## **1 1991 CENSUS - Programme of Census Reports**

### **Preliminary**

1.1 This report was published in July 1991 and contained provisional figures of the population and private households for each of the 26 local government districts with a brief statistical commentary.

### **Summary**

1.2 The Summary Report was published in October 1992 and contains information for Northern Ireland and for each of the 26 local government districts. The subjects covered include age distribution, sex, marital status, birthplace, religion, households, tenure, amenities, occupation density, availability of cars, communal establishments, economically active population, employment status, long-term illness, term-time address of students and schoolchildren, and Irish language.

### **Belfast Urban Area**

1.3 The Belfast Urban Area Report was published in December 1992 and contains information to ward level for the Belfast Urban Area as defined by the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland Town and Country Planning Service. The subjects covered include age distribution, sex, marital status, birthplace, religion, households, tenure, amenities, occupation density, availability of cars, communal establishments, economically active population, employment status, long-term illness, term-time address of students and schoolchildren, and Irish language.

### **Religion**

1.4 This report was published in February 1993 and contains information at Northern Ireland level and some to local government districts on the main religious denominations. The subjects covered include population by age, sex, marital status, occupation, industry, and other characteristics.

### **Economic Activity**

1.5 This report contains tables giving the figures for both the economically active and economically inactive population. The employed population is analysed by industry and occupation classifications and relates to age, marital status, employment status, socio-economic groupings, area of workplace, etc. Most tables contain information at Northern Ireland level but some give details for local government districts.

### **Workplace and Transport to Work**

1.6 Employed population details in relation to area of workplace/residence will be contained in this report. Workplace movement by socio-economic group, occupation, industry, and means of transport to work will also be detailed to local government district level.

### **Housing and Household Composition**

1.7 All tables in this report will contain information at Northern Ireland level but some will give details for local government districts. Tables will include information on households, tenure, occupation density, car availability, age, sex, marital status, and will relate household composition to social and other economic characteristics.

### **Migration**

1.8 Numbers and characteristics of the population who changed their usual address in the year before Census day will be contained in this report. Migrant households will be detailed by age, sex, marital status, etc. Some tables will refer to Northern Ireland and others will be detailed to local government districts.

## **Education**

**1.9** This report will contain information at Northern Ireland level by age, sex, occupation, and industry by highest level of academic qualification. Also included will be socio-economic group by religion and economic activity by marital status related to highest level of academic qualification.

## **Irish Language**

**1.10** This report will contain information on the population aged 3 years and over, recorded as having knowledge of Irish language. The tables covered will include knowledge by age, sex, religion, economic position, and highest level of academic qualification to Northern Ireland level.



## 2 Explanatory Notes and Definitions of terms used in the report

### Introduction

- 2.1 Information in this report relates to the economic activity of persons aged 16 years and over in the week ended 20 April 1991.
- 2.2 The tables contain information mainly on occupation, employment status and industry, and these are related to other characteristics such as age, marital status, workplace, socio-economic groupings, etc.

### Administrative Divisions

- 2.3 The local government districts for which statistics are presented in this report are those in existence at the date of the Census.

### Population

2.4 Census results are presented as cross tabulations, each counting a particular population, for example, people, households, families, or people in communal establishments. It is important to know exactly what is being counted, i.e. the population base. Information on whereabouts and usual address given for each person listed on the Census form can be used to derive the population base.

2.5 The **population present on Census night (present population)** in an area is the count of all people recorded as spending Census night in the area regardless of whether or not this was where they usually lived; that is, all persons recorded on the Census H Forms for whom the whereabouts on Census night was given as the relevant household, plus all persons recorded as being in communal establishments.

2.6 The **usually resident population** in an area is the count of those people recorded on the forms for the area as usually living 'at this address' whether or not they are present on Census night.

2.7 **Shipping:** Apart from houseboats (enumerated as private households), vessels were treated in a similar way to communal establishments with a listing form and individual return form for each person on the ship. Persons on naval vessels in Northern Ireland waters or ports on Census night were included as present in the home base port of the ship. Generally persons on other vessels were counted as present in the area in which the form was collected.

