SIR,

I have the honour to submit the Twentieth Annual Report on the Births, Deaths, and Marriages registered in Northern Ireland, together with Abstracts of the particulars of such registrations. The Report relates to the year ended 31st December, 1941. The Abstracts have been prepared for presentation to Parliament, pursuant to the provisions of statutes governing the registration system. The Report draws attention to the salient features of the vital statistics contained in the Abstracts, and figures relating to previous years are included for purposes of comparison. Information is also given relating to vaccination, notifications of infectious diseases, and weather conditions, but migration statistics are not at present available.

I beg to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by Dr. J. Boyd, Chief Medical Officer of the Ministry of Health and Local Government, who advises this office in regard to medical matters. I also desire to record my appreciation of the courtesy shown by the Registrars-General of England and Wales, Scotland, and Eire, in furnishing information relating to the areas under their respective administrations.

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NOTE—Owing to wartime pressure on staff and the necessity of conserving supplies of paper, this Report and those for 1939 and 1940 have been reduced in length by the temporary omission of graphs and other diagrams and by adjustments in certain tables of minor importance. Readers desiring to see (in graphical form) the general trend of vital statistics during recent years are recommended to consult the Annual Report for 1938 (H.C. 471).

Annual Report of the Registrar-General for Northern Ireland

REPORT

NOTE—A survey of the administrative functions of the office of the Registrar-General is contained in the Reports for 1939 and previous years.

SUMMARY OF REGISTRATION.

1. Introductory.—The figures contained in this Report may be regarded as final, and as superseding the provisional figures already published for the year 1941 in the Registrar-General's weekly and quarterly returns. It should be noted that statistics of deaths (for year 1941) relate to civilians only.

The value of the statistical information concerning deaths contained in the Registrar-General's Annual Reports and other publications is to a large extent dependent on the degree of care and accuracy with which the members of the medical profession enter the required particulars on the form of medical certificate of the cause of death. The particulars so given are incorporated in the death entries, and thus in every case in which a person had been attended in his or her last illness by a medical practitioner, the medical certificate given by the latter forms the basis upon which the cause of death is classified.

In the case of the death of a person who had not been medically attended in his or her last illness, and no inquest had been held, the cause of death is entered in the register from such information as the informant of the death can supply to the Registrar. (See section 24, page 15, as to uncertified deaths.)

For the purpose of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports the classifications adopted are the Intermediate and Short Lists shown in the "Manual of the International List of Causes of Death, as adapted for use in England and Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland," published by H.M. Stationery Office.

Abstract VI shows the deaths classified under the headings of the Intermediate List (slightly amplified in the case of tuberculosis and modified in the case of violent deaths), while the causes shown in Abstracts V and X and certain of the tables in the text, are in accordance with the Short List. The Detailed List numbers have also been given in Abstracts V and VI for purpose of reference.

In general in the tables and abstracts, dots (.) are used to indicate "none," and dashes (—) are used to indicate that information cannot be given or that the headings are not applicable.

Throughout the Report, births and deaths have been allocated to the district of normal residence, births having been assigned to the

districts containing the normal residence of the parents, and deaths to the districts containing the normal residence of the deceased persons.

2. Marriages, Births, and Deaths Registered.—The results of the year's registration show increases in the marriage and birth rates, whilst the death rate, apart from air raid casualties, is unchanged. The infant mortality rate is considerably lower than that for the previous year.

3. Vaccinations.—As returned by the Registrars, the successful Primary Vaccinations during the year numbered 17,395, or 65 per cent. of the total births registered, as compared with 72 per cent. in 1940.

4. Adoption of Children Act (N.I.), 1929.—A Register of Children adopted under the provisions of this Act is kept in the General Register Office, to which the Adoption Orders made by the Courts are communicated. A certified copy of an entry in this register is evidence of adoption, and is also evidence of the date of birth, if that date is recorded in the entry. The children whose adoptions were recorded in the Adopted Children Register during 1941 numbered 191, the figures for 1940 and 1939 being 207 and 164 respectively.

MARRIAGES.

