Thirtieth Annual Report of the Registrar-General for Northern Ireland

ADMINISTRATION

1. Introductory.—The administrative functions of the office of the Registrar-General comprise the registration of births, deaths, marriages and adoptions, and the provision or supervision of machinery for dealing with preliminaries to marriages other than those according to the rites of the Roman Catholic Church.

2. Buildings licensed or registered for Marriages.—The numbers of places of worship (other than those belonging to the Roman Catholic Church) in which marriages could be solemnised, as at 31st December in each of the years 1949, 1950 and 1951 were as follows :—

3. State of Registration.—The measures adopted for particulars of births notified under the Notification of Births Act, 1907, to be furnished to Registrars in the two County Boroughs have continued to be of value in securing the registration of a number of births which had not been registered within the prescribed period of 6 weeks. In connection with the registration of deaths, returns of burials made to Registrars by Clerks of Burial Boards and Cemetery Companies have been of considerable assistance.

Births and deaths not registered within a year of their occurrence can be recorded only with the authority of the Registrar-General. During 1951 such authority was granted for the registration of 49 births, as compared with 71 in 1950 and 105 in 1949. The registration of 7 deaths was authorised as compared with 8 in 1950 and 10 in 1949.

4. Legitimacy Act (N.I.), 1928.—Under this Act an illegitimate child whose parents have married is, subject to certain conditions, legitimated, and the Registrar-General is empowered to authorise the re-registration of the birth. During 1951 the re-registration of the births of 133 children was authorised under the Act, the figures for 1950 and 1949 being 149 and 131 respectively.

5. Adoption of Children Act (N.I.), 1950.—Registers of children adopted under the provisions of the above Act and of the previous Adoption Act of 1929 are kept in the General Register Office, to which the Adoption Orders made by the Courts are communicated. A certified copy of an entry in an Adopted Children Register is evidence of adoption, and is also evidence of the date of birth of the adopted child. The children whose adoptions were recorded in the Adopted Children Registers during 1951 numbered 212, whilst the figures for 1950 and 1949 were 168 and 353 respectively.

6. Searches and Certificates.—The original records of births, deaths, and marriages registered in Northern Ireland are, in general, in the custody of local registration officers, who issue annually therefrom many thousands of certificates. An indication of the extent to which Government Departments and the public have utilised the facilities for searching in the indexes and obtaining certificates from records in the General Register Office for Northern Ireland (including the Adopted Children Register) is afforded by the following table :—

7. Verifications.—Requests for the verification of particulars of events registered are received from Government Departments in connection with claims for Family Allowances, Pensions, etc. During the year the number of cases dealt with was 30,225, out of which 24,489 were checked from the records in this office and 5,736 events (where records were not available at headquarters) were referred to local officers.

SUMMARY OF REGISTRATION

8. Introductory.—The figures contained in this Report may be regarded as final, and as superseding the provisional figures already published for the year 1951 in the Registrar-General's weekly and quarterly returns. It should be noted that statistics of deaths for years 1941-1949 relate to civilians only.

The value of the statistical information concerning deaths contained in the Registrar-General's Annual Reports and other publications is to a large extent dependent on the degree of care and accuracy with which the members of the medical profession enter the required particulars on the form of medical certificate of the cause of death. The particulars so given are incorporated in the death entries, and thus in every case in which a person had been attended in his or her last illness by a medical practitioner, the medical certificate given by the latter forms the basis upon which the cause of death is classified.

Comparisons with rates (births, deaths, etc.) recorded in other parts of the British Isles are included in several tables and diagrams. These comparisons are substantially correct but, owing to changes in the mode

of computing population figures in certain countries in certain years, complete accuracy has not been achieved.

For the purposes of this Report the classifications adopted are the Intermediate and Abbreviated Lists contained in the "Manual of the International Statistical Classifications of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Death, 1948."

Abstract VIII shows the deaths classified under the headings of the Intermediate List (slightly modified in the case of neoplasms, certain diseases of early infancy and diseases of pregnancy, etc.), whilst the causes shown in Abstracts IX and XIII and certain tables in the text are in accordance with the Abbreviated List. The Detailed List numbers have also been given in Abstract VIII for the purpose of reference.

In general in the tables and abstracts, dots (.) are used to indicate "none," and dashes (—) are used to indicate that information cannot be given or that the headings are not applicable.

Throughout the Report, births and deaths have been allocated to the district of normal residence, births having been assigned to the districts containing the normal residence of the parents, and deaths to the districts containing the normal residence of the deceased persons.

9. Population.—The home population of Northern Ireland as estimated at 30th June, 1951 was 1,372,624 persons. This estimate, comprising civilians and members of the armed forces stationed in Northern Ireland and based on the census population ascertained on 8th April, 1951, has been used to calculate the rates (relating to 1951) for the country as a whole. The rates for the various divisions of the country have also been based on the estimated home population as at 30th June, 1951.

Table A gives the population figures, as estimated at 30th June, 1951, for Counties and County Boroughs, together with the aggregates of the urban and rural areas. The populations as ascertained at the censuses of 1911, 1926, 1937 and 1951 are also shown. The 1951 census populations for each Local Administrative Area are given in Abstract X.

10. Marriages, Births, and Deaths Registered.— The results of the year's registration, as compared with the figures for 1950, show a slight decrease of 0.3 in the birth rate and increases of 0.2 and 1.2 in the marriage and death rates respectively. The increase in the death rate is considered to be only temporary, as it was mainly due to the severe epidemic of influenza, which occurred in the first few months of the year. It is noteworthy that the infant mortality rate showed only an increase of one over that for 1950, which was the lowest ever recorded. Further comments will be found under the relative headings below.

MARRIAGES

11. Number and Rate.—Marriages registered during the year numbered 9,414 which is 330 more than the previous year. The rate 6.86 per 1,000 of the estimated population is 0.22 above that for the year 1950. Of the total marriages 94.0 per cent. were between bachelors and spinsters, 3.3 per cent. between widowers and spinsters, 1.6 per cent. between bachelors and widows and 1.1 per cent. between widowers and widows. Thus, 4.3 per cent. of the men married during the year were widowers and 2.7 per cent. of the women were widows or, in 7 out of every 100 marriages, one or both of the contracting parties had been married before. It should be noted that for the purpose of these calculations, divorced men and women who marry are included with bachelors and spinsters respectively.

12. Ages at Marriage.—The average age of men marrying in 1951 was 29.7 and of women 26.3. During 1950 this age was 30.0 among men and 26.5 among women. Of the contracting parties 5.4 per cent. of the husbands and 19.4 per cent. of the wives were minors, as compared with 4.8 per cent. and 18.0 per cent. respectively in 1950. Further statistics will be found in Abstracts III, IV and V.

13. Method of Celebration.—Table E shows for Northern Ireland the marriages registered during the years 1927, 1937 and 1945 to 1951 according to methods of celebration. The religious denominations are placed in the order of the number of members at the last Census.

DIAGRAM 1.—Marriage Rates in Northern Ireland, England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic, 1926-51.

