounted to 433,526; of these 201,570 were males and 231,956 were females. In the previous decade 770,706 persons emigrated. Of the whole number in the late decade, 50,376 were from Leinster; 178,010 from Munster; 87,021 from Ulster; and 118,119 from Connaught.

Of the total emigrants from Ireland in the ten years, 7·8 per cent. were under fifteen years of age at the time of their departure; 83·7 per cent. were between fifteen and thirty-five years old; and 8·5 per cent. were thirty-five or upwards.

PRICES OF PROVISIONS, AND PAUPERISM.

The subjoined Table shows for each of the ten years, 1891-1900, the average prices of provisions in Dublin, and the average number of persons in Ireland receiving indoor or out-door relief on Saturdays.

The mean price of bread (first quality delivered) in Dublin was 5½d. per 4 lb. loaf, the average yearly prices ranging from 4¾d. in 1894 and 1895 to 6¾d. in 1891. The mean price of oatmeal (1st quality) for the ten years was 14s. 4d., the yearly average prices ranging from 12s. 7d. in 1896 to 15s. 5d. in 1891 and 1892; the mean prices of potatoes were from 2s. 8d. to 3s. 9d., the lowest average prices for any year being from 1s. 11d. to 2s. 11d. in 1896, and the highest 3s. 4d. to 4s. 7d. in 1900; beef was lowest in 1896, the average prices being from 43s. 6d. to 54s. 0d., and in 1898, the average prices being from 44s. 6d. to 53s. 0d., and highest in 1900, the average prices being from 52s. 0d. to 59s. 6d.; the mean prices for the ten years were from 46s. 6d. to 57s. 0d.

The mean number of workhouse inmates in Ireland on Saturdays during the ten years (derived from returns furnished by the Local Government Board) was 42,368, and the mean number of persons receiving out-door relief was 58,611. The lowest average number of workhouse inmates for any one year was 41,582 in 1892, and the highest 44,186 in 1898, and the average numbers on out-door relief ranged from 54,396 in 1896 to 66,612 in 1898.

THE WEATHER.

The following particulars have been derived from Returns of Meteorological Observations taken during the years 1891-1900, inclusive, at 40 Fitzwilliam Square, West, Dublin, kindly furnished by Sir John W. Moore, B.A., M.D., Univ., Dub., F.R.C.P.I., F.R. Met. Soc., Observer at Dublin for the Meteorological Office, London.

The Average* Mean Atmospheric pressure has been obtained from daily readings of the barometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M., corrected and reduced to 32° Fahrenheit, but not reduced to the mean sea level. The Average Mean Temperature of the Air given in the Tables is the arithmetical mean of the readings of the Dry Bulb Thermometer in a Stevenson stand taken daily at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. In Tables XIX. and XX., pages 41-42, the Average Mean Temperature values have been deduced from the maximal and minimal readings of the thermometer in the shade by an empirical Formula, viz., $min. + (max. - min.) C = Mean Temperature$. The co-efficient C. is a variable quantity from month to month which has been determined by a careful comparison of the arithmetical means of the maximum and minimum thermometer readings with the results yielded by the tracings taken by the thermograph at self-recording observatories of the First Order. The co-efficients for the different months are—January and December, .520; February and November, .500; March and October, .485; April and September, .476; May and August, .470; June and July, .465. The Tension of Aqueous Vapour (expressed in terms of inches of mercury), Relative Humidity, and Amount of Cloud, are the result of observations taken daily at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. The Rainfall is that measured at 9 A.M. each day and entered to the preceding day. A *Rainy Day* is one on which at least five-thousandths (.005) of an inch of rain falls within the twenty-four hours from 9 A.M. to 9 A.M. The number of days of rain, snow, hail, thunderstorms, clear sky, over-cast sky, and gales, are calculated from observations at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M., and the same applies to the results obtained as to the Direction of the Wind.

The *Average Mean Height of the Barometer* during the ten years 1891-1900, was 29.871 inches. The annual mean varied from 29.833 inches in 1900 to 29.951 in 1896, a difference of somewhat less than an eighth of an inch (.118 inch.)

The monthly average ranged from 29.767 inches in December to 29.937 inches in May. The extreme monthly means were—highest, 30.339 inches in February, 1891; lowest, 29.480 in February, 1900.

