SIR,

I have the honour to submit the Sixth Annual Report on the Marriages, Births and Deaths registered in Northern Ireland during the year 1927, together with Abstracts of the numbers of such registrations. The Report draws attention to the salient features of the Abstracts; figures relating to previous years are included for purposes of comparison, and information is given relating to migration, the weather and vaccination.

The Abstracts of Marriages, Births and Deaths have been prepared for presentation to Parliament pursuant to the provisions of Statutes governing the systems of registration.

In this Report, as in those of 1924, 1925 and 1926, the smallest units of the country for which statistics of births and deaths are given are the Sanitary Districts, *i.e.*, the County Boroughs, Urban Districts, and Rural Districts; and births and deaths have been allocated to the district of normal residence. Thus, births have been assigned to the Sanitary Districts containing the usual residences of the parents, and deaths to the Sanitary Districts containing the usual residences of the deceased persons. As in the three previous Reports, statistics of marriages are not given for areas smaller than Counties.

In the next Annual Report it is intended to show death rates adjusted for sex and age distribution of the population according to the Census of 1926, the final reports on which will shortly all be published. This will enable more accurate comparisons to be made between certain areas in the country and with other parts of the British Isles, etc. In the meantime the death rates given in this Report, as in previous Reports, must be regarded as subject to the limitations which necessarily attach to crude rates.

Estimates of the population of Northern Ireland, made for the purposes of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports, are based upon the population figure as ascertained at the last preceding Census, and the numbers of births and deaths registered in the meantime, adjustments being made for migration and movements of military. The returns of migration now used for the purposes of these estimates are those published by the Board of Trade, London, which give the numbers of British migrants between Northern Ireland and non-European countries. No figures are available showing the movement between Northern Ireland on the one hand, and Great Britain, the Irish Free State, and other European countries on the other, and consequently no account can be taken of this movement in estimating the population of Northern Ireland.

Estimates of the population as at the middle of each of the years 1911 to 1927 arrived at as above described are shown in Abstract XI, and the rates in this Report for the country as a whole have been based upon these estimates. As regards divisions of the country however, no estimates have been made, the 1926 Census figures being given in Abstracts I and VIII and the rates in Table 9 being based upon these figures.

GENERAL SUMMARY.

The latest enumerated population of Northern Ireland, obtained from the Census of 1926, is 1,256,561. The estimated population in the middle of 1927 is 1,251,000, including military.

The results of the year's registration show that the marriage, birth and death rates are all below the average for the previous ten years. As compared with the previous year, each of these rates shows a slight reduction.

Marriages registered during the year numbered 7,175. The equivalent marriage rate was 5.74 per 1,000 of the estimated population, a reduction of 0.02 as compared with the rate for the previous year.

A considerable fluctuation in the marriage rate has been shown in the past ten years. From a rate of 5.69 per 1,000 in 1917 it rose to the high figure of 7.99 in 1919, since when it has fallen steadily, excepting a slight check in 1925, to the rate of 5.74 for 1927, which is the lowest since 1917.

The number of births registered during the year was 26,676, the birth rate being 21.3 per 1,000. This rate is 1.2 below the rate for 1926 and 1.5 below the average rate for the ten years 1917–26. From the relatively low point of 20.7 per 1,000, recorded for 1917, the birth rate rose sharply to the exceptionally high point of 25.9 in 1920. With slight checks in 1923 and 1926, the rate has since declined steadily, that for 1927 being the lowest recorded since 1917.

Deaths registered during the year numbered 18,216, affording a death rate of 14.6 per 1,000. This rate is 0.4 below the rate for 1926 and 2.0 below the average rate for the previous ten years. This relatively low death rate is mainly due to an appreciably lower number of deaths from measles, influenza, tuberculosis and respiratory diseases than the average for the previous ten years, this being only partially offset by the higher numbers of deaths from cancer.