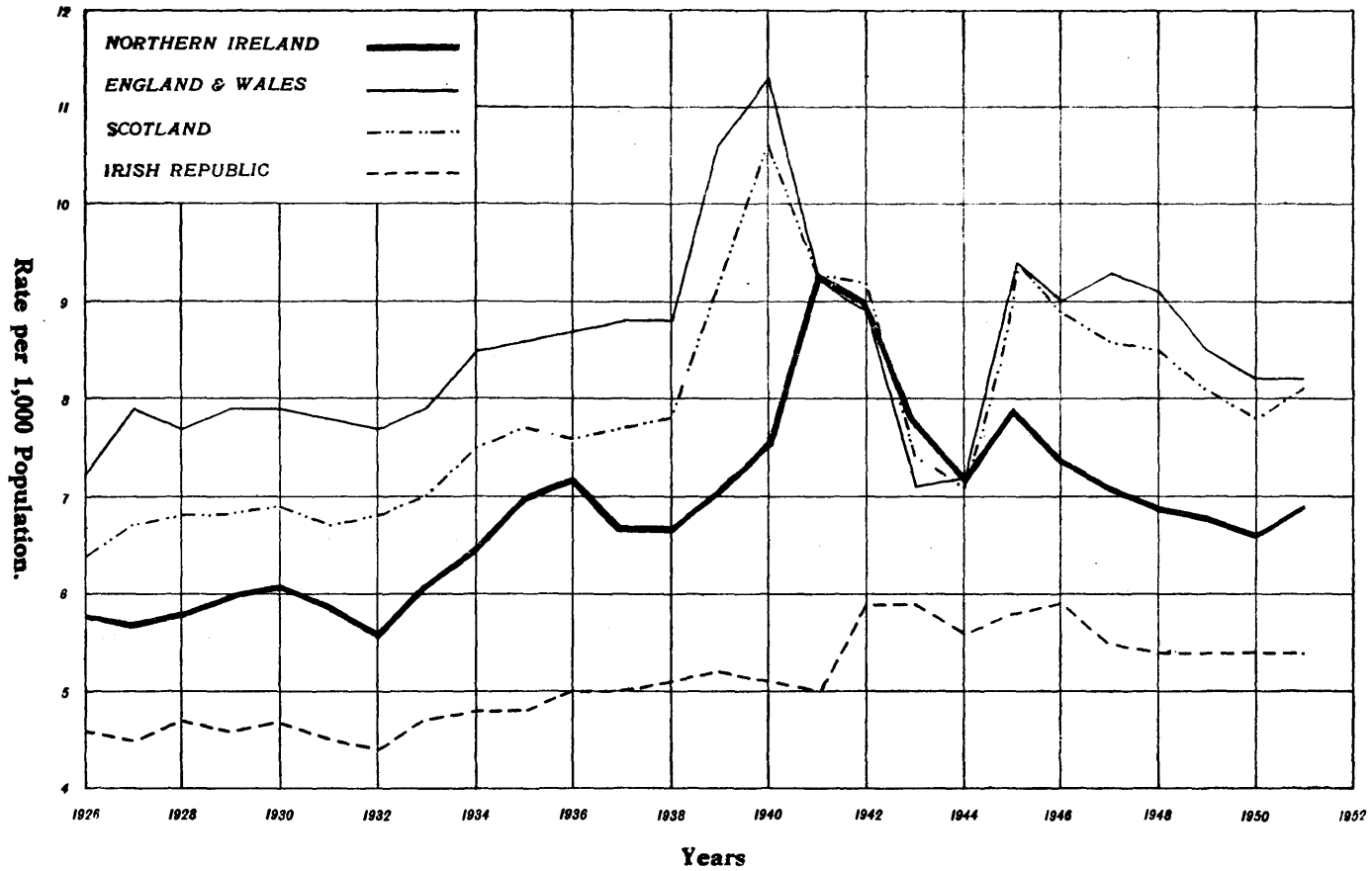

Marriages taking place in Registrars' Offices in the year under review represented 7.4 per cent. of the total marriages as compared with 7.1 in the previous year and 6.7 per cent. in 1930.

14. **Signatures by "Mark."**—Of the 18,828 persons married twenty signed the registers or certificates by "mark," as compared with 130 in 1935.

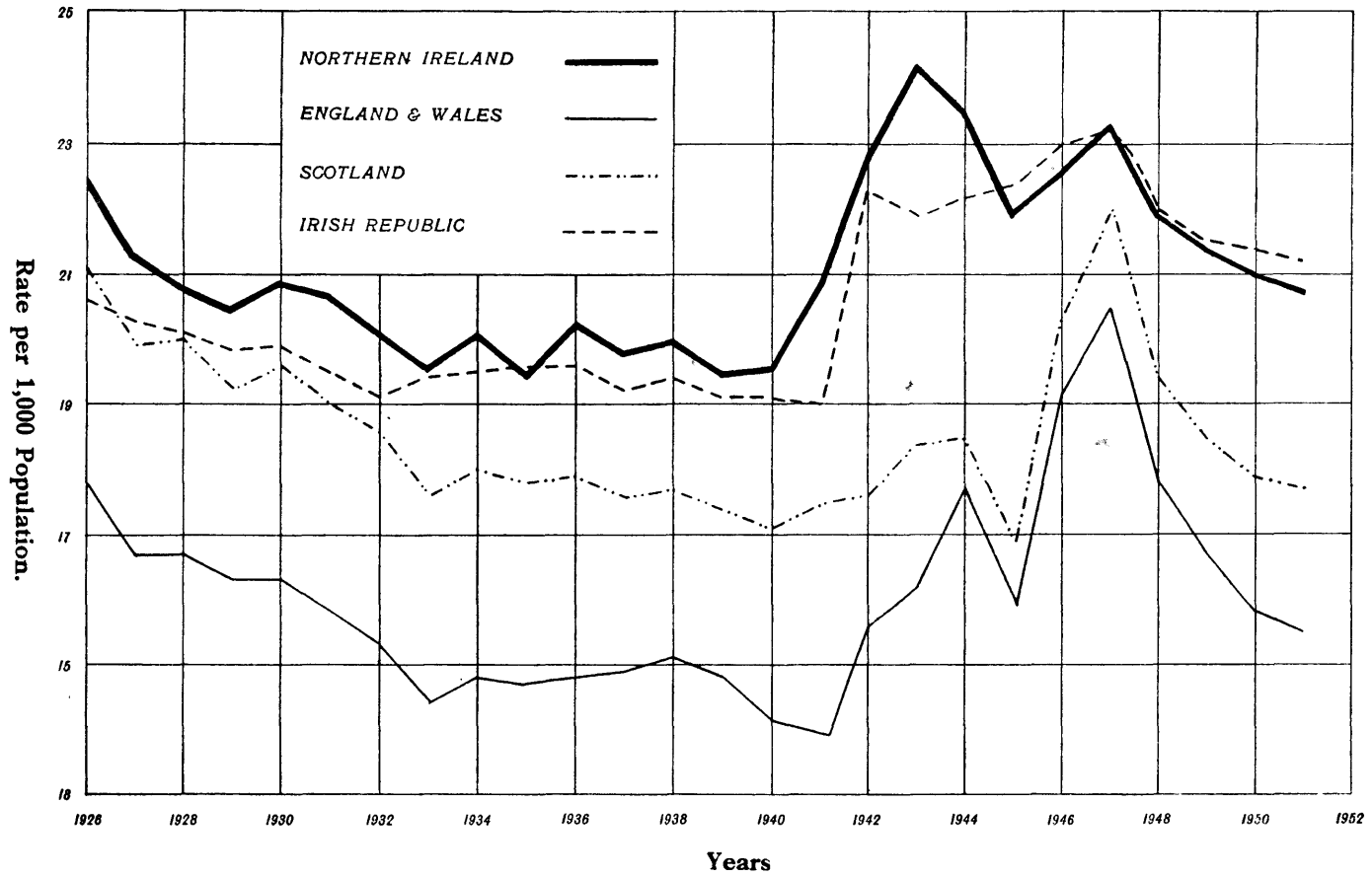
15. **Number and Rate.**—The births registered during the year numbered 28,477, a decrease of 317 as compared with the previous year. The birth rate was 20.7 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.3 below the rate for the previous year. Illegitimate births numbered 895, a decrease of 91 as compared with the number recorded for 1950, the proportion to total births (3.14 per cent.) being 0.28 below that for the previous year. In England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic, the illegitimate births as percentages of the total births in the year 1951 were 4.74, 5.07 and 2.5 respectively.

