I have the honour to submit the Twenty-eighth Annual Report on the Births, Deaths, and Marriages registered in Northern Ireland, together with Abstracts of the particulars of such registrations. The Report relates to the year ended 31st December, 1949. The Abstracts have been prepared for presentation to Parliament, pursuant to the provisions of statutes governing the registration system. The Report draws attention to the salient features of the vital statistics contained in the Abstracts, and figures relating to prevous years are included for purposes of comparsion. Information is also given relating to notifications of infectious diseases, and to weather conditions, but migration statistics are not at present available.

I beg to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by Dr. J. Boyd, Chief Medical Officer of the Ministry of Health and Local Government, who advises this office in regard to medical matters. I also desire to record my appreciation of the courtesy shown by the Registrars-General of England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic, in furnishing information relating to the areas under their respective administrations.

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Twenty-Eighth Annual Report of the Registrar-General for Northern Ireland

REPORT

ADMINISTRATION

- 1. Introductory.—The administrative functions of the office of the Registrar-General comprise the registration of births, deaths, marriages and adoptions, and the provision or supervision of machinery for dealing with preliminaries to marriages other than those according to the rites of the Roman Catholic Church.
- 2. Buildings licensed or registered for Marriages.—The numbers of places of worship (other than those belonging to the Roman Catholic Church) in which marriages could be solemnised, as at 31st December in each of the years 1947, 1948 and 1949, were as follows:—

3. State of Registration.—The measures adopted for particulars of births notified under the Notification of Births Act, 1907, to be furnished to Registrars in the two County Boroughs have continued to be of value in securing the registration of a number of births which had not been registered within the prescribed period of 6 weeks. In connection with the registration of deaths, returns of burials made to Registrars by Clerks of Burial Boards and Cemetery Companies have been of considerable assistance.

Births and deaths not registered within a year of their occurrence can be recorded only with the authority of the Registrar-General. During 1949 such authority was granted for the registration of 105 births, as compared with 159 in 1948, and 279 in 1947. The registration of 10 deaths was authorised as compared with 12 in 1948 and 8 in 1947.

4. Legitimacy Act (N.I.), 1928.—Under this Act an illegitimate child whose parents have married is, subject to certain conditions, legitimated, and the Registrar-General is empowered to authorise the re-registration of the birth. During 1949 the re-registration of the births of 131 children was authorised under the Act, the figures for 1948 and 1947 being 166 and 174 respectively.

- 5. Adoption of Children Act (N.I.), 1929.—A register of children adopted under the provisions of this Act is kept in the General Register Office, to which the Adoption Orders made by the Courts are communicated. A certified copy of an entry in this register is evidence of adoption, and is also evidence of the date of birth, if that date is recorded in the entry. The children whose adoptions were recorded in the Adopted Children Register during 1949 numbered 353, the figures for 1948 and 1947 being 406 and 341 respectively.
- 6. Searches and Certificates.—The original records of births, deaths, and marriages registered in Northern Ireland are, in general, in the custody of local registration officers, who issue annually therefrom many thousands of certificates. An indication of the extent to which Government Departments and the public have utilised the facilities for searching in the indexes and obtaining certificates from records in the General Register Office for Northern Ireland (including the Adopted Children Register) is afforded by the following table:—

SUMMARY OF REGISTRATION.

7. Introductory.—The figures contained in this Report may be regarded as final, and as superseding the provisional figures already published for the year 1949 in the Registrar-General's weekly and quarterly returns. It should be noted that statistics of deaths for years 1941-1949 relate to civilians only.

The value of the statistical information concerning deaths contained in the Registrar-General's Annual Reports and other publications is to a large extent dependent on the degree of care and accuracy with which the members of the medical profession enter the required particulars on the form of medical certificate of the cause of death. The particulars so given are incorporated in the death entries, and thus in every case in which a person had been attended in his or her last illness by a medical practitioner, the medical certificate given by the latter forms the basis upon which the cause of death is classified.

Comparisons with rates (births, deaths, etc.) recorded in other parts of the British Isles are included in several tables and diagrams. These comparisons are substantially correct but, owing to changes in the mode of computing population figures in certain countries in certain years, complete accuracy has not been achieved and the question is receiving further consideration.