The *Average Mean Temperature* deduced from observations at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 49.3°, the average at 9 A.M. being 49.6°, and that at 9 P.M. 49.0°. The annual mean varied from 47.5° in 1892 to 50.8° in 1898—a range of 3.3°. The monthly average varied from 40.5° in January to 59.7° in July—an annual range of 19.2°. The extreme monthly means were—highest, 62.2° in August, 1899, and July, 1900; lowest, 33.6° in February, 1895—a range of 28.6°. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 80.8° on June 15, 1896; lowest, 16.9° on January 9, 1895. These values give a range of 63.9° in the screen. The average mean temperature for the ten years deduced from the observed daily extremes was 50.3°.

Rain fell on 1,958 days, including snow or sleet on 187 days, and hail on 275 days. The average annual number of rainy days was therefore 195.8, of snowy days 18.7, and of days of hail 27.5. The total rainfall measured 279.828 inches. The smallest annual fall was 20.493 on 174 days in 1893; the largest fall was 34.338 inches on 216 days in 1900. The average annual fall appears as 27.983 inches. The ten years' monthly fall varied from 15.455 inches on 154 days in March to 36.532 inches on 195 days in August.

The maximal rainfall in twenty-four hours was 2.227 inches, on August 5, 1899, a down-pour which was nearly approached on May, 28, 1892, when 2.056 inches were measured. February, March, April and June were the only months in the year in which no rainfall of one inch in twenty-four hours took place; the heaviest downpour in these months was .576 inch on February 17, 1898, .735 inch on March 11, 1897, .956 inch on April 30, 1898, and .903 inch on June 20, 1899. The distribution of rain was as follows:—for the first quarter, 55.563 inches; for the second, 59.526; total for the first half year, 115.089 inches. In the third quarter 85.944 inches, and in the fourth quarter 78.795 inches fell. Total for the second half year, 164.739 inches, or nearly half as much again as the rainfall of the first six months. The numbers representing rainy days for the first, third, and fourth quarters are 500, 487 and 526 respectively. In the second quarter the rainy days were much fewer, namely 445.

Of the 187 snowy days, 139 were in the first quarter, 13 in the second, none in the third, and 35 in the fourth. Of the 275 days on which hail was observed, 135 fell in the first quarter, 72 in the second, 16 in the third, and 52 in the fourth.

As regards the *Direction of the Wind*, 7,304 observations were made, with this result:—N., 470; N.E., 517; E., 755; S.E., 599; S., 623; S.W., 1,074; W., 1,934; N.W., 975; calm, 357. The preponderance of westerly (S.W. to N.W.) over easterly (N.E. to S.E.) winds is very striking—the figures are 3,983 and 1,871 respectively, more than 2 to 1 in favour of westerly winds. But the great excess of W. winds is still more remarkable. They number 1,934, or nearly double the number of S.W. winds, 1,074.

*Throughout this Abstract the term "Average" is employed to denote the *arithmetical mean of a series of means*; thus, by Average Atmospheric Pressure we understand the arithmetical mean of a series of ten years' annual mean pressures.

Gales were recorded on 338 occasions, of which 134, or considerably more than one-third, happened within the first quarter, only 30 in the second, 61 in the third, and 113 in the fourth. December, with 55 gales, was the stormiest month. There were only six gales in May.

Thunderstorms occurred on 95 days, of which 4 were in the first quarter, 35 in the second, 49 in the third, and 7 in the fourth. July (with 23 storms) and August (with 22) were the months in which electrical disturbances most frequently took place. Only one thunderstorm happened in November, and not even one in February. On 456 occasions the sky was clear, or the amount of cloud was under 20 per cent.; on 937 occasions it was overcast, that is, the amount of cloud exceeded 80 per cent. The fourth quarter was the cloudiest (270 overcast skies), the third quarter was the clearest (88 clear skies).

The *Amount of Cloud* varied from 63 per cent. at 9 A.M. to 54 per cent. at 9 P.M., the average being 58 per cent.