16. Proportion of Males to Females.—Births of males in Northern Ireland in 1951 numbered 14,639 and those of females 13,838 ; the proportion of male to female births was therefore 1,058 to 1,000. The corresponding proportions for each of the years 1946-50 were 1,056, 1,050, 1,070, 1,067 and 1,073 respectively.

17. Multiple Births.—Of the 28,477 children whose births were registered during the year, 27,711 were born singly, 748 children were twins, and 18 were triplets. Thus, there were 374 births of twins and 6 of triplets during 1951, compared with 365 and 8 respectively during 1950. Still-births not being registered in Northern Ireland, a birth of one live child and one still-born child is regarded as a single birth, a birth of two live children and one still-born child as a twin birth.

DEATHS

18. Number and Rate.—The number of deaths recorded during the year 1951, and the death rate per 1,000 of the population, were 17,628 and 12.8 respectively. The comparative figures for 1950 were 15,839 and 11.6.

Of the total deaths, 8,888 were of males and 8,740 were of females, the equivalent annual death rates being 13.3 and 12.4 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations, respectively. The corresponding rates for 1950 were 12.1 and 11.1.

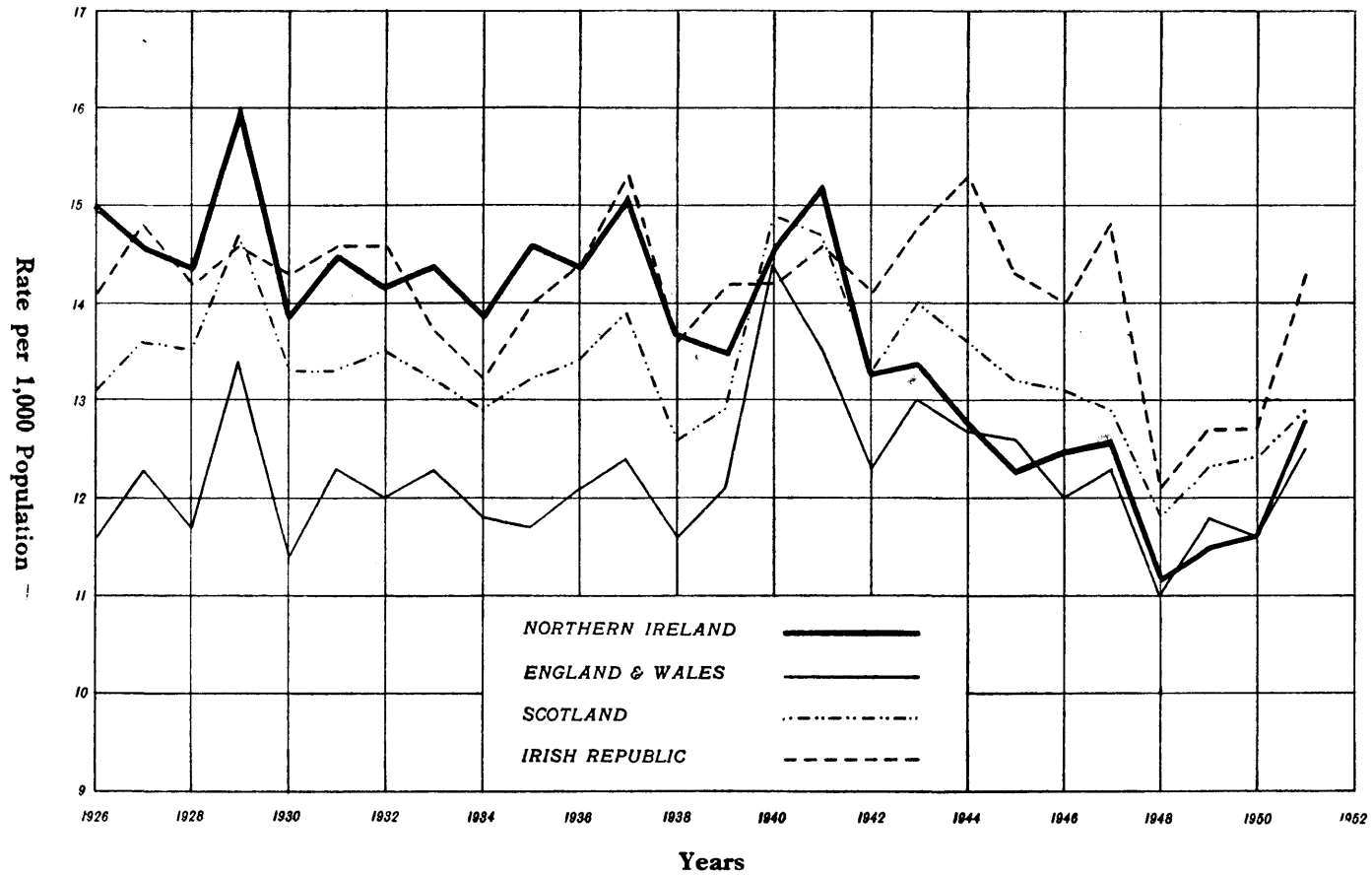
According to the ages stated to Registrars, 7.8 per cent. of the total deaths were of children under 5 years of age and 63.7 per cent. were of persons aged 65 and upwards. There were 104 deaths of persons (35 males and 69 females) aged 95 and upwards ; 8 of these deaths (3 males and 5 females) were of persons whose ages at death were returned as 100 years and upwards. The ages of the males were given as 1 at 100, 1 at 102 and 1 at 105, and the ages of the females were given as 3 at 100, 1 at 101 and 1 at 102.

19. Deaths in Hospitals.—The number of deaths occurring in hospitals in each of the years 1942-51 is shown in Table H. 31.5 per cent. of the deaths registered in 1951 took place in hospitals (2.8 per cent. in public mental hospitals and 28.7 in other hospitals), and the remaining 68.5 per cent. occurred in the deceased person's own home, in private nursing homes, or in places other than hospitals. The percentage of deaths taking place in hospitals has risen from 17.0 in 1924 to 31.5 in 1951.

20. Proportion of Deaths from the Principal Causes.—

Abstract XIII shows the deaths from the principal causes as proportions per 1,000 of the total deaths in certain age groups. It will be seen from this abstract that, for all ages taken together, heart disease bears the greatest proportion to the total deaths, which is the usual experience ; and that the deaths from this cause occur mainly among persons of fairly advanced ages. The proportions were high also for cancer, vascular lesions affecting central nervous system, influenza, pneumonia, bronchitis and tuberculosis.

At ages under one year, apart from congenital malformations and premature birth, the highest proportions of deaths were caused by pneumonia, birth injuries, etc., and diarrhoea.