5. Number and Rate.—Marriages registered during the year numbered 11,966, which is 2,171 more than the previous year. The rate, 9.29 per 1,000 of the estimated population, is 1.73 above that for the year 1940. The marriage rate and the number of marriages are the highest ever recorded for Northern Ireland. The next highest figures were those for the year 1919 when the rate was 7.99 and the number of marriages registered was 9,992. Of the contracting parties, 5.2 per cent. of the husbands and 19.2 per cent. of the wives were minors.

6. Method of Celebration.—Table C shows for Northern Ireland the marriages registered during the years 1922, 1932 and 1937 to 1941 according to methods of celebration. It will be observed that the increase in the number of marriages in 1941 is distributed over the various denominations, the more notable increases being in the Church of Ireland, Presbyterian and Roman Catholic marriages. Marriages taking place in Registrars' Offices in the year under review represented 7.3 per cent. of the total marriages, as compared with 4.8 per cent. in 1922. The former heading, "In Registered Buildings" has been altered to "In other Churches" and now includes marriages of the Society of Friends (see also Abstract No. I).

7. Signatures by "Mark."—Of the 23,932 persons married 36 men and 23 women, or 0.2 per cent. of the persons married, signed the registers or certificates by "mark," as compared with 2.1 per cent. in 1922.

BIRTHS.

8. Number and Rate.—The births registered during the year numbered 26,887, an increase of 1,524 as compared with the previous year. The birth rate was 20.9 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 1.3 above the rate for the previous year. Illegitimate births numbered 1,297, an increase of 128 as compared with the number recorded for 1940; the proportion to total births (4.82 per cent.) being slightly above that for the previous year. In England and Wales, Scotland and Eire, the illegitimate births as percentages of the total births were 5.27, 6.58 and 3.48 respectively for the year 1941.

9. Proportion of Males to Females.—Births of males in Northern Ireland in 1941 numbered 14,059 and those of females 12,828; the proportion of male to female births was therefore 1,096 to 1,000. This is the highest proportion recorded for Northern Ireland as a separate administrative unit. A high proportion of male to female births has been a common experience in times of war. The corresponding proportions for each of the years 1936-40 were 1,051, 1,049, 1,052, 1,044 and 1,082 respectively.

10. Multiple Births.—Of the 26,887 children whose births were registered during the year, 26,317 were born singly, 564 children were twins, and 6 children were triplets. Still-births not being registered in Northern Ireland, a birth of one live child and one still-born child is regarded as a single birth, a birth of two live children and one still-born child as a twin birth, and so on.

DEATHS.

11. Number and Rate.—The civilian deaths registered during the year numbered 19,640, an increase of 699, as compared with the total deaths registered during the previous year. The death rate was 15.2 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.6 above the rate for 1940.

It should be noted, however, that the death rate, excluding civilian deaths due to enemy air raids, amounted to 14.6 per 1,000 of the estimated population. This is the same as the rate for 1940. It is therefore apparent that the rise in the death rate for 1941 is completely due to casualties directly attributable to enemy action and not to any increase in deaths from disease.

Of the total deaths, 9,761 were of males and 9,879 were of females, the equivalent annual death rates being 15.6 and 14.9 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations respectively.

12. Deaths in Institutions.—The numbers of deaths occurring in institutions in each of the years 1932-41 are shown in Abstract VII. 28.5 per cent. of the deaths registered in 1941 took place in institutions (2.9 per cent. in public mental hospitals, 10.6 per cent. in poor law institutions, 6.1 per cent. in district hospitals, and 8.9 per cent. in other hospitals and infirmaries), and the remaining 71.5 per cent. occurred in the deceased person's own home, in private nursing homes, or in places other than the institutions already described. The percentage of deaths taking place in institutions has risen from 17.0 in 1924 to 28.5 in 1941.

13. Proportion of Deaths from the Principal Causes.—Abstract X shows the deaths from the principal causes as proportions per 1,000 of the total deaths in certain age groups. It will be seen from this abstract that, for all ages taken together, heart disease bears the greatest proportion to the total deaths, which is the usual experience; and that the deaths from this cause occur mainly among persons of fairly advanced ages. The proportions were high also for cancer, intra-cranial vascular lesions, tuberculosis, bronchitis and pneumonia.