2.8 For the 1991 Census there were some minor changes made to the enumeration of shipping. Vessels on coastal trips, fishing voyages and voyages between Great Britain and Northern Ireland were not enumerated. However, foreign registered ships in Northern Ireland ports, excluded in 1981, were enumerated.

### Campers, persons sleeping rough, etc.

2.9 The present population also includes persons not enumerated in private households or communal establishments, for example, persons sleeping rough and persons enumerated in caravans or other non-permanent structures which were not the usual residence.

### Population covered in this Report

2.10 Figures contained in this report refer to the population aged 16 years and over who were usually resident in Northern Ireland.

### Age

2.11 Age is the completed years of age at Census date, as derived from the date of birth question.

## Usual Address

**2.12** In most cases the answer to the usual address question is straightforward. However, students and schoolchildren away from home during term-time were to regard their home address as their usual address. Boarders were to decide whether they considered as their usual address, the address of the relevant household. Household heads, living away from home for part of the week, were to regard their home address as their usual address.

**2.13** Persons who failed to answer the relevant questions appear as part of the usually resident population in the area in which they were enumerated and are included as part of a usually resident private household.

## Visitors to Northern Ireland

**2.14** Visitors to Northern Ireland are those present at the relevant household address on Census night whose usual address is outside Northern Ireland.

## Economic Activity

**2.15** The economic activity tables describe some of the economic characteristics of the population. The characteristics include both those obtained directly from census questions, for example, economic position, and occupation, and others derived from combining answers to census questions on occupation and industry, for example, employment status. Persons on a Government employment or training scheme are regarded as economically active in employment. However, while information about the particular scheme was not collected in the Census, persons on these schemes are included as a separate group in tables which give details on economic position and occupation.

**2.16** Only specified groups were required to answer some of the economic activity questions and this is reflected in the population to which tables refer. Thus:

- (a) Tables relating to economic position include only persons aged 16 years and over.
- (b) Tables relating to occupation cover the economically active.
- (c) Tables relating to employment status cover persons in employment.

## Economic Position

**2.17** The classification by economic position is as follows:

### Economically active

**In employment** means having a job during the week ended 20 April 1991. Temporary, part-time or casual employment is included. Persons absent from their employment due to holiday, strikes, lock-outs, short-time working or temporary stoppages are regarded as in employment. Persons off work sick are regarded as in employment if their jobs are waiting for them on return.

**Out of employment** means seeking work or prevented by temporary sickness from seeking work or waiting to take up a job already accepted.

### Economically inactive

**Looking after the home** means having full-time responsibility for looking after the home.

**Long-term sick/disabled** means being unable to work because of long-term sickness or disability.

**Retired** means wholly retired from employment and no longer seeking paid work.

**Students** are persons in full-time attendance at an educational establishment irrespective of whether or not they may have part-time or seasonal employment.

**Others** are persons economically inactive and include persons in unpaid work in a family business including a shop or farm, or looking after the house or family, or in voluntary work, or never in employment and not seeking work, and those of independent means.

## Employment status

2.18 The classification of employment status is as follows:

### Self-employed

1. With employees.
2. Without employees.

### Employees

1. Managers.
  - (a) extra large establishments.
  - (b) large establishments.
  - (c) small establishments.
2. Foremen and supervisors.
  - (a) manual.
  - (b) non-manual.
3. Professional employees.
4. Other employees.

2.19 Information on occupation is used to distinguish the various types of employees and information on name and business of employer to distinguish the size of the establishment. **Extra large establishments** are those classified as having 500 or more employees. **Large establishments** are those having between 25 and 499 employees. **Small establishments** are those with fewer than 25 employees.

## Classification of Occupations

2.20 The occupation of a person is most often determined by reference to that person's main job at the reference time, but for persons not currently employed it may be determined by reference to the most recent, or most recent main, job. Any given job is assumed to involve a set of typical work activities and to be an instance of a particular occupation.

2.21 Occupation codes are allocated from the answers to question 17 on the Census form. In the tables, occupations are classified according to the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) 1990 issued by the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys and published by HMSO under ISBN 0 11 691284 7 (Vol 1), ISBN 0 11 691285 5 (Vol 2) and ISBN 0 11 691338 X (Vol 3).