Between the ages of one and ten the highest proportions were caused by motor vehicle and other accidents, tuberculosis (deaths from which are mainly due to tuberculosis of the central nervous system), diseases of the digestive system, pneumonia and congenital malformations, etc.

Between the ages of ten and thirty-five, tuberculosis (principally of the respiratory system) caused by far the largest proportion of deaths.

From age thirty-five onwards, heart disease, cancer, vascular lesions

affecting central nervous system, tuberculosis, influenza, bronchitis, nephritis, pneumonia and diseases of the digestive system were responsible for the largest proportions of the total mortality.

Table J shows for each of the principal causes the numbers of deaths and the death rates for each year since 1948.

21. Deaths from the Principal Epidemic Diseases*.—The deaths from diseases in this group numbered 1,018, representing 5.8 per cent. of the total deaths. The corresponding figures for the year 1950 were 290 and 1.8. The substantial increase from the previous year was caused by a severe epidemic of influenza which accounted for 883 or 87.8 per cent. of the total deaths in this group.

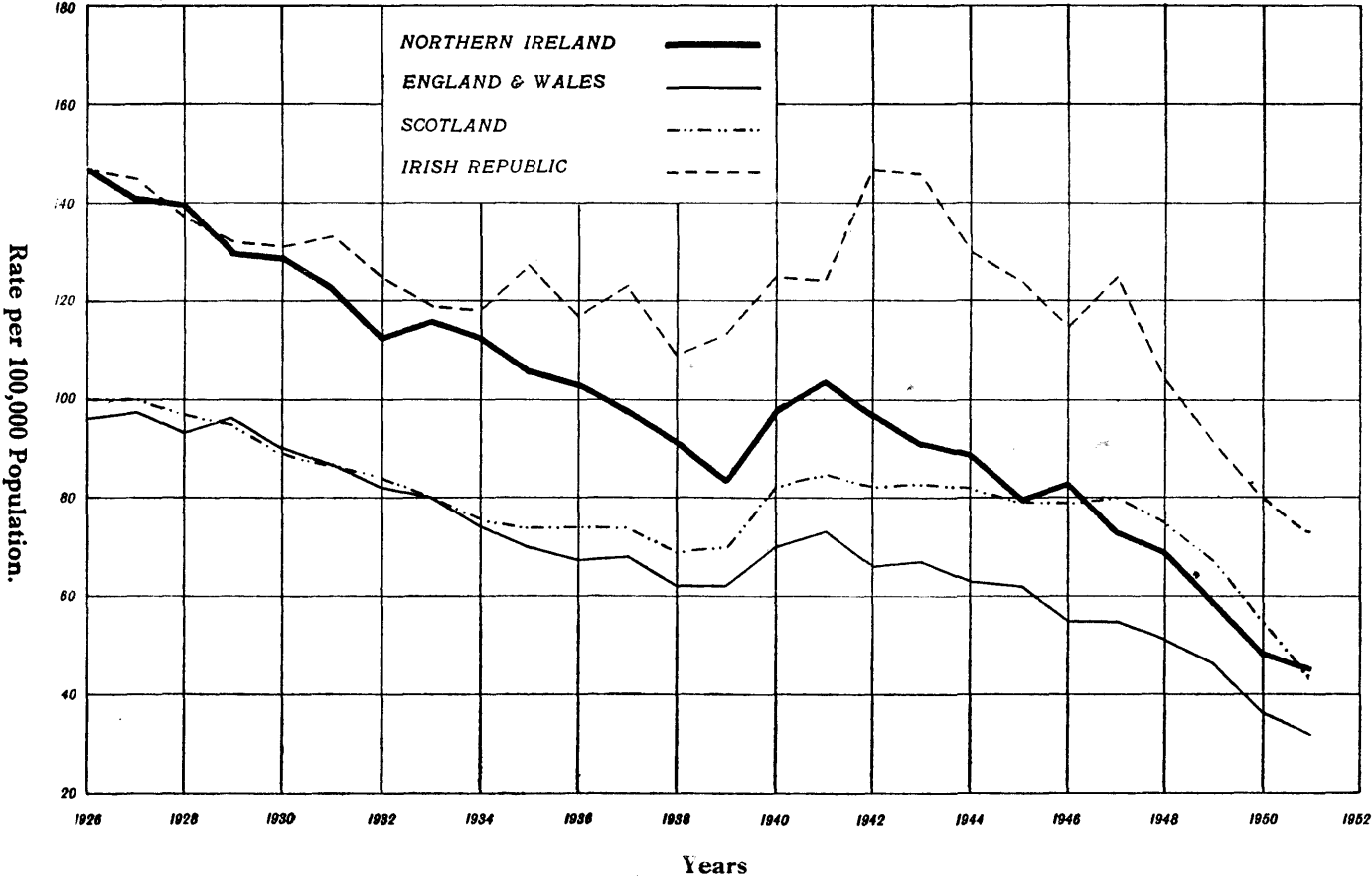
Deaths from diphtheria numbered 2 in 1951, 6 in 1950, 10 in 1949 and 7 in 1948, as compared with 135 in 1922. The number for 1951 is the lowest ever recorded, and the steady decline in the numbers of deaths in recent years is probably the result of immunisation of children against this disease. The number of deaths of children under 2 years of age from diarrhoeal diseases was 87 as compared with 77 for the previous year. The number for 1950 is the lowest ever recorded and that for 1951 the next lowest. Of the remaining diseases in this group, the numbers of deaths from whooping cough and measles show decreases, and those from influenza and dysentery show increases when compared with the figures for 1950.

The notifications of certain infectious diseases for each District in Northern Ireland for the year 1951 are shown in Abstract XX, and the diseases named are those laid down by Regulations (issued by the Ministry of Health and Local Government) as compulsorily notifiable throughout Northern Ireland. The Abstract does not include certain diseases of which no cases were notified during the year. It should be noted that, as regards measles and whooping cough, only the first case of either of these diseases in a household during each outbreak is required to be notified, unless a period of 2 months intervenes in the case of the former disease and 3 months in the case of the latter.

22. Influenza.—As already stated, a severe epidemic of influenza occurred in the first few months of the year. The number of deaths ascribed to influenza was 883, giving a rate of 0.64 per 1,000 population, compared with a rate of 0.11 for the year 1950. This number is the highest recorded since the severe epidemic of 1937 when 1,148 deaths were assigned to influenza. As is usually the case, mortality from this disease was the highest in the first quarter of the year, and formed 93.7 per cent. of the total deaths registered in that quarter.

* Typhoid and paratyphoid fevers, scarlet fever, whooping cough, diphtheria, dysentery, influenza, smallpox, measles, typhus, and diarrhoeal diseases of children under 2 years of age.

23. Tuberculosis.—The death rate from this cause of 0.45 per 1,000 of the population is 0.03 below the rate for 1950. The death rate for 1951 is the lowest ever recorded, the next lowest being that for 1950. Diagram IV shows that the death rate in Northern Ireland from all forms of tuberculosis has declined very steadily since 1922. The only break in the general trend of improvement occurs during the period covered by the war years, and it will be noticed from the diagram that this rise was experienced in all other parts of the British Isles. The corresponding rates for England and Wales, Scotland and the Irish Republic in 1951 were 0.32, 0.43 and 0.73 respectively.