At ages under one year, apart from congenital malformations, etc., and premature birth, the highest proportions of deaths were caused by diarrhoea, pneumonia, bronchitis and whooping cough.

Between the ages of one and ten the highest proportions were caused by the common infectious diseases, tuberculosis (the deaths from which are mainly due to tuberculosis of the central nervous system), pneumonia and diseases of the digestive system.

Between the ages of ten and thirty-five, tuberculosis (principally of the respiratory system) caused by far the largest proportion of deaths.

From age thirty-five onwards, heart disease, cancer, intra-cranial vascular lesions, bronchitis, diseases of the digestive and circulatory systems, pneumonia, nephritis and tuberculosis were responsible for the largest proportions of the total mortality.

Table E shows for each of the principal causes the numbers of deaths and the death rates for each year since 1938, together with corresponding particulars for Eire in respect of the year 1941.

For purposes of comparability in Table E the figures in respect of maternal mortality and also deaths due to syphilis and to road traffic accidents (for the years 1938 and 1939) have been regrouped in accordance with the new International List of Causes of Death. Similarly, the Short List in use prior to 1940 has been made to conform to the one adopted in that year.

14. Deaths from the Principal Epidemic Diseases.*—With the exception of a slight increase in the numbers of deaths recorded for dysentery and diphtheria, the numbers of deaths from diseases in this group show decreases when compared with the figures for the previous year. The decreases were most marked in connection with measles and influenza. To a lesser extent there were decreases in the numbers of deaths from diarrhoeal diseases of children under two years of age, also from whooping cough, scarlet fever and typhoid and paratyphoid fevers.

The notifications of certain infectious diseases for each District in Northern Ireland for the year 1941 are shown in Abstract XV.

15. Influenza.—The deaths from influenza during the year numbered 443, giving a rate of 0.34 per 1,000 of the population, compared with a rate of 0.51 for the year 1940. As is usually the case, mortality was highest from this disease in the first quarter of the year.

16. Tuberculosis.—The death rate from this cause of 1.04 per 1,000 of the population is 0.06 above the rate for 1940. The corresponding rates for England and Wales, Scotland, and Eire in 1941 were 0.73, 0.85 and 1.24 respectively.

During the Great War the death rate from tuberculosis (which had been dropping since the beginning of the century) steadily increased, culminating in the very high rate of 2.54 per 1,000 of the estimated population in 1918. From 1919 onwards the rate declined almost uninterruptedly and reached its lowest point in

1939. During the present war the death rate from tuberculosis has again increased, and the rate for 1941 is the highest for any year since 1935, when the rate was 1.06.

From Abstract X it will be seen that tuberculous diseases have caused 383 deaths in every 1,000 between the ages of 15 and 25, and 361 per 1,000 between 25 and 35. Further, from Abstract VI it appears that almost one-half of the deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease during 1941 occurred between the ages of 15 and 35.

Tuberculosis is in general much more prevalent in the cities and towns than in the country districts. In 1941 the rate per 1,000 of the population for all urban areas was 1.18 and for rural areas 0.88. The rates in 1940 were 1.11 and 0.85, respectively.

Tuberculosis of the respiratory system accounted for 76 per cent. of the total deaths from tuberculosis, being the same percentage as that recorded in 1940.

The abstracts of causes of death give particulars regarding the sexes and ages of the persons who died from the various forms of tuberculous disease during the year, and also the deaths from tuberculosis allocated to each county and to each of the principal

towns in Northern Ireland. Table F affords comparison of the summarised figures for 1941 with those for certain preceding years. Table G shows comparisons of the summarised figures for each of the six counties of Northern Ireland and Belfast County Borough.

17. Cancer.—The number of deaths from cancer in Northern Ireland during 1941 was 1,763, giving a crude death rate of 1.37 per 1,000 of the population, which is 0.01 above the rate for 1940. The general tendency over a number of years has been for this rate to show a more or less steady increase.

The death rates from cancer among males and females in 1941 were 1.30 and 1.43 per 1,000 respectively ; the male rate thus being 91 per cent. of the female rate, as against 97 per cent. in 1940.