The death rate in Northern Ireland has shown considerable variation over the past ten years. From the high point of 20.6 in 1918, it fell steadily till in 1923 it stood at 14.9. In 1924 a sudden rise to 16.1 was experienced, which was largely accounted for by an epidemic of influenza and a high rate from respiratory diseases in that year. Since 1924, however, a decrease has been recorded each year, and the rate of 14.6 for 1927 is the lowest recorded during the past ten years.

The number of deaths from tuberculous disease registered during the year was 1,767, the equivalent rate being 1.41 per 1,000 as compared with 1.47 in 1926. The rate from this disease declined steadily from the high figure of 2.54 in 1918 to 1.62 in 1923. A slight upward tendency was indicated in 1924 and 1925, which, however, has been more than offset by a fall in the rates for 1926 and 1927 to a point lower than any previously recorded for Northern Ireland.

Deaths from cancer, including malignant disease, numbered 1,477, being 67 more than the number recorded for 1926 and 176 more than the average number for the ten years 1917–26. The death rate from this disease has shown an increase each year from 1922 onwards, with the exception of 1926, when a slight decrease was recorded.

Deaths from bronchitis and pneumonia numbered 2,361. This number is 48 less than that recorded for 1926 and 713 less than the average annual number of deaths from those diseases during the ten years 1917–26.

Migration.—According to returns published by the Board of Trade, London, the total number of emigrants from Northern Ireland to countries outside of Europe during the year 1927 was 11,899, and the immigrants into Northern Ireland from those countries numbered 1,550. The net emigration from Northern Ireland during the year thus amounted to 10,349 persons, a decrease of 1,220 compared with 1926.

The Weather.—Reports on the weather experienced in Northern Ireland during each month of the year 1927, as furnished by the Director of the Meteorological Office, London, are published in the Quarterly Returns of Marriages, Births and Deaths for that year. Table 2 of this report shows the Average Air Temperature, Rainfall

and Sunshine for Northern Ireland in 1927, and has been compiled from the tables published in the Quarterly Returns.

For the year 1927 the average temperature, rainfall and sunshine were all a little in excess of normal. *January* was on the whole mild and wet, but there was more than the normal amount of sunshine. Gales were experienced frequently throughout the month, the most noteworthy being that on the 28th, which was particularly violent and destructive over Northern Ireland generally. Snow fell on several occasions. *February* was also mainly mild, though comparatively dry. A brief period of cold, dry weather occurred from the 9th to the 12th, and there were many bright sunny periods, notably during the first half of the month. The weather of *March* was mainly unsettled and exceedingly mild. Very unsettled and rainy weather prevailed during the first and last weeks. Excellent sunshine records were obtained on individual days, although the total sunshine for the month was slightly below normal. The weather was changeable during the greater part of *April*. A brief sunny period occurred about the middle of the month, after which the weather became cold, with frequent showers of rain, hail or snow. The total rainfall for the month was, however, markedly deficient, being lower than the total for any other month during the year. The first few days of *May* were cold and wet. After the 4th the weather became fairer and warmer, and, with the exception of a few short periods, during which the temperature fell and rain occurred occasionally, continued thus throughout the remainder of the month. Rainfall was considerably below normal in this month. *June* was characterised, for the greater part, by wet and unseasonably cold weather. A period of generally fine weather was experienced from the 10th to 15th. The first half of *July* was unsettled with frequent rain. Fine dry weather then prevailed for about a week. Thereafter unsettled conditions were renewed, and persisted, but with occasional fair periods, to the end of the month. Temperature, rainfall and sunshine records all approximated to the normal. *August* on the whole was wet and unsettled. Rain fell on 23 days, and thunderstorms were of frequent occurrence. There were, however, considerable fair periods throughout the month. Apart from a few fine days at the beginning of the month, the weather of *September* was exceedingly wet, the amount of rainfall recorded being twice the normal and greater than any other recorded during the year. High winds were experienced frequently throughout the month and temperature and sunshine records were below normal. Fine dry conditions prevailed during the first half of *October*. Thereafter unsettled weather with frequent rain ensued and lasted till the end of the month, culminating in a violent storm on the 28th-29th. The mean temperature for the month was considerably in excess of normal. *November* opened with about a week of fair and unusually warm weather with occasional showers. A period of northerly winds, accompanied by a fall in the temperature and occasional showers of snow or hail, then followed and persisted till the 15th. Apart from a dull rainy spell from 18th-23rd the remainder of the month was mainly fair. A marked excess of sunshine was recorded. The first ten days of *December* were dull and cloudy with occasional rain. The temperature then gradually fell, and, apart from a mild rainy spell on the 21st-22nd, remained low throughout the remainder of the month—cold frosty weather being experienced. There was a fine sunny period from the 26th-29th. Snow fell fairly generally over Northern Ireland on the last two days of the month. Temperature and rainfall records were below normal—the latter markedly so.

