

2023/2024 Sickness Absence in the Northern Ireland Civil Service





The average number of days lost to sickness absence. An increase on the previous year's figure of 12.3 days.



56.9% of staff went the ent

of staff went the entire 2023/2024 period without a spell of sickness absence. A decrease on the previous year's figure of 57.8%.

Average Working Days Lost




2023/24 saw an increase in the rate of absence compared to the **previous year** and exceeded levels to those recorded prior to the **Covid-19** pandemic.


£44.0 million

in direct salary cost was lost due to sickness absence, equivalent to around **4.0%** of the total NICS paybill.



On average, **females** lost approximately **1.1 times** as many sick days as their **male** colleagues.

With **pregnancy related disorders** excluded, the average number of days lost for females was **14.2 days**.



Approximately 1 in 10 NICS staff had a spell of sickness absence due to a mental health¹ illness.
43.0% of all working days lost