For the purpose of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports the classifications adopted are the Intermediate and Short Lists shown in the "Manual of the International List of Causes of Death, as adapted for use in England and Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland," published by H.M. Stationery Office.

Abstract IX shows the deaths classified under the headings of the Intermediate List (slightly amplified in the case of tuberculosis and modified in the case of violent deaths), while the causes shown in Abstracts VIII and XIII and certain of the tables in the text are in accordance with the Short List. The Detailed List numbers have also been given in Abstracts VIII and IX for purpose of reference.

In general in the tables and abstracts, dots (.) are used to indicate "none," and dashes (—) are used to indicate that information cannot be given or that the headings are not applicable.


Throughout the Report, births and deaths have been allocated to the district of normal residence, births having been assigned to the districts containing the normal residence of the parents, and deaths to the districts containing the normal residence of the deceased persons.

8. Marriages. Births, and Deaths Registered.—The results of the years registration, as compared with the figures for 1948, show slight decreases of 0.15 and 0.5 in the marriage and birth rates respectively, and a slight increase of 0.1 in the death rate. The infant mortality rate, which shows a decrease of 1, is the lowest on record. The numbers and rates will be found in Tables A and B on page 9. Further comments will be found under the relative headings below.

MARRIAGES

- 9. Number and Rate.—Marriages registered during the year numbered 9,216 which is 144 less than the previous year. The rate 6.78 per 1,000 of the estimated population is 0.15 below that for the year 1948. Of the total marriages 93.7 per cent. were between bachelors and spinsters, 3.6 per cent. between widowers and spinsters, 1.5 per cent. between bachelors and widows and 1.2 per cent. between widowers and widows. Thus, 4.8 per cent. of the men married during the year were widowers and 2.6 per cent. of the women were widows or, in 8 out of every 100 marriages, one or both of the contracting parties had been married before. It should be noted that for the purpose of these calculations, divorced men and women who marry are included with bachelors and spinsters respectively.
- 10. Ages at Marriage.—The average age of men marrying in 1949 was 29.2 and of women 26.4. During 1948 this age was 30.4 among men and 26.8 among women. Of the contracting parties 5.0 per cent. of the husbands and 19.0 per cent. of the wives were minors, as compared with 4.3 per cent. and 18.2 per cent. respectively in 1948. Further statistics will be found in Abstracts III, IV and V.
- 11. Method of Celebration.—Table D shows for Northern Ireland the marriages registered during the years 1927, 1937 and 1943 to 1949 according to methods of celebration. The religious denominations are placed in the order of the number of members at the last Census.

It will be observed that the decrease in the number of marriages in 1949 is distributed over all denominations. Marriages taking place in Registrars' Offices in the year under review represented 7.9 per cent. of the total marriages as compared with 7.6 in the previous year and 6.7 per cent. in 1930.

12. Signatures by "Mark."—Of the 18,432 persons married only eight signed the registers or certificates by "mark," as compared with 17 in the previous year and 130 in 1935.

BIRTHS

13. Number and Rate.—The births registered during the year numbered 29,106, a decrease of 426 as compared with the previous year. The birth rate was 21.4 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.5 below the rate for the previous year. Illegitimate births numbered 1,066, a decrease of 6 as compared with the number recorded for 1948; the proportion to total births (3.66 per cent.) being 0.03 above that for the previous year. In England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic, the illegitimate births as percentages of the total births in the year 1949 were 4.97, 5.46 and 3.1 respectively.



- 14. Proportion of Males to Females.—Births of males in Northern Ireland in 1949 numbered 15,027 and those of females 14,079; the proportion of male to female births was therefore 1,067 to 1,000. The corresponding proportions for each of the years 1944-48 were 1,052, 1,063, 1,056, 1,050 and 1,070 respectively.
- 15. Multiple Births.—Of the 29,106 children whose births were registered during the year, 28,351 were born singly, 740 children were twins, and 15 were triplets. Thus, there were 370 births of twins and 5 of triplets during 1949, compared with 362 and 6 respectively during 1948. Still-births not being registered in Northern Ireland, a birth of one live child and one still-born child is regarded as a single birth, a birth of two live children and one still-born child as a twin birth, and so on.

DEATHS

16. Number and Rate.—The number of civilian deaths recorded during the year 1949, and the civilian death rate per 1,000 of the population, were 15,652 and 11.5 respectively. The comparative figures for 1948 were 15,125 and 11.2.