From Abstract XIII it will be seen that tuberculous diseases have caused 315 deaths in every 1,000 between the ages of 15 and 25, and 313 per 1,000 between 25 and 35. Further, from Abstract VIII it appears that 31 per cent. of the deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease during 1951 occurred between the ages of 15 and 35, as compared with 32 per cent. in 1950.

Tuberculosis is in general more prevalent in the cities and towns than in the country districts. In 1951 the rate per 1,000 of the population for all urban areas was 0.55 and for rural areas 0.33. The rates in 1950 were 0.60 and 0.35 respectively.

Tuberculosis of the respiratory system accounted for 80.2 per cent. of the total deaths from tuberculosis, as compared with 79.3 per cent. in 1950.

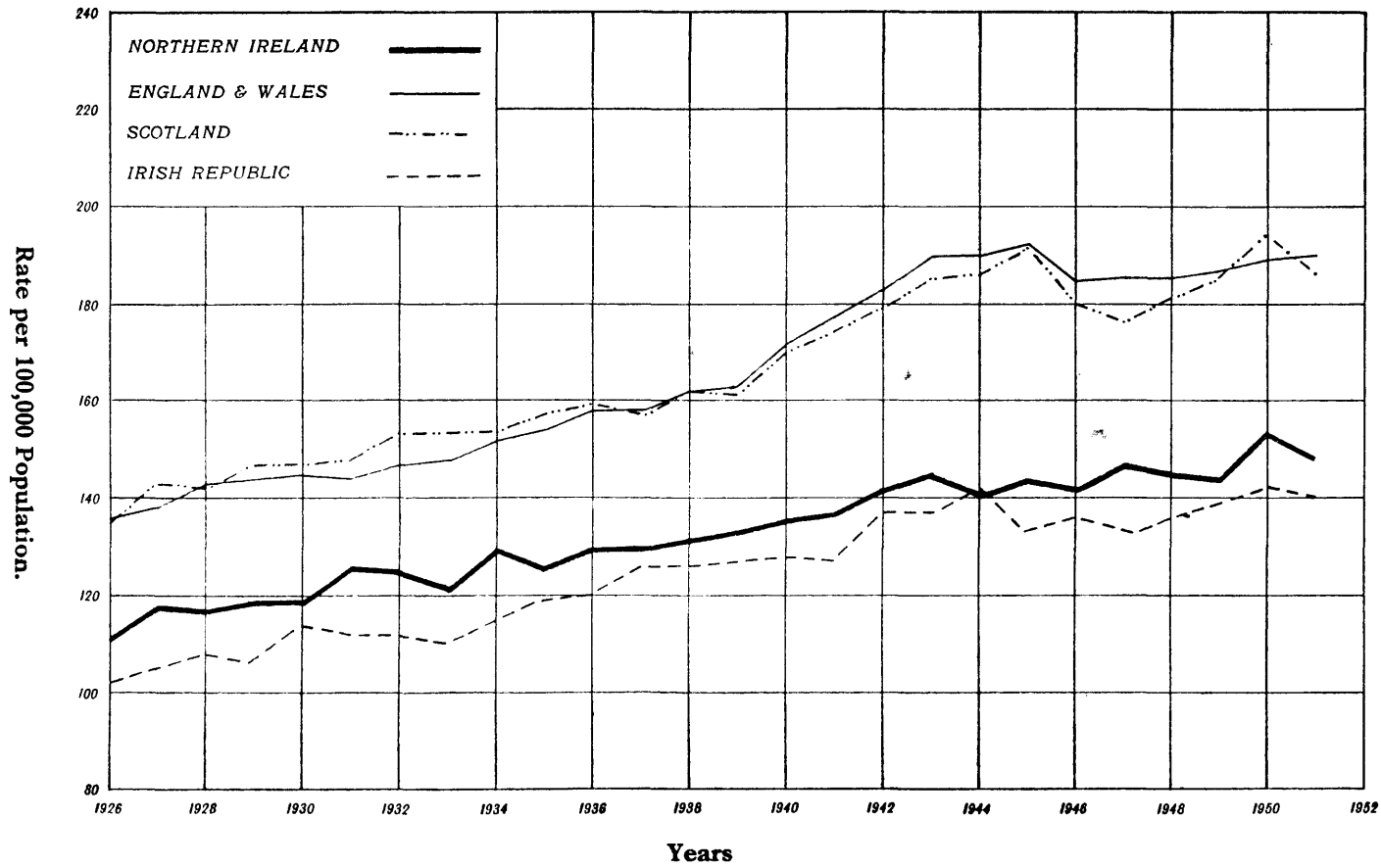

The Abstracts of causes of death give particulars regarding the sexes and ages of the persons who died from the various forms of tuberculous disease during the year, and also the deaths from tuberculosis allocated to each county and to each administrative area in Northern Ireland.

Table K affords comparison of the summarised figures for 1951 with those for certain preceding years. Table L shows comparisons of the summarised figures for each of the six counties of Northern Ireland and Belfast and Londonderry County Boroughs.

24. Cancer.—The number of deaths from cancer in Northern Ireland during 1951 was 2,034, giving a death rate of 1.48 per 1,000 of the population, which is 0.05 below the rate for 1950. From Diagram V. it can be seen that the general tendency has been for this rate to show a more or less steady increase.

Diagram VI compares the death rates from tuberculosis and cancer; and from this it can be seen that, prior to 1931, tuberculosis accounted for a greater number of deaths, whereas since that date cancer has proved the more dangerous.

The death rates from cancer among males and females were 1.56 and 1.41 respectively. In 1950 the male and female rates were 1.57 and 1.49 respectively.

The most frequent sites of fatal cancer among males during the year were stomach, 220; trachea, bronchus and lungs, 154; intestines, 120; prostate, 93; rectum, 84; pancreas, 50; and oesophagus, 45. Among females the most frequent sites were stomach, 197; breast, 157; intestines, 142; uterus, 110; rectum, 50; biliary passages and liver, 47; and ovary, fallopian tube and broad ligaments, 43.

Abstract XIV gives particulars regarding sex, age and sites of fatal cancer during the year 1951. Whilst Abstract XV shows the number of deaths, by sex and site, in each County and County Borough.

25. Cerebral Haemorrhage, Apoplexy, etc.—The deaths assigned to this group (now described as “Vascular lesions affecting central nervous system”) numbered 1,983, giving a rate of 1.44 per 1,000 of the population. This rate is 0.18 above that for 1950.

26. Heart Disease.—The deaths from the various forms of heart disease during the year numbered 5,507, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 4.01, which is 0.33 above that for the previous year. The death rate from this disease has been more or less steadily increasing over a number of years.

27. Bronchitis.—The deaths from bronchitis during the year numbered 642, giving a rate of 0.47 per 1,000 of the population, which is 0.07 above the rate for 1950.

28. Pneumonia.—It should be noted that in the various tables and abstracts deaths from pneumonia are included under two headings. The general heading “Pneumonia” includes deaths of all persons aged over four weeks, and the heading “Infections of the Newborn” includes deaths from pneumonia of children under four weeks old.

Total deaths from pneumonia (under both headings) numbered 810 during the year 1951, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 0.59, compared with a rate of 0.47 in 1950.

DIAGRAM VI.—Death Rates from Tuberculosis and Cancer in Northern Ireland, 1926-1951.