The following are more detailed remarks upon the weather in the different months:—

JANUARY.—The average height of the barometer was 29·890 inches. It varied from 30·249 inches in 1896 to 29·657 inches in 1899—a range of not less than ·592. The average mean temperature was 40·5°. In 1898 the mean dry bulb temperature was 47·4, in 1895 it was 34·6°. The absolute extreme temperatures were—highest, 60·8°, on the 30th, in 1898; lowest, 16·9°, on the 9th, in 1895. The average rainfall was 2·342 inches on 19·6 days; the extremes of rainfall were—maximum, 5·711 inches on 24 days, in 1895; minimum, 0·672 inch, on 14 days in 1891. The absolute maximal fall in 24 hours was 1·802 inches, on the 12th, in 1895. Snow or sleet fell on 46 and hail on 38 days during the ten years. There were two thunderstorms. There were 48 gales. The most prevalent wind was W., which was recorded 198 times out of a total of 620 observations. Next came S.W., with 111 observations. The N.E. and N. winds were the least frequent, with 34 and 26 observations respectively. The average amount of cloud was 63 per cent.—65 at 9 A.M. and 60 at 9 P.M.

FEBRUARY.—The average atmospheric pressure was 29·866 inches, the mean value varying from 30·339 inches in 1891 to 29·480 inches in 1900. The mean pressure, 30·339 inches, observed in 1891, is the highest monthly mean recorded during the ten years. The average mean dry bulb temperature was 41·3°. It ranged from 45·1° in 1897 to 33·6° in 1895. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 61·9°, on the 23rd, in 1891; lowest, 19·0°, on the 7th, in 1895. The average rainfall was 1·669 inches on 15·0 days; the extremes of rainfall were—maximum, 3·156 inches, on 23 days, in 1900; minimum, 0·042 inch, on 2 days, in 1891. The absolute greatest fall in twenty-four hours was 0·576 inch, on the 17th, in 1898. Snow or sleet fell on 42 and hail on 35 days within the ten years. There were 48 gales. The wind blew most frequently from W.—on 169 occasions—least from N. and N.E.; from which points it blew on 15 and 22 occasions respectively. The average amount of cloud was 61 per cent.—66 at 9 A.M. and 55 at 9 P.M.

MARCH.—Average height of the barometer—29·838 inches, the mean ranging from 30·026 inches in 1893 to 29·484 inches in 1897. Average mean dry bulb temperature = 42·5°, varying from 46·5° in 1893 to 37·8° in 1892. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 64·8°, on the 29th, in 1893; lowest, 23·8°, on the 11th, in 1892. The average rainfall was 1·546 inches on 15·4 days; the extremes of rainfall were—largest, 3·310 inches on 23 days in 1896; smallest, 0·288 inch on 8 days in 1893. In 1897 there were 24 rainy days. The absolute maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 0·735 inch, on the 11th, in 1897. Snow or sleet fell on 51 days and hail on 62 days during the ten years. There were 2 thunderstorms and 38 gales. The most prevalent wind was once more W., observed on 183 occasions. The least prevalent winds were S. (36 observations) and S.E. (37 observations). The average amount of cloud was 54 per cent.—58 at 9 A.M. and 50 at 9 P.M.

APRIL.—Average height of the barometer—29·883 inches. The mean ranged from 30·121 inches, in 1896, to 29·737 inches in 1899. Average mean dry bulb temperature—47·7°, varying from 50·3° in 1893, to 45·0° in 1897. The absolute extremes of temperature were—70·7°, on the 21st, in 1900, and 27·3°, on the 15th, in 1892. The average rainfall was 1·732 inches on 15·7 days; the extremes being—greatest, 3·123 inches, on 20 days, in 1894; least, 0·883 inch, on 16 days, in 1896. The absolute maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 0·956 inch, on the 30th, in 1898. Snow or sleet fell on 9 days, hail on 33 days in the ten years. There were 3 thunderstorms and 17 gales. The W. wind was the most prevalent, being observed on 126 occasions. A N. wind was noted on only 43 occasions. The average amount of cloud was 56 per cent.—63 at 9 A.M. and 49 at 9 P.M.

MAY.—The average pressure was 29·937 inches, the mean ranging from 30·251 inches in 1896 to 29·741 inches in 1891. Average mean dry bulb temperature = 51·9°, ranging from 55·3° in 1893 to 49·2° in 1894. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 71·9°, on the 30th, in 1895; lowest, 32·8°, on the 18th, in 1891. The average rainfall was 2·105 inches on 13·6 days. In 1892 no less than 4·177 inches of rain fell on 19 days; in 1895, on the contrary, the fall amounted to only 0·177 inch on 3 days. In 1898 there were 20 rainy days. The absolute maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 2·056 inches, on the 28th, in 1892. Snow or sleet fell on 4 days, hail on 27 days in the ten years. There were 12 thunder-

storms, and 6 gales. W. winds were most frequent, being 113 in number, but were nearly equalled by E. winds, which numbered 112. S. winds occurred on 39 occasions; while N., N.E. and N.W. together made up 239 out of 620 observations. The average amount of cloud was 55 per cent., 61 at 9 A.M. and 49 at 9 P.M.