**Note:** SOC 90 contains new classifications which may differ from those contained in the Classification of Occupations 1980 (CO 80) which applied to answers given to question 13 on the 1981 Northern Ireland Census form. Consequently it may not be possible to make direct comparisons between 1981 and 1991 Tables.

## Principles of the classification

2.22 The object of the classification is to group together occupations (basically by reference to job titles) which are deemed to be similar, taking simultaneous account of 2 main criteria. These criteria are:

- i. the level of skill and/or experience and/or formal qualification which is required to carry out competently the work activities typically involved in the occupation; and
- ii. the nature of those work activities.

2.23 The first criterion - skill level - is applied where possible by reference to the level of formal qualifications currently required in order for a person to be recognised as fully competent in the occupation concerned; but in other cases by reference to the duration of training and/or experience recognised in the field of employment concerned as being normally required to pursue the occupation competently.

2.24 The second criterion - nature of work activities - may refer to any or all of a number of aspects of the work, including the materials handled, the type of tools and equipment used, and so on. However, it focuses specifically in all cases on work activities, rather than on other aspects of the job such as, for example, whether the worker has trainee or supervisory status,

or what industrial function the job serves. These are ignored by the SOC, - so that, for example, a 'carpenter', an 'apprentice or trainee carpenter' and a 'foreman carpenter' are all assigned to exactly the same occupational group.

### **Treatment of managerial occupations**

**2.25** An area where the nature of the activities, type of skill and status in employment may be difficult to separate conceptually is management. The SOC approach, is to treat jobs where the main activity is, 'management above the level of a first-line supervisor or foreman', as requiring a special class of skills and thus needing to be classified separately from the jobs of the workers managed. Thus in allocating jobs to occupational groups the SOC takes account, in appropriate and defined cases, of the designation 'manager' and also of indications that the person is the proprietor of a business. These are treated as indications that the job involves activities and skills typical of managers.

**2.26** On the same principle there are a few cases where allocation to an occupational group may be assisted by knowledge of whether or not the person has self-employed status. In these limited respects, information on status in employment is taken into account in the SOC.

### **Treatment of labouring and similar unskilled occupations**

**2.27** Jobs having the title 'Labourer' are in general classified, along with other jobs requiring relatively little skill, qualification or experience, to Major Group 9 of the SOC. Because of the unspecific terms in which many such jobs are reported in practice it is necessary to invoke a quasi-industrial principle for classifying below major group level. This gives rise to minor group headings such as:

'91 Other occupations in mining and manufacturing'.

'92 Other occupations in construction', and so on.

**2.28** The ultimate recourse is to Minor Group 99 and Unit Group 990 which is a catch-all for 'All other labourers and related workers'. The practical implications of this are tending to diminish as the number of generalised unskilled jobs in the economy continues to decline.

### **Treatment of Armed Forces occupations**

**2.29** Members of the Armed Forces may in certain cases have jobs which are unique to that sector of the economy. The SOC makes provision for military occupations specified in terms of ranks (e.g. 'Lieutenant Commander', 'Sergeant' etc.) in Minor Groups 15 (Commissioned Officers) and 60 (NCOs and other ranks). In other cases job titles, if given, may equate to those of civilian jobs (e.g. vehicle mechanic, radio operator etc.) though of course the persons concerned all hold military ranks also. Here the basic classificatory assumption is that both Armed Forces and civilian jobs will be coded to the same groups without any distinction being made between them.

### **Treatment of agricultural, forestry and fishing occupations**

**2.30** Occupations which are specifically agricultural, forestry and fishing, but not managerial, in nature are allocated to Minor Group 90 of SOC and its constituent Unit Groups. This group of occupations is sufficiently distinct from other occupations to require its own small set of minor groups and might therefore claim its own major group. However, one criterion for distinguishing major groups was that each should contain a substantial proportion of all occupations, and the proportion of the labour force currently engaged in agriculture, forestry and fishing is now so small that major group status was judged not to be appropriate.

