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PREFACE.

This volume has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 (1) of the Census Act (Northern Ireland), 1925. The 1926 Census statistics which it contains were compiled from the returns made as at midnight of the 18-19th April, 1926: they supersede those in the Preliminary Report published in August, 1926, and may be regarded as final.

The Census publications will consist of:—

1. SEVEN COUNTY VOLUMES, each similar in design and scope to the present publication.
2. A GENERAL REPORT relating to Northern Ireland as a whole, covering in more detail the statistics shown in the County Volumes, and containing in addition tables showing
 - (i.) the occupational distribution of persons engaged in each of 51 groups of industries;
 - (ii.) the distribution of the foreign born population by nationality, age, marital condition, and occupation;
 - (iii.) the distribution of families of dependent children under 16 years of age, by age, sex, marital condition, and occupation of parent;
 - (iv.) the occupational distribution of persons suffering from infirmities.
3. A TOPOGRAPHICAL INDEX, dealing in separate alphabetical sections with each type of area for which statistics are published in the County series. The particulars given for each territorial unit include references to the 6" Ordnance Survey maps and to Tables 3, 4, or 5 of the relative County Volume.

The net prices for the above publications will be 5s. 0d. for each County Volume and 10s. 0d. each for the General Report and the Topographical Index. A complete set of these volumes may be obtained directly from the Superintendent, H.M. The Registrar-General is empowered by Section 6 (2) of the Census Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, to prepare and supply from the Census returns, statistics other than those published in the Census Reports at the request and cost of any local authority or person. Any special demands for statistics more detailed than those published (either as regards subject matter or area) can thus, as far as office records permit, be satisfied. Requests for special compilation of Census statistics should be addressed to the Registrar-General, who will be pleased to advise and furnish an estimate of cost.

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PART I.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS OF TERMS USED IN THIS VOLUME.

AREA.

The acreages given are as measured by the Ordnance Survey of 1899—1907. They exclude—

In Tables 1, 3-5 (a) fore-shore and unnamed islands of less than one rood in extent.

(b) Carlingford and Strangford Loughs.

In Tables 3-5 (c) the larger rivers, lakes, and tideways.

N.B.—While the larger rivers, lakes, and tideways are not enclosed within townland boundaries, they form part of administrative areas. The extent of these excluded portions is shown for the county, county districts, and poor law unions in foot-notes to the appropriate tables.

POPULATION.

The population comprises all persons, including Forces of the Crown, enumerated as at midnight of Sunday the 18th-19th April, 1926, together with those who, not having been enumerated elsewhere, arrived in port or were received into any dwelling on the morning of the 19th April before the Census returns were collected.

The population assigned to each area is that actually present (as defined above) within it, whether as permanent residents or temporary visitors, persons in port but on ship board being classified to the adjacent area.

In general these definitions apply to the population as enumerated at previous censuses, and shown in Table 2.

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISIONS.

The County is divided into eighteen county districts (ten urban and eight rural), comprising 146 district electoral divisions, twenty-two of which are situate in urban districts (see Table 3). Of this latter group seventeen are coterminous with wards bearing the same name, and one is divided into two wards.

Eight poor law unions are contained within the county—three wholly and five partly; the remaining portions of the divided unions being situate in Antrim County, Armagh County, and Belfast County Borough. The medical dispensary districts situate in the County number thirty-six (see Table 4). Poor law unions and medical dispensary districts are, respectively, superintendent registrars' and registrars' districts for the registration of marriages, births, and deaths.

The County is also divided into twenty county electoral divisions (see Table 5); and forms a single regional education area (see Table 12).

Apart from the reconstitution of county electoral divisions and district electoral divisions in 1923, the changes which have taken place in the boundaries of administrative divisions since 1911 are as follows:—

(a) Newcastle Urban District divided into two wards (6th November, 1922).

(b) Warrenpoint Urban District divided into two wards (9th November, 1922).

(c) Wards in Newry Urban District reconstituted (13th November, 1922).

- (d) Portion of Downpatrick Rural District and Union transferred to Newtownards Rural District and Union (1st April, 1924.)
- (e) Portion of Newtownards Rural District transferred to Bangor Urban District (1st June, 1924).
- (f) Wards and District Electoral Divisions in Bangor Urban District altered consequent on the extension of the Urban District (1st and 20th June, 1924, respectively).
- (g) Downpatrick, formerly a town under the Towns Improvement (I.) Act, 1854, and forming part of Downpatrick Rural District, created an urban district (1st April, 1925).

PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCY.

The present parliamentary constituency was created by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and comprises the administrative county of Down.

HOUSES.

1. The term "House" denotes
 - (a) each structure (except institutions) which stands alone or is separated from another by a vertical party wall; and which is used or intended partly or wholly for habitation;
 - (b) each institution (viz., hospital, sanatorium, nursing home, infirmary, workhouse, asylum, religious or charitable community, residential school or college, barracks or other premises under Naval, Military, Air Force, or Police discipline, prison or other place of detention), regardless of the number of buildings within its precincts;
 - (c) each vessel, caravan, tent, or other movable dwelling.

The 1911 figures for "Houses" do not include vessels, and each separate building within the precincts of an institution was at that Census regarded as a separate "House."

2. The terms "Boarding-House" and "Lodging-House" denote, in addition to habitations so described, any private house containing three or more boarders or lodgers.

3. The term "Private House" denotes all habitations other than
 - (a) dwellings within the precincts of an institution;
 - (b) hotels, boarding-houses, and other such communal dwellings;
 - (c) premises in which three or more boarders, lodgers, or trade assistants reside;
 - (d) residences occupied by virtue of the tenant's employment, (except rectories and manses, and dwellings belonging to but detached from domestic establishments);
 - (e) premises occupied by caretakers;
 - (f) ships, caravans, tents, and other movable dwellings;
 - (g) barns, stables, and out-houses occupied on Census night.

The term includes dwellings over shops except when these are occupied as described at (c) and (d) above.

4. The term "Inhabited" denotes actual residence of a person or persons, on Census night. "Uninhabited" houses, therefore, include those temporarily vacant through the absence of the usual occupiers as well as those without tenants. Enumerators were instructed to omit from their enumeration empty houses in such an advanced state of decay that there was little likelihood that they would again be made fit for habitation. In this matter they were required to use their own judgment.

ROOMS.

1. The rooms enumerated are the usual living rooms, including bedrooms and kitchens, but excluding sculleries (i.e., rooms used *only* for washing, cleaning, or cooking), pantries, cloakrooms, landings, closets or bathrooms, or any warehouse, office or shop rooms.

2. For the purpose of classifying families by rooms occupied (Table 8), shared-room occupations—i.e., those in which two or more families have rooms in common,—have been rounded up to the next integral number of rooms. Thus, three families occupying $1\frac{1}{3}$, $2\frac{1}{3}$, and $2\frac{1}{3}$ rooms in a 6-roomed house would be shown as occupying 2, 3, and 3 rooms respectively. The extent of the rounding-up process may be ascertained in a general way by reference to Table 7, in which the actual number of rooms is given. Generally, in cases of 1 room occupations, all persons living therein, whether related or not, have been enumerated as one Census family.

FAMILIES.

1. The term "Family" denotes
 - (a) The inhabitants of each institution (see 1 (b) of "Houses" definition), hotel, boarding-house, lodging-house, or ship.
 - (b) Each person or group of persons occupying separately the whole, or part of, any dwelling other than as described at (a).

In 1911 the inhabitants of premises described at (a) above were in certain cases enumerated as two or more families.

2. "Private Families" mean all families enumerated in "Private Houses" (see 3 of "Houses" definition).

RATEABLE VALUATION.

The figures shown are those for service of the year ended 31st March, 1927, and have been supplied by the Commissioner of Valuation. Rateable hereditaments include lands, buildings, tolls, railways, tram-roads, canals, fisheries, turbaries, mines, quarries, waterworks, telegraphs, and telephones. The figures throughout exclude the valuation of gas, water, and electric mains, telegraphs, telephones, fisheries, rights of taking seaweed, and (in some cases) gasworks and waterworks; the amounts concerned being aggregated and shown for the county, county districts, and poor law unions in footnotes to the appropriate tables.

EDUCATION.