The most frequent sites of fatal cancer among males during the year were stomach, 212 ; intestines, 119 ; rectum, 61 ; prostate, 43 ; liver and gall bladder, 36 ; and lung, 33. Among females the most frequent sites were stomach, 196 ; breast, 162 ; intestines, 131 ; uterus, 90 ; rectum, 54 ; and liver and gall bladder, 41.

Abstract XI gives particulars regarding sex, age and sites of fatal cancer during the year 1941.

18. Cerebral Haemorrhage, Apoplexy, etc.—The deaths assigned to this group (now described as “Intra-cranial vascular lesions”) numbered 1,659, giving a rate of 1.29 per 1,000 of the population. This rate is 0.10 above that for 1940.

19. Heart Disease.—The deaths from the various forms of heart disease during the year numbered 4,076, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 3.16, which is 0.11 above that for the previous year. The death rate from this disease has been more or less steadily increasing over a number of years. As in the case of cancer, this may be partly accounted for by the increasing average age of the population of Northern Ireland.

20. Bronchitis.—The deaths from bronchitis during the year numbered 908, giving a rate of 0.70 per 1,000 of the population, which is 0.03 below the rate for 1940.

21. Pneumonia.—There were 913 deaths from pneumonia during 1941, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 0.71, compared with a rate of 0.67 per 1,000 in 1940.

22. Pregnancy and Childbirth.—The mortality of women during pregnancy and childbirth is classified under two headings, namely—(1) diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state, and (2) diseases or causes combined with pregnancy and childbirth. The causes of death shown in Table H are those to which the various deaths were assigned.

From Table J it will be seen that the deaths from diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state in 1941 yielded a rate of 4.17 per 1,000 births, which is a decrease of 0.05 as compared with the rate for 1940. In the 1938 revision of the International List of Causes of Death (described in section 28 below) the diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state were regrouped. One result of this regrouping is that the number of deaths assigned to **Puerperal and post-abortion sepsis** is slightly higher than would otherwise have been the case. There is of course a corresponding drop in the number of deaths classified to **Other Maternal Causes**. Accordingly, the figures under these headings in Table J for 1940 and 1941 are not strictly comparable with those for preceding years. It should be noted, however, that in Table E these figures (i.e., those for **Puerperal and post-abortion sepsis** and **Other maternal causes**) for the years 1938 and 1939 have been regrouped in the manner prescribed in the 1938 revision.

The rate for diseases combined with pregnancy and childbirth decreased from 0.95 in 1940 to 0.67 in the year under review.

Table K shows the number of deaths from puerperal diseases, distinguishing puerperal and post-abortive sepsis, with corresponding rates for the aggregates of the Urban and Rural Areas and the County Boroughs in Northern Ireland for the year 1941 and for the average of the years 1937 to 1940. From this it will be seen that, in the main, the rates for all puerperal diseases show an improvement on the average annual rates for the preceding four years.

23. Violent Deaths.—The number of deaths ascribed to violence during the year was 1,609 (926 males and 683 females), which is an increase of 918 on the number registered for 1940, and is equivalent to 8.2 per cent. of the total deaths registered. Of these 1,609 deaths, 12 were attributed to homicide, 55 to suicide, and 653 to accidental causes (as compared with 544 deaths caused by accidents in 1940). The extraordinarily high number of deaths from violence in 1941 is mainly due to the inclusion of 889 civilian deaths caused by the air raids which took place in April and May of that year.

Included in the 59 deaths from drowning, shown in Table L, there were 19 cases (16 males and 3 females) in which the Coroners returned a verdict of "found drowned." It is possible that some of these deaths were due to suicide.

Of the 80 deaths from burns and scalds, 28 were of children under 5 years of age.

24. Uncertified Deaths.—The deaths registered as uncertified, i.e., those in which there was neither a medical attendant during the last illness nor an inquest held by a coroner, numbered 967, representing 4.9 per cent. of the total deaths registered. The percentage of uncertified deaths has been falling more or less steadily during the past twenty years, the figure for 1941 being the lowest on record. In 1922 uncertified deaths represented 12.7 per cent. of the total deaths.