Of the total deaths, 7,930 were of males and 7,722 were of females, the equivalent annual death rates being 12.0 and 11.1 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations, respectively. The corresponding rates for 1948 were 11.7 and 10.7.

According to the ages stated to Registrars, 9.9 per cent. of the total deaths were of children under 5 years of age and 59.7 per cent. were of persons aged 65 and upwards. There were 69 deaths of persons (31 males and 38 females) aged 95 and upwards; 6 of these deaths (1 male and 5 females) were of persons whose ages at death were returned as 100 years and upwards. The age of the male was given as 100, and the ages of the females were given as 3 at 100, 1 at 102 and 1 at 103.

- 17. Deaths in Hospitals.—The number of deaths occurring in hospitals in each of the years 1939-49 are shown in Abstract X. 32.6 per cent. of the deaths registered in 1949 took place in hospitals (2.6 per cent. in public mental hospitals and 30.0 in other hospitals), and the remaining 67.4 per cent. occurred in the deceased person's own home, in private nursing homes, or in places other than hospitals. The percentage of deaths taking place in hospitals has risen from 17.0 in 1924 to 32.6 in 1949.
- 18. Proportion of Deaths from the Principal Causes.— Abstract XIII shows the deaths from the principal causes as proportions per 1,000 of the total deaths in certain age groups. It will be seen from this abstract that, for all ages taken together, heart disease bears the greatest proportion to the total deaths, which is the usual experience; and that the deaths from this cause occur mainly among persons of fairly advanced ages. The proportions were high also for cancer, intra-cranial vascular lesions, tuberculosis, pneumonia and bronchitis.

At ages under one year, apart from congenital malformations, etc., and premature birth, the highest proportions of deaths were caused by pneumonia and diarrhoea.

Between the ages of one and ten the highest proportions were caused by tuberculosis (the deaths from which are mainly due to tuberculosis of the central nervous system), pneumonia, the common infectious diseases, road traffic accidents, diseases of the digestive system, and congenital malformations, etc.

Between the ages of ten and thirty-five, tuberculosis (principally of the respiratory system) caused by far the largest proportion of deaths.

From age thirty-five onwards, heart disease, cancer, intra-cranial vascular lesions, tuberculosis, bronchitis, nephritis, pneumonia and diseases of the digestive system were responsible for the largest proportions of the total mortality.

Table F shows for each of the principal causes the numbers of deaths and the death rates for each year since 1946, together with corresponding particulars for the Irish Republic in respect of the year 1949.

19. Deaths from the Principal Epidemic Diseases*.—The deaths from diseases in this group numbered 332, representing 2.1 per cent. of the total deaths. The corresponding figures for the year 1948 were 286 and 1.9.

There were, as usual, no deaths from typhus and there have been no deaths from smallpox in Northern Ireland since 1920. Deaths from diphtheria in 1949 numbered 10, as compared with 135 in the year 1922. Of the remaining diseases in this group, the numbers of deaths from influenza, dysentery and diarrhoeal diseases of children under 2 years show increases, and those of deaths from typhoid and paratyphoid fevers, scarlet fever, whooping cough and measles show decreases when compared with the figures for 1948.

The notifications of certain infectious diseases for each District in Northern Ireland for the year 1949 are shown in Abstract XVIII, and the diseases named are those laid down by Regulations (issued by the Ministry of Health and Local Government) as compulsorily notifiable throughout Northern Ireland. The Abstract does not include certain diseases of which no cases were notified during the year. It should be noted that, as regards measles and whooping cough, only the first case of either of these diseases in a household during each outbreak is required to be notified, unless a period of 2 months intervenes in the case of the former disease and 3 months in the case of the latter.

20. Influenza.—The deaths from influenza during the year numbered 97, giving a rate of 0.07 per 1,000 of the population, compared with a rate of 0.06 for the year 1948. As is usually the case, mortality from this disease was highest in the first quarter of the year, 50.5 per cent. of the total deaths being registered in that quarter.

Typhoid and paratyphoid fevers, scarlet fever, whooping cough, diphtheria, dysentery, influenza, smallpox, measles, typhus, and diarrhoeal diseases of children under 2 years of age.