The classification under educational establishments (which was assisted by reference to lists supplied for Census purposes by the Ministry of Education) is as follows:—

1. **PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.** Day and evening pupils are grouped together in this class, the question on the Census schedule not requiring a separation as between day and evening in respect of pupils attending public elementary schools.
2. **SECONDARY SCHOOLS,** including preparatory departments and preparatory schools. This heading relates to day pupils only, and the schools are limited to those recognised by the Ministry of Education.
3. **TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.** The day pupils shown in this group comprise those stated to be attending junior technical schools, day commercial classes, and day classes for domestic economy and manual instruction which were being held at certain centres in April, 1926. The evening pupils comprise those stated to be attending technical schools or classes in the evening.

4. OTHER EDUCATIONAL ESTABLISHMENTS (Day and Evening). These include secondary schools not recognised by the Ministry of Education, universities, training colleges for teachers, agricultural schools, commercial schools, home or private tuition, etc.

OCCUPATIONS.

The occupational classification is based on that used in the Reports on the Census of England and Wales, 1921.*

It will be seen that there are thirty-two orders. Each of these covers the same occupational ground as the England and Wales orders. Eleven of the orders are divided into thirty-two sub-orders, each of which is comparable with the corresponding England and Wales sub-order, with the following exceptions:—

Within the sub-orders are 341 occupational headings, evolved by processes both of grouping and expansion from the England and Wales headings, which number 611.

INDUSTRIES.

The industrial classification is based on that used in the Reports on the Census of England and Wales, 1921.*

It will be seen that there are twenty-two orders. Each of these cover the same industrial ground as the England and Wales orders. Nine of the orders are divided into thirty-eight sub-orders, each of which is comparable with the corresponding England and Wales sub-order, with the following exceptions:—

Within the sub-orders are 226 industrial headings, evolved by processes both of grouping and expansion from the England and Wales headings, which number 477. The industry table contained in this volume shows figures for orders and sub-orders only.

BIRTHPLACES.

Persons stated to have been born in Ireland—the County name or “Irish Free State” not being inserted—are assumed to have been born in the Irish Free State. Where nationality is given but birthplace is not, it has been assumed that the person was born in the country of which he or she is a national. All persons of British nationality and unstated birthplace have been regarded as born in the County of enumeration.

RELIGIOUS PROFESSIONS.

The religious professions, other than Roman Catholic, Presbyterian, Church of Ireland, and Methodist, have been classified under the headings set out at foot of Table 18, separate mention being made of all professions containing 10 or more

adherents. The heading "Presbyterian" includes those who call themselves by this name without qualification, together with those returned as members of the Established Church of Scotland. Other Presbyterian denominations are shown at the foot of the table. Members of the Church of England and the Episcopal Church of Scotland have not been included under Church of Ireland except where stated. The latter group includes all persons returned as "Church" or "Episcopalian."

ORPHANHOOD.

In compiling statistics under this head, step-parents, foster-parents, and adoptive parents, so stated, have been treated in the same manner as natural parents. Where the information as to one parent is stated as "not known," that parent has been assumed to be dead and the case dealt with accordingly. Where information as to neither parent is given, the case has been placed in the "No Statement" group.

INFIRMITIES.

1. DEAF AND DUMB, DUMB, BLIND. The figures given are in respect of persons so returned, except where the answers indicate only partial infirmity as "nearly blind."

2. CRIPPLED. In addition to those persons specifically described as "Crippled," the figures given include all cases in which it is clearly indicated that the person

(a) has suffered a total permanent loss of the use of arm, hand, leg, or foot ;

(b) is permanently crippled in such a degree as to prevent the free pursuit of most ordinary occupations.

The following cases, treated as "Crippled," indicate the variety of the terms used in answering the question on the Census schedule :—

Arm—deformed, disabled ; hand—deformed ; hip joint disease ; knee—decayed, tubercular arthritis in ; leg—disabled, diseased bone in, infirm, short ; on crutch ; paralysis—infantile, nervous, of arms and side, of legs and back, of spine ; rheumatoid arthritis ; spinal caries ; unable to walk.

3. MENTALLY AFFLICTED. All cases returned, whatever the degree of affliction, are included in the tables. The following terms were used in the returns :—

Afflicted ; feeble minded ; imbecile ; melancholia ; mental debility ; simple ; weak intellect.

4. Persons suffering from more than one infirmity have been classified to that which appears most likely to constitute the greater, or greatest, disability, infirmities being graded for this purpose from greatest to least, thus :—

Mentally afflicted ; blind ; crippled ; deaf and dumb ; dumb.