Vaccination.—As returned by the Registrars, the Successful Primary Vaccinations during the year numbered 25,025, the number of births registered during the year being 26,676. The number of Successful Primary Vaccinations is thus about 94 per cent. of the total number of births registered.

MARRIAGES.

Marriages registered during the year numbered 7,175, the rate being 5.74 per 1,000 of the estimated population. This rate is 0.02 below that for the year 1926, and 0.73 below the average rate for the ten years 1917-26.

Of the total marriages, 89.0 per cent. were of bachelors and spinsters, 6.9 per cent. were of widowers and spinsters, 1.9 per cent. were of bachelors and widows and 2.2 per cent. were of widowers and

widows. Thus 9.1 per cent. of the men married were widowers and 4.1 per cent. of the women married were widows; in 11 out of every 100 marriages, one or both of the contracting parties had been married before.

The marriages registered in each quarter were as follows:—March, 1,487, or 21 per cent. of the total year's registrations; June, 1,823, or 25 per cent.; September, 1,979, or 28 per cent.; and December, 1,886, or 26 per cent.

Of the males married during the year, 165, or 2.3 per cent., were under the age of 21 years, and of the females, 787, or 11.0 per cent.

Of the husbands, 98.2 per cent. signed the marriage registers by writing their names and the remainder signed by "mark," while 98.6 per cent. of the wives wrote their names and the remainder signed by "mark."

BIRTHS.

Births registered during the year numbered 26,676, representing a rate of 21.3 per 1,000 of the estimated population. The number registered represents a considerable decrease, namely, 1,486, or 5.3 per cent. on the number registered in 1926. The rate for 1927 is 1.2 below that for the previous year, and is 1.5 lower than the average rate for the ten years 1917-26.

Of the births registered, 13,693 were of males and 12,983 were of females, the proportion of male births to every 100 female births being 105.5. The corresponding proportions for each of the years 1922-26 are 104.6, 103.8, 108.1, 105.1 and 107.3 respectively.

Of the 26,676 births registered during the year, 25,414 or 95.3 per cent. were legitimate and 1,262 or 4.7 per cent. were illegitimate, the latter being 0.3 above the percentage for the preceding year.

The 25,414 legitimate births are in the proportion of 105.7 males to every 100 females. The corresponding proportion for the 1,262 illegitimate births is 100.6 males to every 100 females.

Of the births appertaining to Co. Antrim, 5.8 per cent. were illegitimate; for Armagh the percentage was 4.1; for Belfast County Borough, 4.0; for Down, 4.5; for Fermanagh, 5.1; for Londonderry, 5.7; and for Tyrone, 5.5. The corresponding percentages for the

preceding year are:—Antrim, 6.4; Armagh, 3.6; Belfast County Borough, 3.5; Down, 3.9; Fermanagh, 4.8; Londonderry, 4.9; and Tyrone, 5.7.

The total number of births registered in the first quarter of the year was 6,738; in the second, 7,291; in the third, 6,603; and in the fourth, 6,044.

MULTIPLE BIRTHS.

Of the 26,676 children registered during the year, 26,098 were single children, 566 were twins and 12 were triplets. Thus, of the total children born, 97.84 per cent. were single children, 2.12 per cent. were twins and 0.04 were triplets. In this computation of single births, twins and triplets, only live-born children were counted, still-born children not being registered in Northern Ireland. For example, a birth of one live child and one still-born child would appear in the report as a single birth, and a birth of two live children and one still-born child would appear as a twin birth.