### **Classification of Industries**

**2.31** The industry in which a person is engaged is determined by the business or industrial activity in which his or her occupation is followed. While the occupational classification takes account only of the nature of the work performed, the industrial classification relates only to the nature of the service or product to which the labour contributes. For example, a carpenter would be classified industrially to building, if employed by a builder, but to brewing if employed by a brewery firm. The allocation of an employed person (a person who had a job at sometime in the week before Census day) to an industry, was based on the answer given to Question 18 on the Census form. Industries are classified in the tables according to the revised 'Standard Industrial Classification' (SIC) (HMSO 1980 ISBN 0 11 6307641) issued by the Central Statistical Office. As SIC 1980 was also used to classify industries in 1981 Tables, it will be possible to make direct comparisons between those and 1991 Tables. Paragraphs 2.32-2.47 below are selected extracts from the preface to that publication:

## Introduction

**2.32** The United Kingdom economy is made up of a wide range of economic activities through which goods are produced or services rendered by firms and other organisations. For analytical purposes, economic activities of a similar nature may be grouped together into 'industries', for example into agriculture, motor vehicle manufacture, retail distribution, catering, national government service. A system used to group activities in this way is described as an industrial classification. 'Industry' in this context is not restricted to extractive or production activities but extends to the provision of goods and services of all kinds.

**2.33** Such a classification usually starts with a small number of broad groups of activities which are then subdivided into progressively narrower groups so that the classification can be used with varying amounts of detail for different purposes. Thus a broad group 'Transport and communication' may be subdivided first into the different modes of transport (road, rail, water, air) and communication (postal services, telecommunications) and these in turn into smaller subdivisions such as road haulage, bus and coach services etc.

## The basis and structure of the classification

**2.34** The classification is intended to apply to units about which important economic statistics are collected. A number of different factors have been taken into account in the classification. They include the nature of the process or of the work done, the principal raw material used, the type or intended use of goods produced or handled, and the type of service rendered. Different factors predominate in different parts of the classification and in many cases a broad group based on one common factor is subdivided by reference to another. The different headings of the classification (i.e. the short titles of the industries) are accordingly worded so as to indicate the factor or combination of factors on which they are based and this is followed in each case by a brief description of the activities included.

**2.35** The full range of activities is first divided into 10 broad Divisions (listed in paragraph 12 below) each denoted by a single digit from 0 to 9. The Divisions are in turn subdivided into Classes (each denoted by the addition of a second digit), the Classes into Groups (3 digits) and the Groups into activity headings (4 digits). There are 10 Divisions, 60 Classes, 222 Groups and 334 Activity headings. The full number of possible subdivisions at each level is not necessarily used but is varied according to the diversity of activities included. For example, Division 0 Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing is divided into only 3 Classes, without further subdivisions, whereas Division 4 Other Manufacturing Industries has 8 Classes, 50 Groups and 91 Activity headings. The use of 0 as the final digit for a Class, Group or Activity heading normally indicates that it is the only subdivision at that level, thus Group 140 is the only Group in Class 14 (Mineral oil processing) but is itself divided into 2 Activity headings, 1401 and 1402. Class 16, (Production and distribution of electricity, gas and other forms of energy) on the other hand has 3 Groups which are therefore numbered 161, 162 and 163 but since one of these is further subdivided the Activity headings are numbered 1610, 1620 and 1630...

## Statistical units

**2.36** The classification is applied to units on the basis of their principal activity. Frequently no problem arises in defining the relevant unit. This will be the case, for example, where the unit is situated at a single address, is mainly engaged in a single activity (or group of activities falling within the same heading of the classification) and is operated as a separate entity for the purposes of record keeping and accounting (including VAT returns).

**2.37** In many cases, however, the situation is more complex. Many units produce, sell or provide a variety of goods or services, some of which are considered to be appropriate to one heading of the classification and some to another. In such cases the unit as a whole is classified according to the type of goods or services which make up the greater part of its production, sales or service. In government inquiries a unit's classification is made on the basis of information relating to the unit which is supplied on the particular return or which is already available from other inquiries. In some cases classification may be based on the unit's own description of its principal activity.