21. Tuberculosis.—The death rate from this cause of 0.59 per 1,000 of the population is 0.10 below the rate for 1948. The death rate for 1949 is the lowest ever recorded, the next lowest being that for 1948. Diagram IV shows that the death rate in Northern Ireland from all forms of tuberculosis has declined very steadily since 1922. The only break in the general trend of improvement occurs during the period covered by the war years, and it will be noticed from the diagram that this rise was experienced in all other parts of the British Isles. The corresponding rates for England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic in 1949 were 0.46, 0.67 and 0.91 respectively.

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From Abstract XIII it will be seen that tuberculous diseases have caused 401 deaths in every 1,000 between the ages of 15 and 25, and 372 per 1,000 between 25 and 35. Further, from Abstract IX it appears that 36 per cent. of the deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease during 1949 occurred between the ages of 15 and 35, as compared with 44 per cent. in 1948.

Tuberculosis is in general more prevalent in the cities and towns than in the country districts. In 1949 the rate per 1,000 of the population for all urban areas was 0.65 and for rural areas 0.53. The rates in 1948 were 0.76 and 0.61 respectively.

Tuberculosis of the respiratory system accounted for 81.3 per cent. of the total deaths from tuberculosis, as compared with 76.3 per cent. in 1948.

The Abstracts of causes of death give particulars regarding the sexes and ages of the persons who died from the various forms of tuberculous disease during the year, and also the deaths from tuberculosis allocated to each county and to each of the principal towns in Northern Ireland.

Table G affords comparison of the summarised figures for 1949 with those for certain preceding years. Table H shows comparisons of the summarised figures for each of the six counties of Northern Ireland and Belfast and Londonderry County Boroughs.

22. Cancer.—The number of deaths from cancer in Northern Ireland during 1949 was 1,964, giving a death rate of 1.44 per 1,000 of the population, which is the same as the rate for 1948. From Diagram V. it can be seen that the general tendency has been for this rate to show a more or less steady increase.

Diagram VI compares the death rates from tuberculosis and cancer; and from this it can be seen that, prior to 1931, tuberculosis accounted for a greater number of deaths, whereas since that date cancer has proved the more dangerous.

The death rates from cancer among males and females were 1.49 and 1.41 respectively. In 1948 the male and female rates were 1.42 and 1.49 respectively.

The most frequent sites of fatal cancer among males during the year were stomach, 216; intestines, 134; prostate, 90; rectum, 88; lungs, 84; and pancreas, 45. Among females the most frequent sites were breast, 179; stomach, 171; intestines, 109; uterus, 102; rectum, 57; ovary, 41; and liver and gall bladder, 38.

Abstract XIV gives particulars regarding sex, age and sites of fatal cancer during the year 1949.

- 23. Cerebral Haemorrhage, Apoplexy, etc.—The deaths assigned to this group (now described as "Intra-cranial vascular lesions") numbered 1,680, giving a rate of 1.24 per 1,000 of the population. This rate is 0.09 above that for 1948.
- 24. Heart Disease.—The deaths from the various forms of heart disease during the year numbered 4,672, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 3.44, which is 0.25 above that for the previous year. The death rate from this disease has been more or less steadily increasing over a number of years.
- 25. Bronchitis.—The deaths from bronchitis during the year numbered 512, giving a rate of 0.38 per 1,000 of the population, which is the same as the rate for 1948.
- 26. Pneumonia.—There were 626 deaths from pneumonia during 1949, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 0.46.

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DIAGRAM VI.—Death Rates from Tuberculosis and Cancer in Northern Ireland, 1926-1949.



27. Pregnancy and Childbirth.—The mortality of women during pregnancy and childbirth is classified under two headings, namely—
(1) diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and puerperal state, and (2) diseases or causes combined with pregnancy or childbirth. The causes of death shown in Table J are those to which the various deaths were assigned.

From Table K it will be seen that the deaths from diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state in 1949 yielded a rate of 1.30 per 1,000 live births, which is a decrease of 0.22 as compared with the rate for 1948. The rate for 1949 is the lowest on record. The next lowest rate (1.52) was that recorded for 1948.

The rate for diseases combined with pregnancy and childbirth was 0.34 per 1,000 live births which is the same as that for the previous year.