SPELLING OF PLACE NAMES.

The spelling of place names follows that in the 1911 Census volumes, except that corrections have been made to secure agreement with the spelling on the Ordnance Survey maps where differences were revealed in the course of the work. The spelling now may be regarded as generally following that adopted by the Ordnance Survey Department.

CONVENTION AS TO DOTS (.) AND DASHES (—).

Throughout this volume dots (.) are used in tabular matter to indicate nil (0), and dashes (—) are used to indicate that information cannot or is not intended to be given.

CORRECTION OF CENSUS DATA.

Every effort has been made to eliminate, as far as practicable, errors and inaccuracies from the Census data. The process of correction began with the Enumerators, who received full instructions as to the action to be taken in cases of error or omission; it was continued by a system of check applied at each stage of the office work; and was completed by an intensive scrutiny and inter-comparison of the tabulation sheets. This scrutiny and comparison revealed a certain number of incongruities, which, when material, were investigated and corrected in the light of the facts disclosed. Errors of a minor nature (i.e., such as could not affect the statistical value of the Census Tables) were adjusted more or less arbitrarily.

PART II.

STATISTICAL NOTES.

The definitions, etc, contained in Part I of this volume apply with equal force to the contents of these notes and to the tables contained in Part III. Roman numerals are used in this volume for the tables in Part II, and Arabic numerals for the tables in Part III.

AREA.

The area of Down County, exclusive of the larger rivers, lakes, and tideways, is 951 square miles, or 18.2 per cent. of the area of Northern Ireland. In 1896 and 1899 the County lost an aggregate of almost five square miles to Belfast County Borough and Antrim County, but gained in the latter year over half a square mile from Armagh County (see note to Table 2).

POPULATION.

The population numbers 209,228 persons, or 2.4 per cent. more than in 1911. The actual increase amounts to 4,925 persons, and is the first recorded since 1841. (Figures for the earlier periods are shown in Table 2).

(a) Owing to the fact that prior to 1899 certain registration units in Belfast Union extended over both the urban and rural portions thereof, it is not practicable to show figures in this table for periods prior to 1901.

(b) Including the deaths of non-civilians of the County of Down which occurred outside Northern Ireland. It has not been found possible to estimate the number of these deaths at all closely, but from the War mortality lists of soldiers from Ireland, which were compiled by the War Office from regimental records, it appears that for the *whole* of Northern Ireland the non-civilian deaths which occurred outside the country numbered about 10,000 during the last intercensal period, exclusive of the deaths of regular soldiers stationed outside the country at the date of the 1911 Census.

While comparable figures of excess of births over deaths are not available for periods prior to 1901 (see foot-note (a) to Table I), it is evident that the actual net outward movement during the period 1841-1901 was much greater than the recorded decrease in population. Statistics as to the size and direction of the emigration stream are lacking, but there can be no doubt that the rapid growth of Belfast has been assisted to a considerable degree by population gains from the County.

From Table II it will be seen that urban districts as a whole have increased in population during the past 15 years, while rural districts as a whole have decreased—the trend in each aggregate following that exhibited in the preceding intercensal period. The 1926 urban population constitutes 27.5 per cent. of the whole, as against 22.9 per cent. in 1911, and 19.6 per cent. in 1901—the percentages quoted relating to urban areas as constituted at the date of each census,

All urban districts on the coast have increased considerably in population since 1911, the gain in Bangor—65.3 per cent.—being specially noteworthy. Castlereagh, adjoining Belfast County Borough, is the only rural district for which a considerable increase is recorded.

The persons per acre rates vary in the urban districts between 21.3 in Newtownards and 1.7 in Newcastle. Such rates, however, should be used with reserve in measuring the degree of population density in urban areas, since the acreages of these may include widely differing proportions of waste land, land under pasture, etc. In rural districts the rates vary between 0.6 and 0.2 persons per acre.

Tables 3, 4, and 5 provide more detailed information regarding the population in the various sub-divisions of the County, and incorporate figures of rateable valuation. The rateable valuation has increased from £841,377 to £893,941 over the past fifteen years, an increase of 6.2 per cent. as compared with the 2.4 per cent. increase in population.