Of the total deaths in rural areas 738, or 7.9 per cent., were uncertified; in urban areas the number was 229, or 2.2 per cent.

Deaths of persons aged 65 years and upwards represented 66.1 per cent. of the uncertified cases, and deaths of infants under 1 year of age 15.0 per cent.

25. Inquests.—The circumstances of 1,154 deaths were considered by the coroners in 1941. Inquests were held in 720 of these cases, which represents one inquest for every 27 deaths registered. In 1940 the inquests numbered 657.

26. Infant Mortality.—Deaths of infants under 1 year of age numbered 2,059, or 77 per 1,000 births registered, as compared with 86 per 1,000 in 1940. Of the 2,059 deaths of infants under 1 year of age, 1,201 were of males and 858 of females, the former number being equivalent to 85 per 1,000 births of males and the latter to 67 per 1,000 births of females. The corresponding rates for 1940 were 95 and 76 respectively.

The infant mortality rate for the aggregate of the Urban Districts of Northern Ireland in 1941 was 86 per 1,000 births, and the rate for the aggregate of the Rural Districts was 67 per 1,000, the corresponding rates for 1940 being 106 and 62 respectively.

In 1941 and 1940 the rates for deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 59 and 56 per 1,000 births, respectively, for England and Wales ; 83 and 78 for Scotland ; and 74 and 66 for Eire.

In Table M the infant mortality rates for Belfast and Londonderry Co. Boroughs are compared with those for towns of approximately the same populations in Great Britain and Eire. It will be seen that the rates for these Northern Ireland towns do not compare favourably with those for cross-channel towns of comparable size.

Abstract XII gives the infant mortality rates for Northern Ireland for each of the six years 1936-41, by causes of death, and, for the last of these years, by sexes and age-periods.

Abstract XIII compares the infant mortality rates for the aggregate of the urban areas with those for the aggregate of the rural areas of Northern Ireland. The differences usually found between urban and rural rates and between male and female rates are marked, the urban rates being, in general, appreciably in excess of the corresponding rural rates.

The infant mortality rate for Belfast County Borough for 1941 was 91. The corresponding rates for each of the years 1936 to 1940 were 101, 94, 96, 85 and 122 respectively. Abstract XIII gives the infant mortality rates for Belfast County Borough, for each of the five years 1937-41, by the principal causes of death. The rates for the year 1941 are given also by sexes and age-periods.

Abstract V gives the number of infant deaths, together with the number of births, for each County and for each of the principal towns in Northern Ireland. Figures for the aggregates of urban and rural areas are also given.

27. Mortality among Illegitimate Children.—Deaths of illegitimate children under 1 year of age numbered 236 in 1941, which is equivalent to a rate of 182 per 1,000 of the illegitimate births registered, as compared with a rate of 195 for the previous year. The corresponding rates for legitimate children in 1941 and 1940 were 71 and 82 per 1,000 respectively.

Abstract XIV shows the deaths of illegitimate children by the principal causes and for age-periods in 1941, together with the mortality rates among illegitimate children for each of the years 1936-41. Most of these rates are considerably in excess of the corresponding rates for all children; particularly the rates for congenital debility, etc., diarrhoea and enteritis, premature birth and injury at birth, and inattention at birth. It should, however, be noted that the rates for some of the causes are based on very small numbers of deaths.

28. New International List of Causes of Death and New Form of Medical Certificate.—For the purpose of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports, the classification of deaths by causes is made according to the "Manual of the International List of Causes of Death, as adapted for use in England and Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland," published by H.M. Stationery Office. The International List was revised at a Conference held at Paris in 1938, which recommended the adoption of the revised List as from the year 1940, and it was decided to give effect to this recommendation in Northern Ireland, as in other parts of the United Kingdom. The previous revision had been carried out in 1929, and the resulting Lists as adapted for use in the United Kingdom brought into operation from 1931.