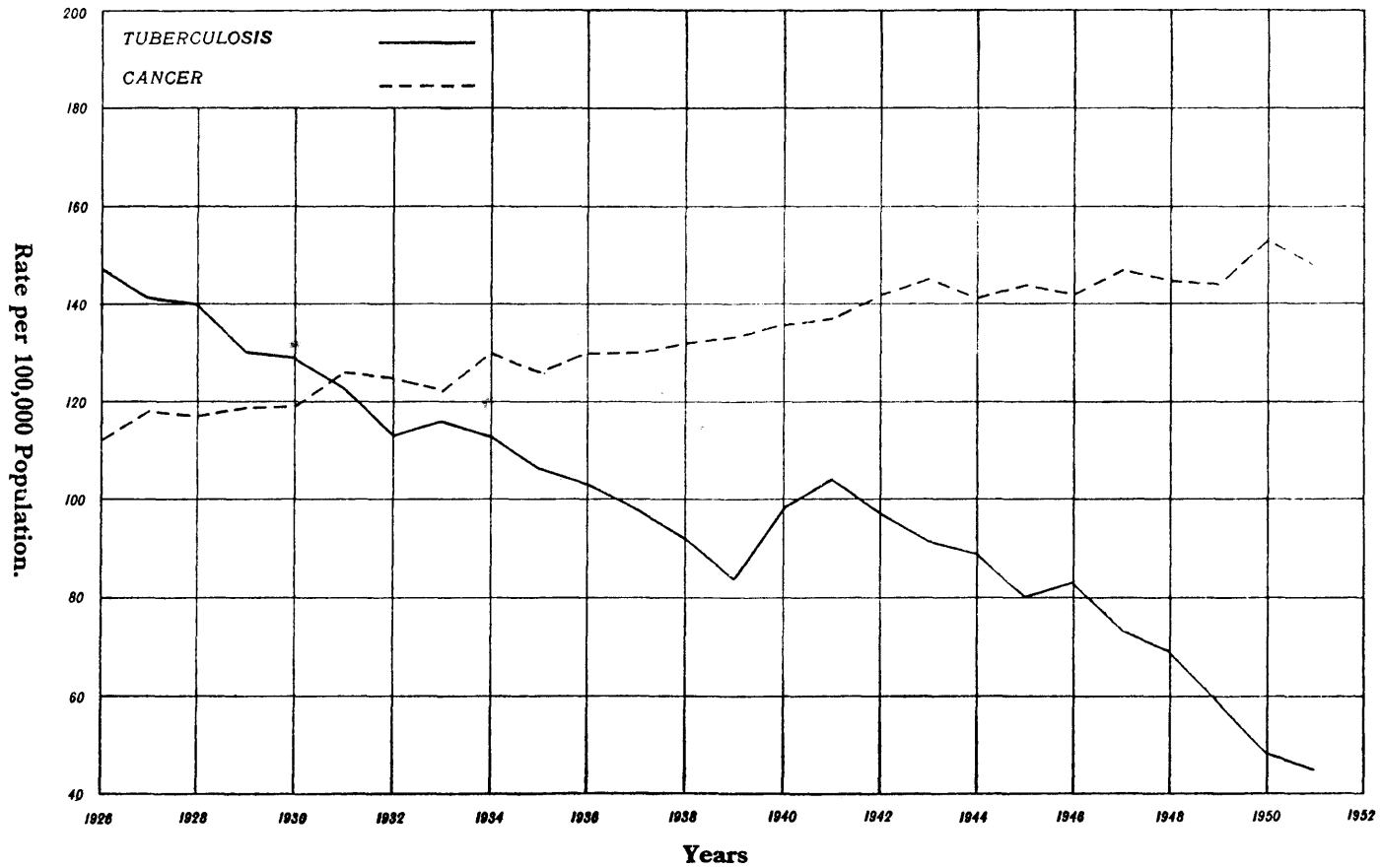

29. **Pregnancy and Childbirth.**—The mortality of women during pregnancy and childbirth is classified under two headings, namely — (1) diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and puerperal state, and (2) diseases or causes combined with pregnancy or childbirth. The causes of death shown in Table O are those to which the various deaths were assigned.

From Table P it will be seen that the deaths from diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state in 1951 yielded a rate of 1.09 per 1,000

live births, which is a decrease of 0.02 as compared with the rate for 1950. The rate for 1951 is the lowest on record. The next lowest rate (1.11) was that recorded for 1950.

The rate for diseases combined with pregnancy and childbirth decreased from 0.31 in 1950 to 0.28 in the year under review.