Parliamentary Constituency.—In considering the percentages shown in Table III, regard should be given to the qualifications entitling a person to be registered as an elector. In general, a man is qualified if 21 years of age or upwards, with the requisite residence or business premises qualification: a woman, if 30 years of age or upwards, and if (1) entitled to be registered as a local government elector in respect of the occupation of land or premises (not being a dwelling-house) of a yearly value of not less than £5, or of a dwelling-house; or (2) the wife of a husband entitled to be so registered.

It may be noted that a person may be registered as a parliamentary elector in a constituency although not resident therein.

The question of the comparison of the number of parliamentary electors with population will be dealt with more fully in the General Report.

BUILDINGS, ROOMS, AND FAMILIES.

Houses.—While there are differences in the definitions of the term “House” as used in 1911 and 1926, they do not affect to any appreciable extent the comparisons shown in the following table. The houses dealt with in this table embrace all types of buildings, etc. Tables 6 and 9 deal respectively with private houses and each of the other types of inhabited buildings, etc.

While the total number of houses in the County decreased by 0.8 per cent., the number of inhabited houses increased by 2.6 per cent.—this being due to a considerable reduction in the number of uninhabited houses, the 1926 figure for which is the smallest recorded since 1871. The percentage increase in inhabited houses, by a figure practically equal to that in population (2.4 per cent.), indicates that housing conditions in the County as a whole have undergone little or no change since 1911. Further reference to this matter is made in the comment on Table V. below.

The number of houses under construction was the highest recorded since 1831, and roughly double that in 1911.

Persons per Inhabited House and Persons per Family.—The average number both of persons per inhabited house and persons per family declined steadily from 1851 to 1911. A further slight fall in the latter figure was registered in 1926, but

the former figure remained unchanged. In this connection it should be noted that by "family" is meant Census family, which it will be seen from the definition on page viii, differs from the natural family of parents and children.

With regard to the habitation of houses by more than one family, there has been little change during the past half century, the number of families per 100 inhabited houses at each Census enumeration from 1871 to 1926 being as follows: 104, 102, 101, 101, 101, 101.

Housing in County Districts.—Table V shows that there has been a decrease in the total number of houses in ten county districts, and an increase in eight county districts. Generally speaking, the decreases occur in urban districts inland and rural districts remote from Belfast: the increases in urban districts on the coast and rural districts in the vicinity of Belfast. Comparison of this Table with Table II also shows that since 1911 the proportion of inhabited houses to population has increased in all county districts but Warrenpoint Urban and Downpatrick, Hillsborough, and Newry No. 1 Rural, where the process has been reversed. The improvement of housing conditions in Bangor Urban and Castlereagh Rural is specially noteworthy, in view of the very large population increases in those districts.

The extent of sub-letting in the county districts is best indicated by the factor "number of private families per inhabited private house," which is readily obtainable from the figures of house accommodation contained in Table 7. It will be seen that the number of families per 100 houses is 101 for the County, and that (except in Hollywood Urban and Newry Urban) there is little variation from this average throughout the various county districts. 98 per cent. of the families in the County occupy a whole house each.

Of all the inhabited private houses in the County 99 per cent. are occupied by single families and 38 per cent. contain 4 to 5 rooms.

Accommodation of Families and Persons.—The occupied room accommodation in the County approximates to one room per person, the variation from this average ranging between 1.55 in Bangor Urban District, and 0.91 in Kilkeel and Newry No. 1 Rural Districts. Generally speaking, in urban districts room accom-

modation is above the mean, in rural districts below it. A detailed analysis of the room accommodation, coupled with the size of family, etc., appears in Table 8. Of the total families in the County, 25 per cent. occupy 4 rooms each, the family of 2 occurs most frequently, and the most common combination consists of families of 4, each family occupying 4 rooms.

Table VII, in conjunction with Table 8, will enable comparisons to be made between the density of occupation in each county district. In these tables the density of 2 persons and less per room has not been sub-divided, but this is not intended to imply any judgment as to what in fact constitutes adequate accommodation, since this matter obviously could not be determined without a knowledge of other factors, such as size of rooms, sanitary and water provision, etc. Sub-divisions other than those set out in summary form can readily be calculated from the details given in the first nine columns of Table 8.