DEATHS.

Deaths registered during the year numbered 18,216, a decrease of 611, or 3.2 per cent., as compared with the previous year. The death rate was 14.6 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.4 below the rate for 1926 and 2.0 below the rate for the previous ten years, 1917-26. Of these deaths, 8,721 were of males and 9,495 were of females, the equivalent annual death rates being 14.4 and 14.7 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations respectively.

The total number of deaths registered in the first quarter of the year was 5,317; in the second, 4,984; in the third, 3,640; and in the fourth, 4,275. The equivalent annual death rates are 17.0, 15.9, 11.6 and 13.7 for the four quarters respectively.

Of the 18,216 deaths registered, 3,671, or 20.2 per cent., took place in Institutions (1,137, or 6.3 per cent., in Infirmaries and general and special hospitals; 344, or 1.9 per cent., in public lunatic asylums; 1,837, or 10.1 per cent., in workhouses and workhouse hospitals; and 353, or 1.9 per cent., in district hospitals); and the remaining 14,545, or 79.8 per cent., occurred "at their own homes, etc."

CAUSES OF DEATH.

Table 5 shows the deaths from the principal causes as proportions per 1,000 of the total deaths at certain age groups. It will be seen from this table that of all the single defined diseases, heart disease, as is the usual experience, bears the greatest proportion to the total deaths at all ages, and that the deaths from this cause occur mainly among persons of fairly advanced ages. The proportions are high also for tuberculosis, cancer, pneumonia, bronchitis, cerebral hæmorrhage and influenza.

At ages under one year, apart from developmental and wasting diseases, the highest proportion of deaths is caused by pneumonia and diarrhœa and enteritis. Between the ages of one and ten, common

infectious diseases, such as whooping-cough and diphtheria, cause a relatively high proportion of the total deaths. Tuberculosis (the deaths from which are mainly due to tuberculous meningitis) and pneumonia also contribute largely to the mortality in this group. Between the ages of ten and thirty-five, tuberculosis (principally of the respiratory system) contributes the largest proportion, and there-after cancer, heart disease, cerebral hæmorrhage and bronchitis are responsible for the largest proportion of the total mortality.

Tables 6 and 7 show for each of the principal causes the numbers of deaths and the death rates for each year since 1917, together with corresponding particulars for the Irish Free State in respect of the year 1927.

Enteric Fever.—Deaths from enteric fever numbered 44, 24 being of males and 20 of females. This number is 7 more than that for 1926 and 4 less than the average for the ten years 1917-26.

Typhus.—Two deaths from this cause were reported, as against 1 for the previous year and an average of 5 for the previous ten years.

Small-pox.—No deaths from small-pox were registered during the year.

Measles.—Deaths from measles numbered 22, 13 being of males and 9 of females. A considerable decrease in the number of deaths from this cause is shown, the number being 286 below that for 1926 and 160 below the average number for the ten years 1917-26. Of the 22 deaths from this cause, 19 were of children under 5 years of age.

Scarlet Fever.—Deaths from scarlet fever numbered 46, 23 being of males and 23 of females. This number is 5 more than that for 1926 and 42 less than the average for the ten years 1917-26. 57 per cent. of the deaths from this cause occurred at ages under 10 years.

Whooping-Cough.—Deaths from whooping-cough numbered 220, 105 being of males and 115 of females. This number is 113 more than that for 1926 and 41 less than the average for the ten years 1917-26. Of the 220 deaths from this cause, 209 were of children under 5 years of age.

Diphtheria.—Deaths from diphtheria, including those certified as due to membranous laryngitis, numbered 85, 37 being of males and 48 of females. This number is 40 less than that for 1926 and is 19 less than the average for the ten years 1917-26. Of the 85 deaths from this cause, 67 were of children under 10 years of age.