JUNE.—Average pressure=29.935 inches, the mean varying from 30.027 inches in 1895, to 29.821 inches in 1900. Average mean dry bulb temperature=58.3°, the range being from 60.5° in 1899, to 56.4° in 1894. The absolute extreme temperatures were—maximum, 80.8°, on the 15th, in 1896; minimum, 40.0°, on the 14th, in 1892. The average rainfall was 2.116 inches, on 15.2 days. The greatest monthly fall was 3.257 inches on 20 days in 1897, and the least 1.547 inches on 14 days in 1898. In 1900 there were 22 rainy days, and the total fall was 3.169 inches. The absolute maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 0.903 inch, on the 20th, in 1899. There was no snow or sleet, but hail was noted on 12 days. There were seven gales. Thunderstorms occurred on 20 occasions. The wind blew from W. on 113 occasions; from E. on 101. The average amount of cloud was 56 per cent.—60 at 9 A.M. and 52 at 9 P.M.

JULY.—Average height of barometer=29.920 inches. Mean ranging from 30.088 inches in 1898 to 29.780 inches in 1895. Average mean dry bulb temperature=59.7°, varying from 62.2° in 1900 to 57.2° in 1892. The absolute extreme temperatures were—highest, 78.0° on the 24th in 1900; lowest, 44.9° on the 4th, in 1898. The average rainfall was 3.017 inches on 14.3 days. The heaviest rainfall was 5.474 inches on 18 days in 1896; the slightest was 0.945 inch on 8 days in 1898. The maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 2.020 inches on the 24th, in 1896. Neither snow nor sleet occurred. Hail fell on 6 days. There were 23 thunderstorms and 12 gales. The most prevalent wind was W., observed 161 out of 620 times. The least frequent wind was S. (33 observations). Average amount of cloud=64 per cent.—70 at 9 A.M. and 59 at 9 P.M.

AUGUST.—Average atmospheric pressure=29.848 inches, the mean ranging from 30.016 inches in 1896 to 29.652 inches in 1897. Average mean dry bulb temperature, 59.0°—in 1899, 62.2°; in 1894, 56.9°. The extremes of temperature were—maximum, 79.8° on the 15th in 1893; minimum, 43.0° on the 10th in 1892. The average rainfall was 3.653 inches on 19.5 days. The maximal rainfall was 5.871 inches on 17 days in 1900; the minimal fall was 1.136 inches on 18 days in 1896. The fall of 5.871 inches exceeded that of any other month in the ten years. Rain was measured on 27 days in 1895, but on only 10 days in 1899. The heaviest rainfall within twenty-four hours was 2.227 inches on the 5th in 1899. There was no snow or sleet. Hail fell on only 4 days. There were 22 thunderstorms and 23 gales. The most frequent wind was W. (166 observations); the least so was S.E. (30 observations). The average percentage of cloud was 61—that at 9 A.M. was 66, and that at 9 P.M. 55.

SEPTEMBER.—The average height of the barometer was 29.908 inches, the mean ranging from 30.155 inches in 1894 to 29.650 inches in 1896. The average mean dry bulb temperature was 55.2. In 1898 it was 58.7°; in 1894 it fell to 52.9°. The absolute extreme temperatures were—highest, 77.8° on the 6th in 1898; lowest, 38.2° on the 21st in 1893. The average rainfall was 1.925 inches on 14.9 days. In 1896 the fall amounted to 5.073 inches on 23 days but in 1894 it was only 0.442 inches on 8 days. The maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 1.166 inches on the 1st in 1897. There was neither snow nor sleet, and hail fell on only 6 days. There were 4 thunderstorms and 26 gales. The W. wind as usual chiefly prevailed, being noted on 173 occasions. The least frequent wind was N.E. (30 observations). The average cloudiness was 51 per cent.—57 at 9 A.M. and 45 at 9 P.M.