In the County almost 17 per cent. of the private family population occupy premises at a density of more than 2 persons per room. The average density of occupation in urban districts as a whole is appreciably less than that in rural districts as whole; and the distribution of the urban and rural population over the various densities exhibits marked differences, the proportion of the private family population occupying premises at a density of more than 2 persons per room being 11.2 per cent in the urban districts as against 19.0 per cent. in the rural districts. The greatest density of occupation is found in Kilkeel Rural District, where 25.9 per cent. of the private family population are housed at a density of more than 2 persons per room.

INSTITUTIONS, ETC.

The population in each of the types of inhabited buildings, etc., other than private houses, is shown in Tables 9 and 10, together with the number of inmates in respect of institutions. The institutions are not individually identified as in 1911, but the number of institutions in each category is given. The inmates of Poor Law Institutions number 332 as against 557 at the date of the 1911 Census. Persons on shipboard number 93 as against 143 in 1911. "Other premises" include police and military barracks, residential schools, premises occupied by caretakers, etc.

SEXES, AGES, AND MARITAL CONDITIONS.

Table 11 shows the distribution of the population of the County by sex, age, and marital condition. The following tables summarise the position in 1926 and the changes in the last intercensal period.

Excess of Females over Males.—Table 2 shows that the number of females per 1,000 males has steadily decreased from 1,127 in 1891 to 1,067 in 1926. More boys are born than girls, but, as Table 11 shows, the excess of males over females gradually decreases with increase in age until from about age 25 onwards the females are the more numerous.

Distribution according to age.—The increase of 2.4 per cent. in the total population is the net result of increases in age groups 0-4, 15-29, 40-69, 80-89, and 95 and over; and decreases in age groups 5-14, 30-39, 70-79, and 90-94. Materials for an analysis of the manner in which variations in the numbers of births and deaths from year to year, the number of war deaths, and the movement of population have combined to produce these changes in age distribution are not available: the effect has been to raise the average age of the population from approximately 30.3 years in 1911 to 30.7 years at the present time.

Distribution by Marital Condition.—Table XII shows the percentage variation in the male and female populations of each marital condition since 1911. It will be noted that the married persons have increased at a greater rate, and the single males at a lesser rate, than the population as a whole; while the single females and widowed persons have actually decreased.

EDUCATION.

From Table 12 it will be seen that of the total population in the County 19.1 per cent. of the males and 17.4 per cent. of the females are attending educational establishments.

Of the children aged 6 to 13 inclusive, 3.1 per cent. of boys and 3.7 per cent. of girls are not stated to be attending school.

At ages 15 to 19 inclusive, the persons still attending various kinds of educational establishments represent 11.8 per cent. of the males and 15.2 per cent. of the females.

In endeavouring to draw conclusions from this table it will be necessary to treat the Census figures relating to persons attending technical schools with considerable reserve, pending further investigation, since a marked difference has been found to exist between them and figures of pupils enrolled in technical schools as published by the Ministry of Education. Further reference to this matter will be made in the General Report on the Census relating to Northern Ireland as a whole.

OCCUPATIONS.

Proportion Occupied.—From Table XIII it will be seen that both for males and females the percentage of the total population occupied is a little higher than in 1911. In 1926, 44 per cent. of the population of both sexes and all ages were occupied, and thus normally were wage earners. It should be noted that both employed and out-of-work persons are included in the term “occupied.” Of the males aged 12 years and over, the proportion occupied shows a slight decrease; of the females, a slight increase.

Numerically important Occupations.—When considering the grouping of occupations into orders and sub-orders it should be remembered that this grouping disregards the industries in which the persons may be engaged. For example, the occupational order XXII (Transport Workers) includes porters, messengers, carmen, etc., irrespective of industry, but excludes clerks, carpenters, navvies, etc., employed in the transport service. The latter occupations are included under occupational orders XXVIII, XV, XVII, etc., respectively.

From Table XV it will be seen that about 41 per cent. of the occupied males appear under the main group or order II, Agricultural Occupations. This order contains nearly five times as many persons as the next in point of size—XXIII Commerce, Finance and Insurance. The Occupations of most numerical importance among the males are: Farmers; Agricultural Labourers; and Farmers' Relatives assisting in the work of the farm.

Of the occupied females almost 68 per cent. are included under the Orders XXVII, Personal Service; XII, Textile Workers; and XIII, Makers of Textile Goods and Articles of Dress, the most important occupations numerically being Domestic Servants; Sewers and Stitchers; and Farmers.