Diarrhœal Diseases.—Of the 418 deaths from diarrhœa and enteritis, 303 were of children under 2 years of age, 160 of these children being males and 143 females. The number of children under 2 who died from these diseases is 175 less than that for 1926 and 25 less than the average for the ten years 1917-26.

Encephalitis Lethargica.—Deaths from this disease numbered 28, 17 being of males and 11 of females. This number is 10 less than that for 1926 and 5 more than the average for the ten years 1917-26.

Other Epidemic Diseases.—Deaths from epidemic diseases, apart from those already named and exclusive of influenza, included, among others, 41 from erysipelas, 8 from meningococcal meningitis, 5 from malaria and 3 from acute poliomyelitis.

Influenza.—Deaths from influenza numbered 745, 334 being of males and 411 of females. This number comprised 288 registered as from influenza with pulmonary complications, and 457 registered with influenza as the sole cause or with other complications. The 745 deaths for the year are 263 more than the number recorded for 1926, and 317 less than the average for the ten years 1917–26. In making comparisons with years prior to 1921, the change in classification, noted under the heading “Bronchitis,” should be borne in mind.

Tuberculosis.—Deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease numbered 1,767, or 9.7 per cent., of the deaths from all causes. This number represents a decrease of 74, or 4.0 per cent., on the number registered in 1926. The death rate from this cause was 1.41 per 1,000, which represents a decrease of 0.06 as compared with the rate for 1926, and is 0.50 below the average rate for the previous ten years, 1917–26.

Of the 1,767 deaths from this cause, 786 were of males and 981 of females, the corresponding rates being 1.30 and 1.52 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations respectively.

From Table 5 it will be seen that tuberculous diseases have been responsible for more than 500 deaths in every 1,000, between the ages of 15 and 25, and 400 deaths in every 1,000 between 25 and 35. Further, from Abstract VII it appears that one half of the deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease during 1927 occurred between the ages of 15 and 35.

From 1918 to 1927 the trend of the tuberculosis mortality rate has been in a markedly downward direction. Each year a decrease has been recorded, with the exception of 1924 and 1925, when the rate took a slight upward turn. The rates for 1927 from this disease for persons, males and females, are the lowest recorded in Northern Ireland in the past ten years.

Of the 1,767 deaths from tuberculosis, 1,300, or 73.6 per cent., were due to tuberculosis of the respiratory system.

The abstracts of causes of death give particulars regarding the sexes and ages of the persons who died from the various forms of tuberculous disease during the year, and the rural and urban areas to which such deaths were allocated. Table 8 affords comparison of the summarised figures for 1927 with those for each of the ten preceding years. Table 9 shows comparisons of the summarised figures for each of the six counties of Northern Ireland and Belfast County Borough.

Syphilis.—Deaths from syphilis numbered 23, 15 being of males and 8 of females. Of the 23 deaths, 13 were of infants under one year of age.

Deaths from general paralysis of the insane numbered 26; from tabes dorsalis, 9; and from aneurysm, 11. Of the part played by syphilis in the causation of deaths from diseases of the heart and arteries there are no means of judging accurately.

Cancer.—Under this heading are included deaths returned as from carcinoma, sarcoma, cancer, malignant disease. Deaths in this group, representing 8.1 per cent. of the deaths from all causes, numbered 1,477, a slight increase, namely 67, or 4.8 per cent., on the number registered in 1926, and is the highest number yet recorded for Northern Ireland. The death rate for 1927 from this disease was 1.18 per 1,000, being 0.06 above the rate for 1926 and 0.14 above the average rate for the ten years 1917-26.

Of the total deaths assigned to cancer, 661 were of males and 816 were of females, the corresponding death rates being 1.09 and 1.26 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations respectively.

The death rate from cancer, as compared with the rate for last year, shows an increase for the male and female population of 0.07 and 0.04 respectively.