**2.38** The units to be classified may vary according to the type of data being collected and the purposes for which the data are required. In view of this it is important that when analyses by industry are prepared the statistical unit used for the inquiry concerned should be defined. Sometimes, in order to secure comparability between the results of different inquiries, it may be necessary to give some units more than one classification. This may occur, for example, when a unit at one address can provide a limited range of data, say, employment but for the provision of more comprehensive data has to be combined with another unit, or units, under the same ownership which are mainly engaged in a different activity.

**2.39** Many businesses produce for their own use goods or services which are normally produced for sale by other industries. Typical examples are the manufacture or printing of containers for their own products, the generation of electricity, research, the repair and maintenance of buildings and equipment, and occasionally, the construction or extension of buildings. If the relevant range of information is available these ancillary activities are treated as separate units and classified according to their

own activity. But frequently the necessary data are not available, and the ancillary activities cannot be distinguished for most statistical purposes. When ancillary activities are carried out at separate locations it may be possible to treat them as units for a limited range of data e.g. for the Census of Employment.

**2.40** The sales staff of a manufacturing business are not treated as a separate establishment unless separate wholesale or retail outlets are operated and complete accounts are kept for them.

**2.41** The classification of head offices or other central offices at separate locations from those at which the main activities of the business are carried out is determined by the nature of the activities of the units which they serve. If those units are all classified to the same industry there is no problem, but if they are classified to 2 or more different industries, the classification of the head office, etc., is that of the largest part of the activities. Exceptionally, if the activities are very diffuse, the central office is classified in heading 8396 - Central offices not allocatable elsewhere - which is also used for the UK offices of businesses operating mainly abroad.

### **Some special points**

**2.42** Steel - An exception to the rule of classification according to major activity is that reporting units whose activities include the basic manufacture of iron and steel as defined in the ECSC Treaty, are classified to heading 2210 - Iron and steel industry.

**2.43** Merchanting activities - Establishments mainly engaged in merchanting, broking, importing and exporting are classified to the appropriate heading in the distributive trades, not to the industry or trade producing the goods in which they deal.

**2.44** Repair Work - Much repair work is carried out either by the manufacturers or by the distributors of the goods concerned, or of similar goods, and in such cases it is rarely possible to distinguish a separate unit engaged mainly in repair work. There are, however, numerous units which specialise in repair work, mainly of consumer goods - motor vehicles, footwear, watches and clocks, television and radio sets, etc. These specialist repair activities are classified separately. The repair of capital equipment, such as ships, aircraft, and most types of plant and machinery is classified with the corresponding manufacture, even if carried out by specialist units. Units engaged in the repair and maintenance of buildings are classified to Construction.

**2.45** Construction - In principle all construction work should be classified to Class 50 - Construction. In practice it is impossible to obtain a full range of economic statistics for construction work done by all directly employed labour. These activities will generally be classified to the same heading as the establishment which they serve. The construction activities of direct labour forces employed by local authorities and government departments, using direct labour are, however, allocated to Class 50.

**2.46** Installation Work - The installation of machinery, equipment, etc. is normally carried out by the manufacturer or distributor and is not distinguishable as a separate activity. There are some business units, however, where installation is the only, or the major activity. Such units are classified according to the type of equipment involved as follows:

- i. The installation of items which can be regarded as forming an integral part of a building, e.g. an electrical wiring system, heating and ventilating apparatus, is classified to Construction.
- ii. The installation of equipment which requires little more than the connection of the equipment to the mains, e.g. of domestic washing machines, television sets, is classified to Distribution.
- iii. The installation of plant and machinery, e.g. a computer is... classified with the manufacturer of similar articles....

**2.47** Industry codes were assigned, as far as possible, by reference to lists from the Department of Economic Development which gave names and addresses of employers by industry code. Where the employer's name at (a) of the question was not listed, a code was allocated from the information given at (a) and (b) of the question.

### **Social Class**

**2.48** The groups in the classification of occupations are arranged into a small number of broad categories called Social Classes. Economically active, and retired persons are assigned to one of the following Social Classes by reference to their present or former occupation:

- I Professional etc., occupations.
- II Managerial and technical occupations.
- III Skilled occupations:  
(N) non-manual. (M) manual.
- IV Partly skilled occupations.
- V Unskilled occupations.

