Household Travel Survey – Methodological Change (August 2016)

In August 2016, the Central Statistics Office (CSO) implemented an improved weighting scheme to the Household Travel Survey (HTS); which has been applied retrospectively to Quarter one 2012.

With regards to Northern Ireland (NI) Tourism Statistics and Local Government District (LGD) Tourism Statistics, the HTS is the source for the number of overnight trips to NI by residents of the Republic of Ireland (RoI). Additional information is also provided associated with these overnight trips including number of nights, expenditure, reason for visit, and accommodation type used whilst in NI.

Methodological Change

Central Statistics Office treats overnight trips to NI by residents of Rol as outbound travel. The change in weighting to outbound travel is detailed below:

From Quarter one 2012 onwards, survey data for outbound travel are weighted to agree with population estimates broken down by sex, age group and region (NUTS 3). These population estimates are provided by CSO's Quarterly National Household Survey (QNHS). These weightings are then applied to survey results. The results for outbound travel are subsequently further weighted to agree with the Tourism & Travel results.

Revisions to data

There have been revisions to outbound travel data from Quarter one 2012 onwards as a result of the change to the weighting methodology.

The Northern Ireland Annual Tourism Statistics 2015 and the External Overnight Visitors to Northern Ireland 2015 were also revised as of the 12th August 2016 to include the revised HTS data from Quarter one 2012 onwards.

The Northern Ireland Local Government District Tourism Statistics (2012-2015) were revised as of the 6th July 2017 to include the revised HTS data from 2012 onwards.

Due to the revisions in the HTS data, discontinuities in all of the series relating to NI Tourism Statistics (including at Local Government District level) have occurred. Therefore, results of RoI residents taking overnight trips to NI (their associated number of nights and expenditure) from Quarter one 2012 onwards are not directly comparable to results prior to Quarter one 2012. However, the impact on Local Government District tourism in Northern Ireland (trips, nights and spend during overnight trips) was minimal and insignificant.

A summary of the impact these revisions have had on the number of overnight trips, associated number of nights and expenditure for each Local Government District can be found in Tables 1 - 3 below.