The most frequent sites of fatal cancer among males during the year were stomach, 193; intestines, 79; liver and gall-bladder, 56; rectum, 48; tongue, 37; prostate, 34; and face, 22. The most frequent sites among females were stomach, 170; breast, 136; uterus, 100; intestines, 91; liver and gall-bladder, 76; rectum, 33; and ovary, 20.

Particulars regarding age, sex and parts affected among the persons whose deaths were registered during the year as from carcinoma, sarcoma, cancer and malignant disease are given in Table 10.

Of the 1,477 deaths from cancer, 895 were ascribed to carcinoma, 61 to sarcoma and 521 to other or unspecified forms of malignant disease.

Tumours, not returned as Malignant.—This heading includes all non-malignant tumours, except those of the brain and of the female genital organs. 25 deaths have been ascribed to this cause, 11 being of males and 14 of females.

Deaths from ovarian tumours numbered 7, and from uterine tumours, 10.

Other General Diseases.—Among these were 7 deaths from tetanus, 40 from purulent infection and septicæmia, 90 from rheumatic fever, 87 from chronic rheumatism, osteo-arthritis and gout, 24 from rickets, 120 from diabetes, 134 from pernicious anæmia, 27 from exophthalmic goitre (25 of which were of females) and 5 from alcoholism, 4 being of males and 1 of a female. [See also "cirrhosis of the liver."]

Diseases of the Nervous System.—Among these were 6 deaths from encephalitis (not returned as encephalitis lethargica), 107 from meningitis (not returned as tuberculous or cerebro-spinal), 9 from tabes dorsalis, 967 from cerebral hæmorrhage and apoplexy, 120 from cerebral thrombosis and embolism, 169 from hemiplegia, 43 from other forms of paralysis, 26 from general paralysis of the insane, 60 from

other forms of insanity, 58 from epilepsy and 135 from convulsions. The deaths of children under one year of age from convulsions numbered 107, this number being equivalent to 79.3 per cent. of the total deaths from this cause, and 5.2 per cent. of the total deaths of infants under one year of age.

Heart Diseases.—Deaths from the various forms of heart disease amounted to 2,529, 1,204 being of males and 1,325 of females. This number is equivalent to a rate of 2.02 per 1,000 of the population, or 13.9 per cent. of the total number of deaths from all causes. Of the 2,529 deaths, 12 were caused by pericarditis, 136 by acute endocarditis and myocarditis, 63 by angina pectoris and 2,318 by other diseases of the heart. The 2,529 deaths are 149 less than those for 1926 and 41 less than the average number for the ten years 1917–26.

Arterial Sclerosis.—Deaths from arterial sclerosis numbered 204, 113 being of males and 91 of females. This number is 2 more than that for 1926 and 66 more than the average number for the ten years 1917–26.

Bronchitis.—Deaths from bronchitis numbered 1,108, 503 being of males and 605 of females. This number is equivalent to a rate of 0.89 per 1,000 of the population, or 6.1 per cent. of the total number of deaths from all causes. The number of deaths assigned to bronchitis in 1926 was 1,212, and the average number for the ten years 1917–26 was 1,630. When making comparisons with the figures for the years preceding 1921, it should be noted that deaths from capillary bronchitis, which were then assigned to bronchitis, are, according to the revised International Classification of Causes of Death, now included with deaths from broncho-pneumonia. Also, prior to 1921, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, including broncho-pneumonia, pneumonia and bronchitis, when associated with influenza, were classed as deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, while, according to the new classification, such deaths fall to be treated as deaths from influenza.

Pneumonia.—Deaths from all forms of pneumonia, including capillary bronchitis (see remarks under the heading "Bronchitis"), numbered 1,253, 666 being of males and 587 of females. This number is equivalent to a rate of 1.00 per 1,000 of the population, or 6.9 per cent. of the total number of deaths from all causes. Of the 1,253 deaths, 616 were classed as due to broncho-pneumonia, 154 to lobar pneumonia and 483 to pneumonia, not otherwise defined. The number of deaths assigned to pneumonia in 1926 was 1,197, and the average number for the ten years 1917–26 was 1,444.