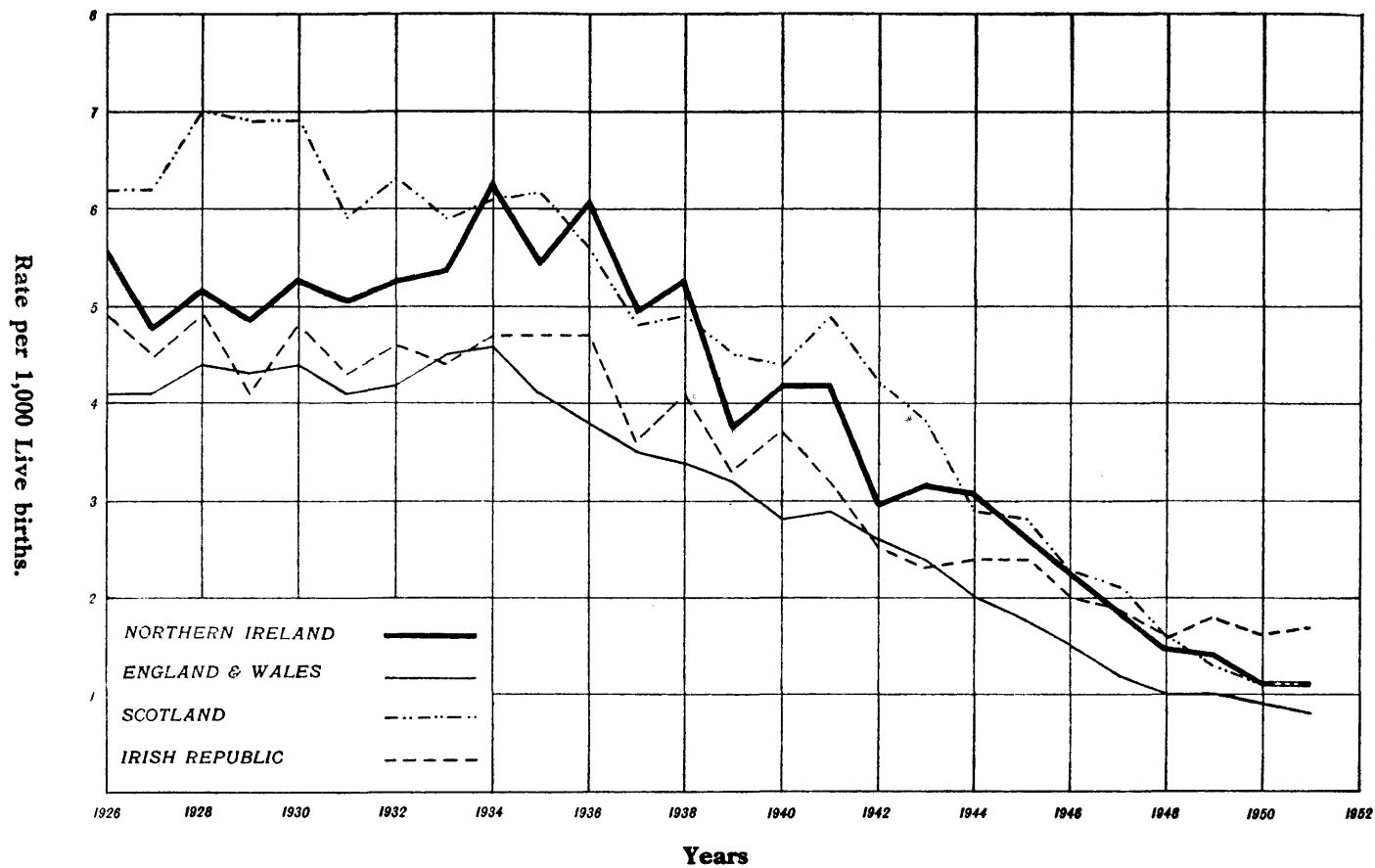

30. Violent Deaths.—Deaths from violence are now classified according to both the external circumstances giving rise to injury, expressed as the "External Cause of Injury", and to the nature of the injury sustained, designated as the "Nature of Injury." Tables R and S show the number of deaths from Violence by the "External Cause of Injury" and "Nature of Injury" respectively.

The number of deaths ascribed to violence during the year was 554 (379 males and 175 females), which is an increase of 24 on the number registered for 1950, and is equivalent to 3.1 per cent. of the total deaths registered. Of these 554 deaths, 4 were attributed to homicide, 56 to suicide, and 494 to accidental causes.

Included in the 54 deaths from drowning, shown in Table R, there were 10 cases (males) in which the Coroners returned a verdict of "found drowned."

Of the 37 deaths from burns and scalds shown in Table S, 11 were of children under 5 years of age.

31. Uncertified Deaths.—The deaths registered as uncertified, i.e., those in which there was neither a medical attendant during the last illness nor an inquest held by a coroner, numbered 312, representing 1.8 per cent. of the total deaths registered. The percentage of uncertified deaths has been falling rapidly during the past twenty years. In 1930 uncertified deaths represented 8.7 per cent. of the total deaths.

Of the total deaths in rural areas 184, or 2.2 per cent., were uncertified ; in urban areas the number was 128, or 1.4 per cent.

Table T shows the number of uncertified deaths in each County and County Borough, distinguishing between those referred to Coroners in respect of which inquests were considered unnecessary, and those not referred to Coroners.

Deaths of persons aged 65 years and upwards represented 63.8 per cent. of the uncertified cases, and deaths of infants under 1 year of age 10.6 per cent.

32. Inquests.—The circumstances of 943 deaths were considered by the Coroners in 1951, including 189 of the uncertified deaths referred to in the previous paragraph. Inquests were held in 564 of these cases, which represents one inquest for every 31 deaths registered. In 1950 the inquests numbered 511.

33. Infant Mortality.—In the text and tables the term “Neo-natal Mortality” relates to deaths of children under 4 weeks of age, and the term “Infant Mortality” to deaths of all children (including Neo-natal) under 1 year of age.

Deaths of infants under 1 year of age numbered 1,173, or 41 per 1,000 live births registered. This rate shows only an increase of one over that for 1950, which was the lowest ever recorded for Northern Ireland. Of the 1,173 deaths of infants under 1 year of age, 651 were of males and 522 of females, the former number being equivalent to 44 per 1,000 live births of males and the latter to 38 per 1,000 live births of females. The corresponding rates for 1950 were 44 and 37 respectively.

The infant mortality rate for the aggregate of the Urban Districts of Northern Ireland in 1951 was 41 per 1,000 live births, and the rate for the aggregate of the Rural Districts was also 41 per 1,000, the corresponding rates for 1950 being 45 and 35 respectively.

In 1951 and 1950 the rates for deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 30 and 30 per 1,000 live births, respectively, for England and Wales ; 37 and 39 for Scotland ; and 46 and 46 for the Irish Republic.

Deaths of infants aged under 4 weeks (" neo-natal " mortality) numbered 700, or 59.7 per cent. of the total deaths of all children under 1 year of age. The corresponding figures for 1950 were 675 and 57.9 per cent. respectively.

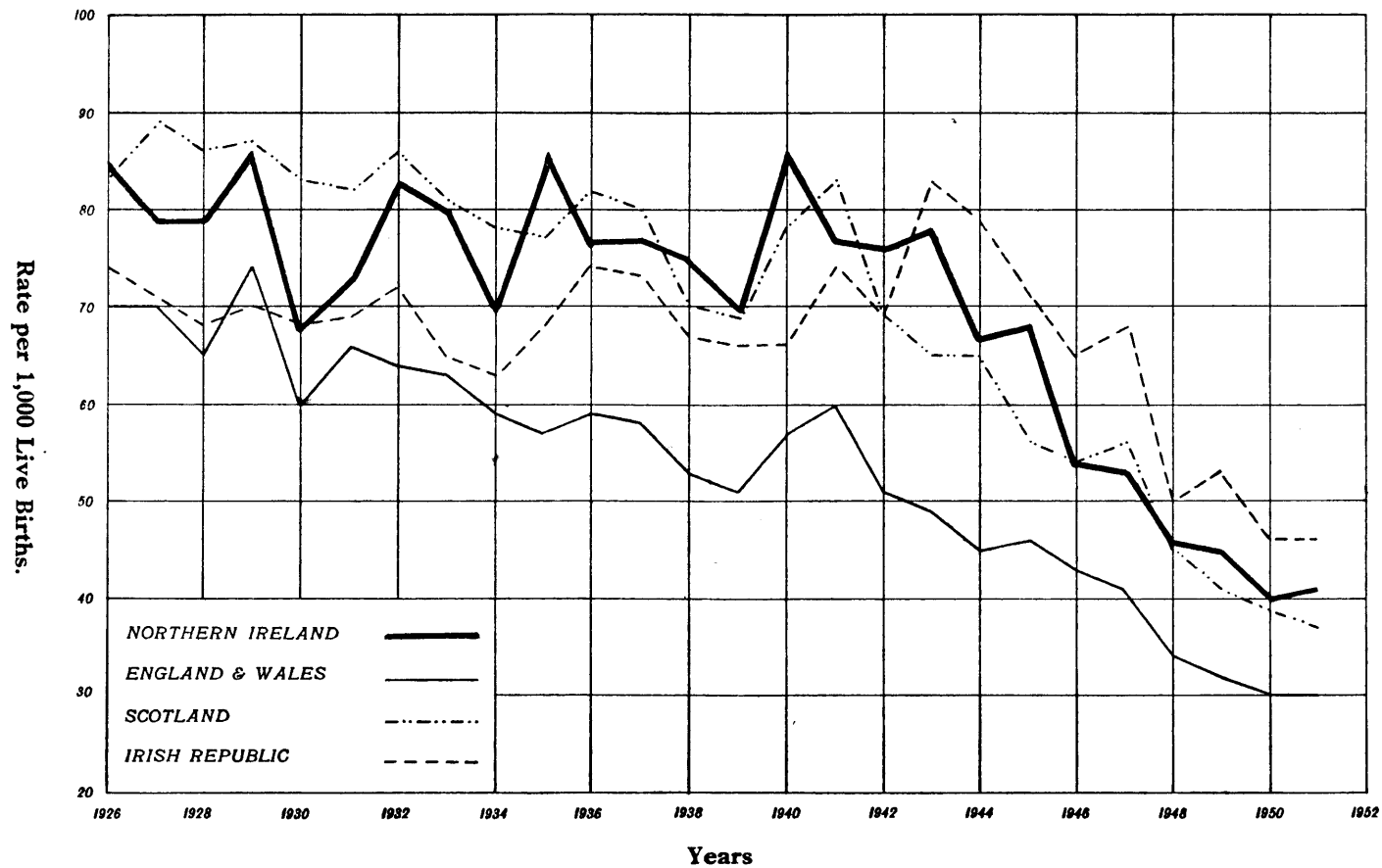
In Table V the infant mortality rates for Belfast and Londonderry County Boroughs are compared with those for towns of approximately the same populations in Great Britain. Whilst the rates for these Northern Ireland towns do not yet compare favourably with those for cross-channel towns of comparable size, there has been an immense reduction since 1942 when the rates were : Belfast 92, Londonderry 90.