Table L shows the number of deaths from puerperal diseases distinguishing puerperal and post-abortive sepsis, with corresponding rates for the aggregates of the Urban and Rural Areas and the County Boroughs in Northern Ireland for the year 1949 and for the average of the years 1944 to 1948. From this it will be seen that the rates for all puerperal diseases show an improvement on the average annual rates for the preceding five years.

28. Violent Deaths.—The number of deaths ascribed to violence during the year was 484 (316 males and 168 females), which is an increase of 28 on the number registered for 1948, and is equivalent to 3.1 per cent. of the total deaths registered. Of these 484 deaths, 5 were attributed to homicide, 56 to suicide, and 423 to accidental causes.



Included in the 42 deaths from drowning, shown in Table M, there were 14 cases (12 males and 2 females) in which the Coroners returned a verdict of "found drowned." It is possible that some of these deaths were due to suicide.

Of the 43 deaths from burns and scalds, 17 were of children under 5 years of age.

29. Uncertified Deaths.—The deaths registered as uncertified, i.e., those in which there was neither a medical attendant during the last illness nor an inquest held by a coroner, numbered 334, representing 2.1 per cent. of the total deaths registered. The percentage of uncertified deaths has been falling rapidly during the past twenty years. In 1929 uncertified deaths represented 9.1 per cent. of the total deaths.

Of the total deaths in rural areas 200, or 2.7 per cent., were uncertified; in urban areas the number was 134, or 1.6 per cent.

Deaths of persons aged 65 years and upwards represented 68.0 per cent. of the uncertified cases, and deaths of infants under 1 year of age 7.2 per cent.

- 30. Inquests.—The circumstances of 873 deaths were considered by the coroners in 1949, including 202 of the uncertified deaths referred to in the previous paragraph. Inquests were held in 517 of these cases, which represents one inquest for every 30 deaths registered. In 1948 the inquests numbered 508.
- 31. Infant Mortality.—Deaths of infants under 1 year of age numbered 1,317, or 45 per 1,000 live births registered. This rate is the lowest ever recorded in Northern Ireland, the rate for the year 1948 (46) being the next lowest. Of the 1,317 deaths of infants under 1 year of age, 731 were of males and 586 of females, the former number being equivalent to 49 per 1,000 live births of males and the latter to 42 per 1,000 live births of females. The corresponding rates for 1948 were 53 and 38 respectively.

The infant mortality rate for the aggregate of the Urban Districts of Northern Ireland in 1949 was 51 per 1,000 live births, and the rate for the aggregate of the Rural Districts was 38 per 1,000, the corresponding rates for 1948 being 46 and 45 respectively.

In 1949 and 1948 the rates for deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 32 and 34 per 1,000 live births, respectively, for England and Wales; 41 and 45 for Scotland; and 53 and 50 for the Irish Republic.



In Table N the infant mortality rates for Belfast and Londonderry County Boroughs are compared with those for towns of approximately the same populations in Great Britain. Whilst the rates for these Northern Ireland towns do not yet compare favourably with those for cross-channel towns of comparable size, there has been an immense reduction since 1942 when the rates were: Belfast 92, Londonderry 90.

Abstract XV gives the infant mortality rates for Northern Ireland for each of the six years 1944-49, by causes of death, and, for the last of these years, by sexes and age-periods.

Abstract XVI compares the infant mortality rates for the aggregate of the urban areas with those for the aggregate of the rural areas of Northern Ireland. The differences usually found between urban and rural rates and between male and female rates are marked, the urban rates being, in general, appreciably in excess of the corresponding rural rates.

The infant mortality rate for Belfast County Borough for 1949 was 56. The corresponding rates for each of the years 1944 to 1948 were 89, 84, 61, 60 and 45 respectively. Abstract XVI gives the infant mortality rates for Belfast County Borough, for each of the six years 1944-49, by the principal causes of death. The rates for the year 1949 are given also by sexes and age-periods.

Abstract VIII gives the number of infant deaths, together with the number of births, for each County and for each of the principal towns in Northern Ireland. Figures for the aggregates of urban and rural areas are also given.

32. Mortality among Illegitimate Children.—Deaths of Illegitimate children under 1 year of age numbered 82 in 1949, which is equivalent to a rate of 77 per 1,000 of the illegitimate live births registered, as compared with a rate of 92 for the previous year. The corresponding rate for legitimate children was 44 per 1,000 live births in each of the years 1948 and 1949.