Pleurisy.—Deaths from pleurisy, including deaths from empyema, regarding which the originating cause other than pleurisy could not be ascertained, numbered 48, 29 being of males and 19 of females.

Appendicitis and Typhlitis.—Deaths in this group numbered 107, 62 being of males and 45 of females. This number is 16 more than that for 1926 and 17 above the average number for the ten years 1917–26.

Cirrhosis of the Liver.—Deaths from cirrhosis of the liver numbered 28, 18 being of males and 10 of females. This number is 5 less than that for 1926 and 3 less than the average number for the ten years 1917–26.

Acute and Chronic Nephritis.—Deaths from acute and chronic nephritis numbered 457, 232 being of males and 225 of females. This number comprised 113 deaths from the acute and 344 from the chronic form of the disease. The 457 deaths are 36 more than the number for 1926 and 13 above the average number for the ten years 1917–26.

Pregnancy and Childbirth.—The mortality of women during pregnancy and childbirth is classified under two headings, namely—(1) puerperal diseases and accidents of pregnancy and childbirth and (2) non-puerperal diseases or causes combined with pregnancy and childbirth. Deaths in the first group numbered 128 and in the second 46, the total number of deaths in the two groups being 174. This number is equivalent to a rate of 6.52 per 1,000 of the total births registered, as compared with 6.21 in 1926, and with the average rate of 6.11 per 1,000 for the ten years 1917–26. The causes of death shown in Table 11 are those to which the various deaths were assigned.

From Table 12 it will be seen that a considerable decrease in the number of deaths and in the death rate per 1,000 births from puerperal diseases and accidents of pregnancy and childbirth has been recorded for 1927, the 128 deaths being 30 less than the number for 1926 and 17 below the average for the ten years 1917–26. The deaths of women from non-puerperal diseases or causes combined with pregnancy and childbirth numbered 46, as against 17 for 1926 and the average number of 29 for the previous ten years.

Violence.—Deaths from violence registered during the year numbered 478, as against 434 in 1926. Of these 478 deaths, 11 were assigned to homicide, 80 to suicide and 387 to accidental causes.

The 11 deaths assigned to homicide include 4 of males, 1 of these being an infant under 1 year of age, and 7 of females, of whom 3 were infants under 1 year. All of these 11 deaths were cases of murder.

Of the 80 deaths definitely attributed to suicide, 62 were of males and 18 of females. There were, in addition, cases in which coroners' juries returned "open verdicts." These cases were classed as accidents, but it is possible that a number of them were due to suicide. Among the 39 deaths from drowning, there were 12 of males and 4 of females in which coroners' juries returned a verdict of "found drowned."

The deaths from external causes, other than those classed as homicide and suicide, include 6 caused by poisons or poisonous gases, 3 by food poisoning, 74 by burns and scalds (40 of these were of children under 5 years of age), 6 by accidental mechanical suffocation, 39 by drowning, 8 by firearms, all of which were of males, 84 by fall and 122 by vehicles, of which 88 were caused by motor-driven vehicles.

Of the 6 deaths (2 of males and 4 of females) caused by poisons or poisonous gases, 4 were due to coal gas, 1 to medinal and 1 to other or unstated poison; while of the 6 deaths caused by mechanical suffocation, 3 were due to overlying.

Ill-Defined Causes of Death.—142 deaths have been allocated to this heading, as against 165 in 1926 and an average of 290 in the ten years 1917–26.

Enquiries were sent to medical practitioners and coroners requesting further information as to 489 indefinitely certified deaths, and 418 replies were received, 357 containing such useful additional particulars as enabled those cases to be classified under definite causes of death.

Uncertified Causes of Death.—Of the 18,216 deaths registered, 1,747 were not certified, there having been neither a medical attendant during the last illness nor an inquest held by a coroner. This number represents a slight reduction, namely 38, or 2.1 per cent., on the number registered as uncertified in 1926. 1,222, or 69.9 per cent., of

the uncertified deaths were of persons aged 65 years and upwards, and 205, or 11.7 per cent., were of infants under one year of age. The proportion of uncertified deaths is 9.6 per cent. of the total deaths, as compared with 9.5 per cent. for 1926 and an average of 11.3 per cent. for the ten years 1917–26.