Abstract XVII gives the number of deaths of children under 1 year of age for Northern Ireland by Counties and County Boroughs (also for the aggregates of the urban and rural areas) for the years 1948-51. For the last of these years the numbers are given by sexes and age-periods.

The numbers of infant deaths for 1951 by age and causes of death are given in Abstract XVI, together with the numbers by causes for the years 1948-50. The infant mortality rates by causes are also given for the four years 1948-51.

Abstract X gives the number of infant deaths, together with the number of births, for each administrative area in Northern Ireland.

34. Mortality among Illegitimate Children.—Deaths of Illegitimate children under 1 year of age numbered 45 in 1951, which is equivalent to a rate of 50 per 1,000 of the illegitimate live births registered, as compared with a rate of 65 for the previous year. The corresponding rates for legitimate children in 1951 and 1950 were 41 and 40 per 1,000 live births respectively.

Deaths of illegitimate infants aged under 4 weeks (illegitimate neo-natal mortality) numbered 27, representing 60.0 per cent of the total deaths of all illegitimate children under 1 year of age. The corresponding figures for 1950 were 34 and 53.1 per cent. respectively.

Abstract XIX gives the numbers of deaths of illegitimate children under 1 year of age by the principal causes and by age-periods in 1951, together with the numbers by causes for the years 1948-50. The mortality rates by causes are also shown for the four years 1948-51. Most of these rates are considerably in excess of the corresponding rates for all children ; particularly the rates for diarrhoea and enteritis, pneumonia and congenital malformations. It should, however, be noted that the rates for some of the causes are based on very small numbers of deaths.

Abstract XVIII shows the number of deaths of illegitimate children under 1 year of age for Northern Ireland by Counties and County Boroughs, also for the aggregates of the urban and rural areas, for the years 1948-51. The sex and age distribution is shown for the year 1951.

MIGRATION

The population figures ascertained at each Census enable the net migration during the inter-Censal periods to be calculated. The last two Censuses in Northern Ireland were taken on 28th February, 1937, and 8th April, 1951. The following statement reveals that, during the intervening period of a little over 14 years, there was a net outward movement of 67,255 persons. Gross figures for migration inwards and outwards are not available. The table relates to migration to and from all countries, including other parts of the British Isles.

The term "natural increase" represents the excess of births over deaths. The net movement outwards during the two inter-Censal periods immediately preceding the Census of 1937 amounted to : 1911-26, 107,573 persons, and 1926-37, 57,651 persons.

According to returns furnished by the Board of Trade (Statistics Division), the number of emigrants of British nationality from Northern Ireland to countries outside Europe during 1951 was 3,048, and the number of immigrants arriving in Northern Ireland from those countries was 1,042. The following table gives the figures for the years 1936 to 1951, with the exception of the period 1939-1945, during which records were not maintained.

THE WEATHER.

Reports on the weather experienced in Northern Ireland during each month of the year 1951, as furnished by the Director of the Meteorological Office, England, are published in the Quarterly Returns of Births, Deaths, and Marriages for that year. Table X shows for the stations of Armagh, Garvagh and Aldergrove the Average Air Temperature, Rainfall, and Sunshine in 1951.

The year 1951 was somewhat colder than usual with about the average amount of rainfall and sunshine. The first five months were cold, while a characteristic of the summer months was the absence of very warm days. The last four months were mild on the whole, particularly October and November. The spring months April and May were dry and October was notably dry but November was excessively wet. Snow or sleet showers fell frequently during the first four months.

January was rather cold and wet on the whole but sunshine substantially exceeded the average. Snowfall was heavy during the night of December 31st to January 1st ; at 9 hours on January 1st level snow was nearly 8 in.

deep at Aldergrove and snow lay on the ground at Garvagh up to the 7th. *February* was cold, sunny and rather wet. In *March* the weather was again cold and unsettled but in contrast to January and February the duration of bright sunshine was appreciably less than the average. *April* was cool, dry and sunny; winds of a northerly origin were frequent. As in April the weather of *May* was dry, sunny and cool. Winds from between north and east predominated. The week ending on the 10th was notably sunny, the mean daily duration for the week being 10.40 hr. at Aldergrove and 10.76 hr. at Castle Archdale. *June* was sunny, with mean temperature and rainfall about average. The first 10 days were dry and the first 9 exceedingly sunny, the mean daily duration in hours over this period being 11.48 at Castle Archdale, 10.69 at Ballykelly and 10.61 at Armagh. There was no notably warm spell though temperature reached or exceeded 70°F. at times, mainly from the 3rd to the 6th and on the 30th. The maximum at Garvagh on the 4th, 78°F., ° was the highest temperature registered during the year. In strong contrast to June, the weather in *July* was dull; it was also rather wet, with a mean temperature about average. At Aldergrove the mean daily sunshine was only 3.85 hr. as compared with 7.07 hr. in June and 6.95 hr. in May. *August* was unsettled, rather cool and wet on the whole. Less than the average rainfall occurred at Londonderry and in the neighbourhood of the Belfast Lough. Rain occurred frequently, measurable rain being recorded on 29 days at Garvagh and 25 days at Castlerock and Hillsborough. *September* was rather warm and dull, with winds from some southerly point predominating. The distribution of rainfall was variable, percentages of the average at individual stations ranging from 72 at Londonderry to 117 at Seaforde, County Down. In *October* the weather was mild and unusually dry, with about the average amount of sunshine for the time of year. Apart from the dry October of 1946 it was the driest October since comparable records are available, namely 1920. Warm days occurred at times during the first sixteen days, particularly on the 16th when a maximum of 68°F. was registered at Armagh and Holywood. A cold spell occurred from about the 21st to 24th; the 21st and 22nd were particularly cold for the time of year, day temperature failing to reach 45°F. at some places. In marked contrast to October the weather of *November* was excessively wet; it was also mild and exceptionally dull. Rain occurred very frequently in the north; for example, measurable rain fell on 28 days at Castlerock and 27 days at Garvagh. Among heavy falls in 24 hours were 2.62 in. at Glenwherry, County Antrim and 2.20 in. at Dungiven, County Londonderry on the 4th. The duration of bright sunshine was only 64 per cent. of the average; at Aldergrove it was the dullest November since records were started in 1920. *December* was unsettled, wet and rather mild; winds from between south and west predominated and severe gales occurred locally on the 27th, 28th and 30th.

The Table gives the monthly deviation from the average mean temperature in degrees Fahrenheit and the monthly rainfall and sunshine expressed as percentages of the average.