**2.49** The occupation groups included in each of these categories have been selected in such a way as to bring together, as far as possible, people with similar levels of occupational skill. In general, each occupation group is assigned as a whole to one or other Social Class and no account is taken of difference between individuals in the same occupation group e.g. differences of education or levels of remuneration. However for persons having the employment status of foreman or manager, the following rules apply:

- (a) each occupation is given a basic Social Class.
- (b) persons of foreman status whose basic Social Class is IV or V are allocated to Social Class III.
- (c) persons of manager status are allocated to Social Class II with certain exceptions.

### **Socio-economic Groups**

**2.50** Classification by socio-economic groups was introduced in 1951 and extensively amended in 1961. The classification aims to bring together people with jobs of similar social and economic status. The allocation of occupied persons to socio-economic groups is determined by considering their employment status and occupation.

The socio-economic groups with brief definitions are:

**(1) Employers and managers in central and local government, industry, commerce, etc. - large establishments**

- 1.1 Employers in industry, commerce, etc.  
Persons who employ others in non-agricultural enterprises employing 25 or more persons.
- 1.2 Managers in central and local government, industry, commerce, etc.  
Persons who generally plan and supervise in non-agricultural enterprises employing 25 or more persons.

**(2) Employers and managers in industry, commerce, etc. - small establishments**

- 2.1 Employers in industry, commerce, etc. - small establishments. As in 1.1 but in establishments employing fewer than 25 persons.
- 2.2 Managers in industry, commerce, etc. - small establishments. As in 1.2 but in establishments employing fewer than 25 persons.

**(3) Professional workers - self-employed**

Self-employed persons engaged in work normally requiring qualifications of university degree standard.

**(4) Professional workers - employees**

Employees engaged in work normally requiring qualifications of university degree standard.

**(5) Intermediate non-manual workers**

- 5.1 Ancillary workers and artists.  
Employees engaged in non-manual occupations ancillary to the professions, not normally requiring qualifications of university degree standard; persons engaged in artistic work and not employing others therein. Self-employed nurses, medical auxiliaries, teachers, work study engineers and technicians are included.
- 5.2 Foremen and supervisors non-manual.  
Employees (other than managers) engaged in occupations included in group 6, who formally and immediately supervise others engaged in such occupations.

(6) **Junior non-manual workers**

Employees, not exercising general planning or supervisory powers, engaged in clerical, sales and non-manual communications occupations, excluding those who have additional and formal supervisory functions (these are included in group 5.2).

(7) **Personal service workers**

Employees engaged in service occupations caring for food, drink, clothing and other personal needs.

(8) **Foremen and supervisors - manual**

Employees (other than managers) who formally and immediately supervise others engaged in manual occupations, whether or not themselves engaged in such occupations.

(9) **Skilled manual workers**

Employees engaged in manual occupations which require considerable and specific skills.

(10) **Semi-skilled manual workers**

Employees engaged in manual occupations which require slight but specific skills.

(11) **Unskilled manual workers**

Other employees engaged in manual occupations.

(12) **Own account workers (other than professional)**

Self-employed persons engaged in any trade, personal service or manual occupation not normally requiring training of university degree standard and having no employees other than family workers.

(13) **Farmers - employers and managers**

Persons who own, rent or manage farms, market gardens or forests, employing people other than family workers in the work of the enterprise.

(14) **Farmers - own account**

Persons who own or rent farms, market gardens or forests and having no employees other than family workers.

(15) **Agricultural workers**

Persons engaged in tending crops, animals, game or forests, or operating agricultural or forestry machinery.

(16) **Members of armed forces**

(17) **Inadequately described and not stated occupations**

## **Part-time Workers**

**2.51** Part-time workers were persons in a job in the week preceding Census day, in which the hours worked, excluding any overtime, were usually 30 hours or less per week.



## **Place of Work and Place of Residence**

**2.52** Most tables in this report relate to Northern Ireland as a whole and the distinction between place of work, place of residence or place of enumeration does not arise.

Table 4 classifies people by the local government district of enumeration. Table 9 shows the working population in each local government district. Persons with no fixed workplace or no stated workplace have been assumed to work in the area of their usual residence.