Inquests.—The number of inquests held by coroners during the year was 487, or one inquest for every 37 deaths registered. Of the cases referred to the coroner by Registrars, there were 261 in which the coroner decided that inquests were unnecessary. These cases comprised 87 deaths certified by medical practitioners and 174 uncertified deaths.

Ages at Death.—Deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 3,001, or 16.5 per cent. of the total deaths registered, the deaths of male children numbering 1,635, or 18.7 per cent. of the total deaths of males, and the deaths of female children 1,366, or 14.4 per cent. of the total deaths of females.

Deaths of persons aged 65 years and upwards numbered 7,579, or 41.6 per cent. of the total deaths registered.

Deaths of persons aged 70 years and upwards numbered 6,052, or 33.2 per cent. of the total deaths.

Deaths of persons aged 95 years and upwards numbered 79, 36 being of males and 43 of females.

Among the deaths registered were 11 of persons whose ages at death were returned as 100 years or upwards. 7 of these deaths were of males and 4 of females. In the absence of complete public records for remote periods, verification of the ages of all very old persons is not possible and no verification has been attempted.

The ages in detail of the persons whose deaths were registered during the year are given by sexes and counties in Abstract VI.

Infant Mortality.—Deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 2,074, or 78 per 1,000 births registered, as compared with 85 per 1,000 in 1926, and an average of 88 per 1,000 for the ten years 1917–26.

The deaths of infants under one year of age include 1,159 of males and 915 of females, the former number being equivalent to 85 per 1,000 births of males and the latter to 70 per 1,000 births of females. The corresponding rates for 1926 were 94 and 75, respectively.

In 1927 and 1926 the rates for deaths of infants under one year of age were 70 and 76 per 1,000 births, respectively, for England and Wales, 89 and 83 for Scotland and 71 and 74 for the Irish Free State.

The infant mortality rate for the aggregate of the Urban Districts of Northern Ireland in 1927 was 92 per 1,000 births registered, and the rate for the aggregate of the Rural Districts was 61 per 1,000, the corresponding rates for 1926 being 102 and 63 respectively.

Table 14 gives the infant mortality rates for Northern Ireland as a whole for each of the eleven years 1917-27, by causes of death, and, in the case of the last of these years, by sexes and age-periods. It will be noticed that the "all causes" infant mortality rate for Northern Ireland has, on the whole, shown a decline over the past ten years, which is largely due to the fall in the rates from atrophy, debility and marasmus, and from bronchitis.

Table 15 affords comparison between infant mortality rates for the aggregates of the urban and of the rural areas in Northern Ireland.

The differences usually found between urban and rural rates and between male and female rates are marked. With very few exceptions the urban rates are appreciably in excess of the corresponding rural rates. Also, in nearly all cases, the male rates are higher than the corresponding female rates.

Deaths of illegitimate children under one year of age numbered 249 in 1927, which is equivalent to a rate of 197.3 per 1,000 of the illegitimate births registered, as compared with 222.4 in 1926. The corresponding rate for legitimate children in 1927 is 71.8 per 1,000. Table 16 shows the deaths of illegitimate children by the principal causes, together with the equivalent mortality rates. Most of these rates are considerably in excess of the corresponding rates for all children; particularly, the rates for diarrhoea and enteritis, premature birth, atrophy, debility and marasmus, lack of care, violence and syphilis. It should, however, be noted that the rates for some of the causes are based on very small numbers of deaths.

The deaths of illegitimate children under one year of age in the Irish Free State represent a rate of 288 per 1,000 illegitimate births registered.

In conclusion, I beg to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by the Chief Medical Officer of the Ministry of Home Affairs, who has perused and advised on the medical aspects of this Report, and to record my appreciation of the courtesy shown by the Registrars-General of England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Free State, in kindly furnishing information relating to the respective areas under their administration.