The changes introduced by the 1938 revision, to which effect is given in the Report for 1940, are not of an extensive character. The

epidemic diseases have been re-grouped according to the nature of the infecting organism. Locomotor ataxia (tabes dorsalis) and general paralysis of the insane (formerly grouped with diseases of the nervous system) and aneurysm of aorta (formerly grouped with diseases of the circulatory system but not distinguished from other aneurysms) are now grouped with syphilis, among diseases due to spirochaetes. In the section dealing with pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state, certain adjustments have been made and further sub-divisions introduced. As a result of past experience there have been adjustments in the section dealing with violent and accidental deaths, the latter being allocated to a greater extent than before to the *means* of violence. In addition, a number of minor changes have been made throughout the List.

Another important change affecting the classification of causes of death was made for Northern Ireland with the year 1940. The causes of death appearing in the entries from which the classification is made are those stated in the certificate given by the medical practitioner who had been in attendance during the last illness, and in approximately one-third of the cases two or more causes are shown on the medical certificates. In 1922 Northern Ireland adopted the rules which had been in force in England and Wales, without material alteration, from 1901 for the selection of a single cause to which to classify the death in such cases. The chief principle of these rules was that preference should be given to the cause which was the more likely to cause death; or, in other words, that which had the higher case mortality. There were in order of preference four main groups: violence; infectious, parasitic and general diseases; local diseases; and ill-defined conditions. Within these groups were numerous sub-groups, and there were many rules applying in particular cases. There had, however, been a growing volume of opinion in favour of relaxing the rigidity of these rules of selection and the more general acceptance of the opinion of the certifying medical practitioner as to which disease, out of two or more from which a person may have suffered, was the actual cause of death. As a first step in this direction a new form of medical certificate was adopted in England and Wales at 1st July, 1927. Space I of this form provides for a statement of the immediate cause of death and of the cause or series of causes which gave rise to the immediate cause. Space II provides for the insertion of any other morbid conditions which may have contributed to death, but which were not related to the immediate cause. The certifying practitioner is thus invited, more definitely than before, to express his own opinion as to the actual cause of death where more than one disease had been present. The normal procedure in view was to classify the death as due to the disease stated in Space I of the certificate as *commencing* the train of events eventually resulting in death. This was adopted as the normal method of tabulation in England and Wales, commencing with the year 1940, and it was decided to adopt the new method in Northern Ireland as from the same date.

It was necessary in Northern Ireland, in order to make the new method of tabulation possible, to prescribe a new form of medical certificate of the cause of death, and after consultation between the Registrar-General and the medical bodies in Northern Ireland, a new form, identical in essentials with that which had been found satisfactory in England and Wales, was introduced at 1st January, 1940. The duration of illness, for the inclusion of which the medical certificate and the form of death entry formerly provided, was thenceforth omitted from both, and the age of the deceased was also omitted from the new form of certificate, the informant of the death being responsible for stating it to the Registrar.

In the tabulation of deaths in England and Wales, it was found to be desirable, for various reasons, to modify in some cases the normal classification procedure described above where more than one cause of death is mentioned on the medical certificate, and these modifications have been adopted in Northern Ireland. The categories affected are set out in pages XXXVI to XLI of the Manual of the International List, and constitute a small proportion of the whole.

Whilst it is true that the developments in regard to the classification of causes of death briefly described above affect, in some degree, the comparability of death statistics for Northern Ireland from 1940 onwards with those for preceding years, it must be remembered that it is of the greatest importance to maintain the comparability of the Northern Ireland statistics with those for the other parts of the United Kingdom, and that such developments are unavoidable owing to the advance of medical science.

POPULATION.

The *civilian* population of Northern Ireland in the middle of 1941 was estimated at 1,288,000 and the rates in this Report (relating to 1941) for the country as a whole have been based on this estimate. The rates for 1941 for the various divisions of the country have also been based on the civilian estimated populations as at mid-year 1941. The 1937 Census population figures for the counties and principal towns of Ireland are given at the foot of Abstract V.

THE WEATHER.

Reports on the weather experienced in Northern Ireland during each month of the year 1941, as furnished by the Director of the Meteorological Office, England, are published in the Quarterly Returns of Births, Deaths, and Marriages for that year. Table M shows for the inland stations of Armagh and Aldergrove, and the coastal station of Donaghadee, the Average Air Temperature, Rainfall, and Sunshine in 1941.