## **Presentation Conventions**

**2.53** A dash (-) indicates that the entry is zero. A blank indicates that a particular combination of line and column is impossible. In the presentation of rates, a rate shown as 0 indicates that the actual rate is less than one half of a unit but is not zero.

**2.54** For reference purposes the H form used for private households in the 1991 Census is produced at the end of this report.

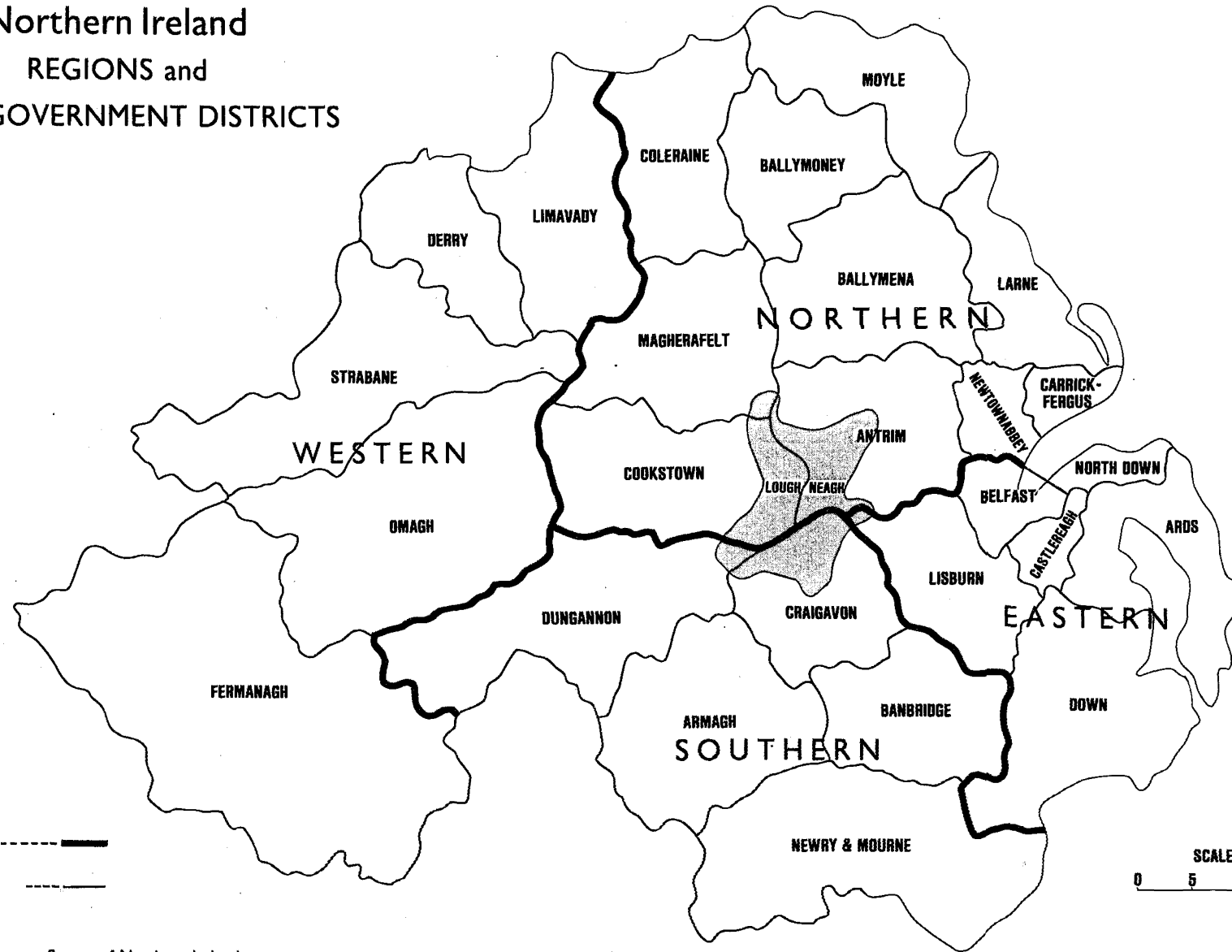