Abstract XVII shows the deaths of illegitimate children by the principal causes and for age-periods in 1949, together with the mortality rates among illegitimate children for each of the years 1944-49. Most of these rates are considerably in excess of the corresponding rates for all children; particularly the rates for diarrhoea and enteritis, congenital debility, pneumonia and congenital malformations. It should, however, be noted that the rates for some of the causes are based on very small numbers of deaths.

POPULATION.

The civilian population of Northern Ireland was estimated at 1,360,000 which represents the position as at 30th June, 1949, and the rates in this Report (relating to 1949) for the country as a whole have been based on this estimate. The rates for 1949 for the various divisions of the country have also been based on the civilian estimated population as at mid-year, 1949. The 1937 Census population figures for the counties and principal towns of Northern Ireland are given at the foot of Abstract VIII.

THE WEATHER.

Reports on the weather experienced in Northern Ireland during each month of the year 1949, as furnished by the Director of the Meteorological Office, England, are published in the Quarterly Returns of Births, Deaths, and Marriages for that year. Table O shows for the stations of Armagh, Garvagh and Aldergrove the Average Air Temperature, Rainfall, and Sunshine in 1949.

The year 1949 was exceptionally warm, the mean temperature for each month exceeding the average except in May when it equalled the average. Among outstanding features were the unusually warm April, the long warm spell from June 21st to mid October, the exceptionally sunny June, the dry period during the summer months from June to September, and the excessive rainfall in October and December. Mean temperature for the year exceeded the average by 2.00F., whilst the general rainfall was 99 per cent. of the average and sunshine 107 per cent. of the average.

January was mild on the whole and rather dull. The general rainfall was slightly above the average for the period 1881-1915, percentages of the average increasing north-westward from less than 75 in the east of County Down to more than 150 around Londonderry. In contrast February was appreciably sunnier than usual for the time of year. It was generally mild, with rainfall about average over the Province as a whole. Percentages of the average rainfall increased westward from less than 50 in the east of County Down to more than 125 in an area extending from Omagh to Londonderry. March was rather dry and sunny, with mean temperature somewhat above the average. The latter part of the month was very dry, little or no rain falling from the 21st to 31st inclusive. The weather of April was warm and unsettled; it was very wet in the west and north-west. A cool spell occurred from approximately the 6th to 10th, but it was very warm from the 13th to 17th and on the 27th. May was sunny and rather dry on the whole, with mean temperature equal to the average. The percentage of the average rainfall was less than 75 in the east, while more than 125 per cent. occurred in a small area extending from Londonderry to Omagh. June was warm, dry and exceptionally sunny. It was very warm from the 21st to 30th; the maximum temperature at Armagh on the 23rd, 83oF., equalled the highest value registered there in June, in a record going back to 1871. Sunshine was 147 per cent. of the 1906-35 average; at Armagh, apart from June, 1940, the total sunshine was the highest for June since before 1900. During the ten days 17th to 26th the mean daily duration was 13.8 hours at Hillsborough, 13.5 at Aldergrove, and 13.2 at Armagh.

July and August were rather warm and dry, with somewhat deficient sunshine. The first 11 days of August and the period 16th to 18th were rather cool, but from the 19th or 20th onward it was warm. The total sunshine in August was less than half of that registered in June. The weather of September was distinguished by exceptional warmth for the season; it was also unusually sunny and dry on the whole. October was exceptionally warm during the first half of the month, with a cold spell at the end. The mean temperature for the weeks ending on the 8th and 15th was 8.00F., and 9.10F., respectively above the average. Temperature fell rapidly on the 25th and the period 25th to 29th was cold. It was dull on the whole and excessively wet, the wettest day in most places being the 25th, when 3.15 in. was registered at Donaghadee. November was unsettled and rather mild. Both sunshine and rainfall somewhat exceeded the average. The weather of December was unsettled and wet, with rather frequent strong winds, and local gales at times. Mean temperature exceeded the average on the whole; it was very mild for the season during the first and last weeks but cold on the 8th to 12th, 17th and 19th to 21st.

The table gives the monthly deviation from the average mean temperature in degrees Fahrenheit and the monthly rainfall and sunshine expressed as percentage of the the average.