Table 13 shows the number of each sex included under each heading of the full occupational classification.

Occupational Status and National Health Insurance.—A consideration of the percentages in the following table, which has been compiled from Table 14, shows that of the occupied males nearly 1 in 4 are either employers or workers on own account, the proportion for occupied females being 1 in 7. Of the employees, apprentices, and out of work taken together, those who were returned as out of work at the date of the Census represent 12 per cent. in the case of males and 8 per cent. in the case of females.

Of all the occupied population 42.3 per cent. of the males and 57.6 per cent. of the females are returned as being entitled to benefits under the National Health Insurance Acts. For employers and workers on own account of all ages, taken together, the percentages are 1.9 per cent. of the males and 1.6 per cent. of the females; and for employees, apprentices, and out of work, taken together, they are 57.7 per cent. of the males and 67.0 per cent. of the females.

Of the unoccupied, including retired, 3.4 per cent. of the males and 1.5 per cent. of the females are returned as entitled to benefits.

INDUSTRIES.

Industrial Distribution of Occupied Population.—The distribution over main groups of industries is shown in the following table.

Fishing and Agriculture, and the Manufacturing Industries (using that term in a wide sense), each directly provide a livelihood for 32 per cent. of the occupied population. Commerce and Finance (which includes the wholesale and retail distributive trades, banking, and insurance) provides for 11 per cent.; and Personal Service (which includes service in hotels, restaurants, etc.) for 10 per cent. The main manufacturing industry is that of Textiles, which provides for 18 per cent. of the occupied population.

The males outnumber the females in all the groups, except the Professions, where the females are slightly in excess, and Personal Service, where the females are nearly three times as numerous as the males.

Table 16 shows the industrial distribution of the occupied population in greater detail, separate figures being given for each industrial order and sub-order.

BIRTHPLACES.

Table 17 shows, by sex, the numbers of persons born in each of the counties of Northern Ireland, other countries in the British Isles, overseas Dominions, foreign countries, and at sea. Of the total population of Down County, 76.3 per cent. were born within the county, 7.0 per cent. in Belfast County Borough, and 7.4 per cent. in the other five counties of Northern Ireland. Only 0.65 per cent. were born outside the British Isles, and nearly one half of these were born in British Dominions and Colonies. Persons born in foreign countries numbered only 748, and 13 persons were born at sea.

From Table XVIII it will be seen that the proportion of the population born in Ireland, which now stands at 94.6 per cent., has decreased slightly from census to census since 1861, while the proportions for other parts of the British Isles and abroad each show a gradual increase.

RELIGIOUS PROFESSIONS.

It will be seen from Table XIX that Roman Catholics have decreased in number since 1911, while all other denominations have increased. The greatest absolute increase occurred amongst Protestant Episcopalians, and the greatest relative increase amongst Methodists.

ORPHANHOOD.

Table 19 shows that, of the 62,867 children enumerated in the County at ages under 16, 6,692 have lost one or both parents. This figure excludes cases of orphaned children whose loss has been supplied by step-parents or adoptive parents, and 293 cases in which no statement as to parents was secured. Of the 6,692 orphans, 56 per cent. are fatherless and 37 per cent. are motherless, the remaining 7 per cent. being orphaned by the death of both parents. The high proportion of fatherless to motherless orphans is in part a corollary of the high proportion of widows to widowers, though to some extent it may be due to a possible tendency to regard the fathers of illegitimate children as dead if their whereabouts are unknown.

INFIRMITIES.

The number of persons returned as both Deaf and Dumb is 56, or 28 less than the number returned in 1911. The Dumb Only numbered 20, which compares with 32 in 1911.

The number returned as Blind has increased from 148 in 1911 to 208 in 1926.

The total number of persons who have been classified as Crippled is 792, comprising 488 males and 304 females. It has not been found possible to test the reliability of this figure, and it should be accepted with due reserve, both on account of the broad interpretation, which necessarily had to be placed on the term "crippled" for classification purposes, and because of a possible reluctance on the part of some crippled persons to disclose their infirmity by stating it on the census schedule.

Of the 2,085 persons returned as mentally afflicted 1,814 were enumerated in Asylums and 14 in other institutions. In 1911 the persons returned as Lunatic or Idiot numbered 1,319, of whom 1,151 were enumerated in Asylums.