OCTOBER.—The average barometrical height was 29.797 inches; the annual mean pressure varying from 30.038 inches in 1897 to 29.569 inches in 1891. The average mean dry bulb temperature was 47.9°; in 1898 it was 51.7°; in 1896 it fell to 43.8°. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 67.7° on the 21st, in 1893; lowest, 28.3° on the 26th, in 1892. The average rainfall was 2.718 inches on 16.9 days. In 1894 the rainfall amounted to 3.967 inches on 20 days; in 1893 1.033 inches fell on 16 days. The maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 1.176 inches on the 13th, in 1891. Snow or sleet fell on 7 days. Hail occurred on 25 days, of which 7 were in 1892. There were 4 thunderstorms and 27 gales. The wind blew most frequently from W. (on 173 occasions); least so from N. (on only 32 occasions). The average amount of cloud was 54 per cent.—at 9 A.M., 57, and at 9 P.M., 50.

NOVEMBER.—Average height of barometer=29.863 inches, the mean ranging from 30.097 in 1896 to 29.639 inches in 1900. The average mean dry bulb temperature was 45.5°. It rose to 49.6° in 1899, and fell to 42.3° in 1896. The absolute extremes of temperature were—highest, 64.9° on the 4th in 1899; lowest, 26.2° on the 6th in 1896. The average rainfall was 2.761 inches on 15.9 days. The fall ranged from 4.873 inches on 19 days in 1900 to 0.664 inches on 9 days in 1896. The maximal fall in twenty-four hours was 1.732 inches on the 23rd, in 1898. Snow or sleet fell on 10 days in the 10 years, and hail on 12 days. There were 31 gales and 1 thunderstorm. The W. wind was most prevalent (153 observations out of 600); the N.E. wind was least prevalent (21 observations). The average cloudiness was 63 per cent.; at 9 A.M., 64, and at 9 P.M., 61.

DECEMBER.—The average height of the barometer was 29.767 inches, the mean varying from 29.921 inches in 1894 to 29.642 inches in 1896. The average mean temperature was 42.7°; in 1898 it was 47.0°; in 1892 it fell to 38.9°. The absolute extremes of temperature were—maximum, 61.0° on the 6th, in 1899; minimum, 21.9° on the 27th and 28th, in 1892. The average rainfall was 2.401 inches on 19.8 days. It varied from 4.185 inches on 20 days

in 1896, to 0.795 inch on only 10 days in 1892. The absolute heaviest fall in twenty-four hours was 1.388 inch on the 8th in 1896. Snow or sleet fell on 18 days; hail on 15. Two thunderstorms occurred. There were 55 gales. A vast preponderance of W. and S.W. winds was noted—206 observations of W. and 133 of S.W., together giving 339 out of a total of 620 observations, that is, considerably more than one-half. In marked contrast, the N.E. wind was observed on 5 occasions; the N. on only 14. The average quantity of cloud was 61 per cent.—64 at 9 A.M. and 58 at 9 P.M.

In closing this Report for the Decennium 1891-1900, I desire to express my obligations to Doctor Ninian M. Falkiner, Medical Superintendent of Statistics in this Department, for the valuable aid he has given me in its preparation, especially with respect to that portion which deals with the Statistics of Diseases and Causes of Death.

1832 to 1841—By adopting the rate of increase between the population of 1831 and 1841 according to the Irish Census Report of 1841.

1842 to 1846—By taking the English average birth-rate of 1 in 31, and death-rate of 1 in 45, and deducting the annual emigration from Ireland according to the returns received from the Emigration Commissioners in England.

1847 to 1851—The English birth-rate, as above, was used, deducting the number of deaths and the number of emigrants in each year, as given in the Irish Census Reports of 1851; an allowance, proportioned to the number of recorded deaths and the number of emigrants being made in each year for the excess of the number thus arrived at for 1851 over the actual population according to the Census of that year.

1852 to 1871—The English birth and death rates, as above, were used, deducting the number of emigrants according to the returns obtained by the Registrar-General for Ireland, and allowing for excess over census numbers for 1861 and 1871 as explained for the last period.

1872-1900—By adding the Births registered in each year to the estimated population for the previous year, deducting the deaths and the number of emigrants, and adjusting the results for the years 1872-81, 1882-91, and 1892-1900, to allow for the discrepancy between the number thus arrived at for 1881, 1891, and 1900 respectively, and the estimates based on the Censuses taken in 1881, 1891, and 1901.
