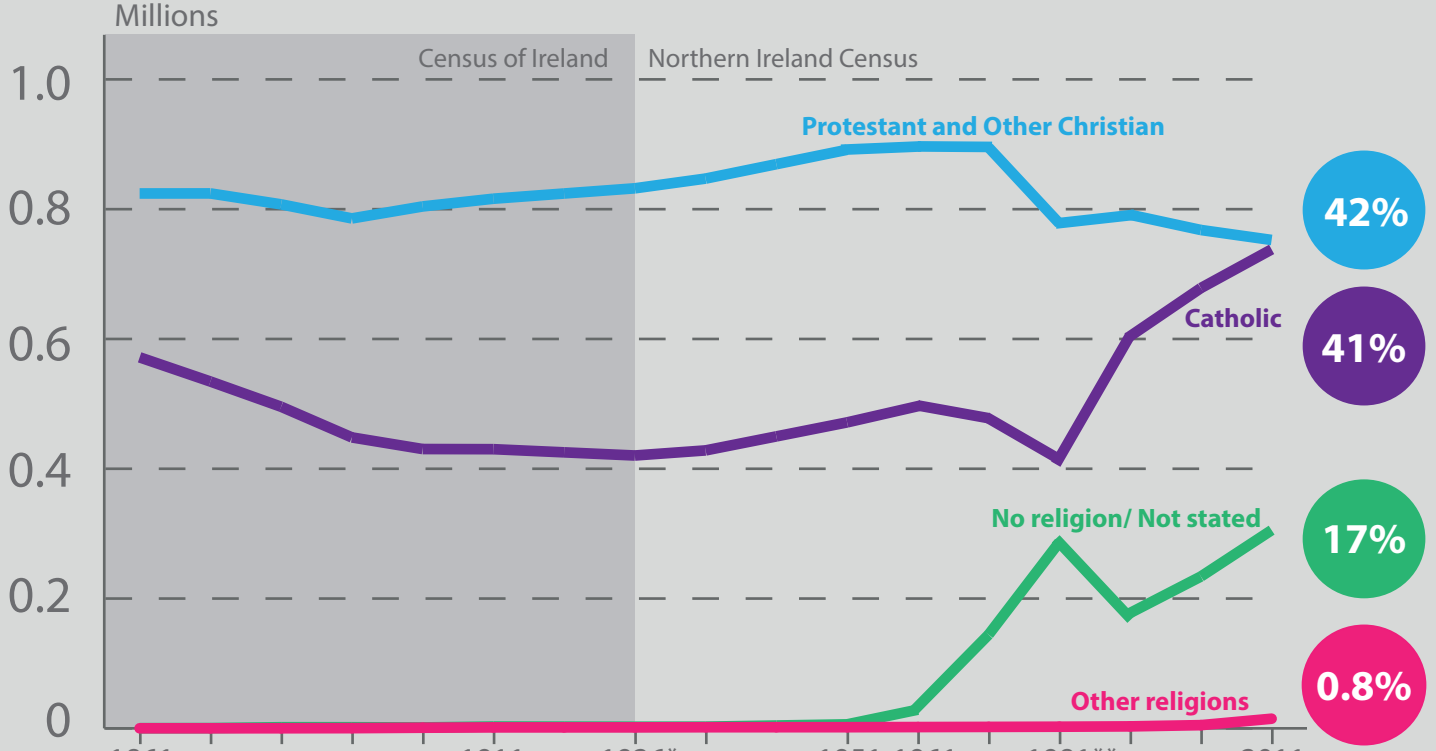

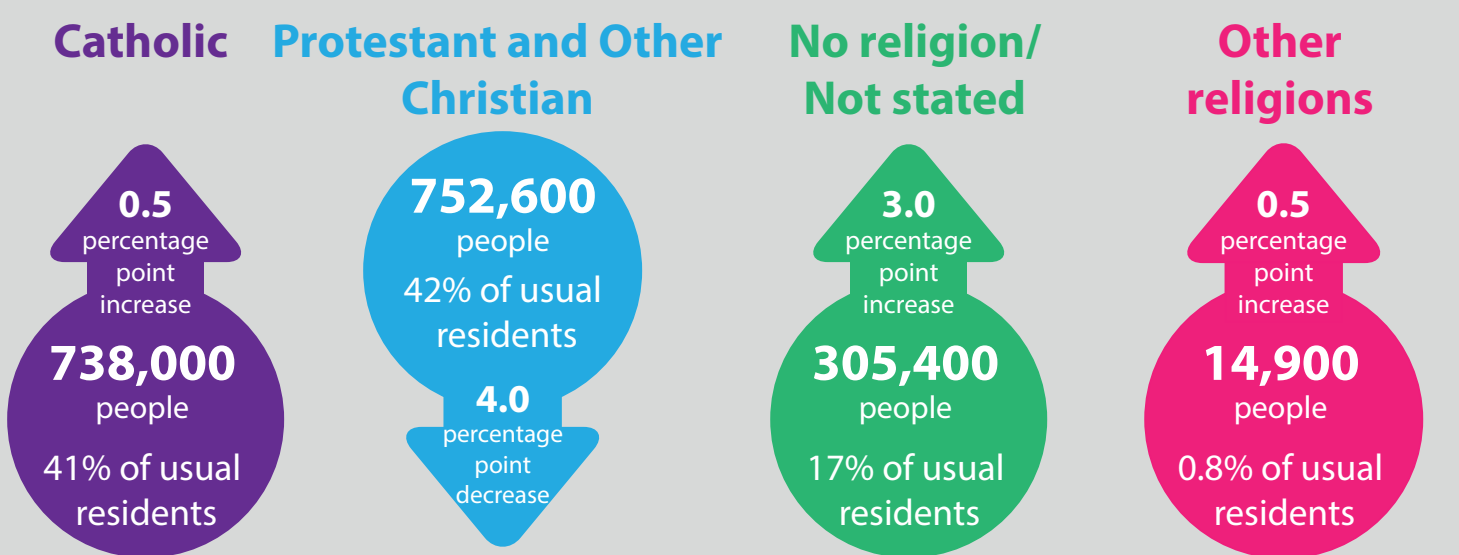
Religion 1861-2011



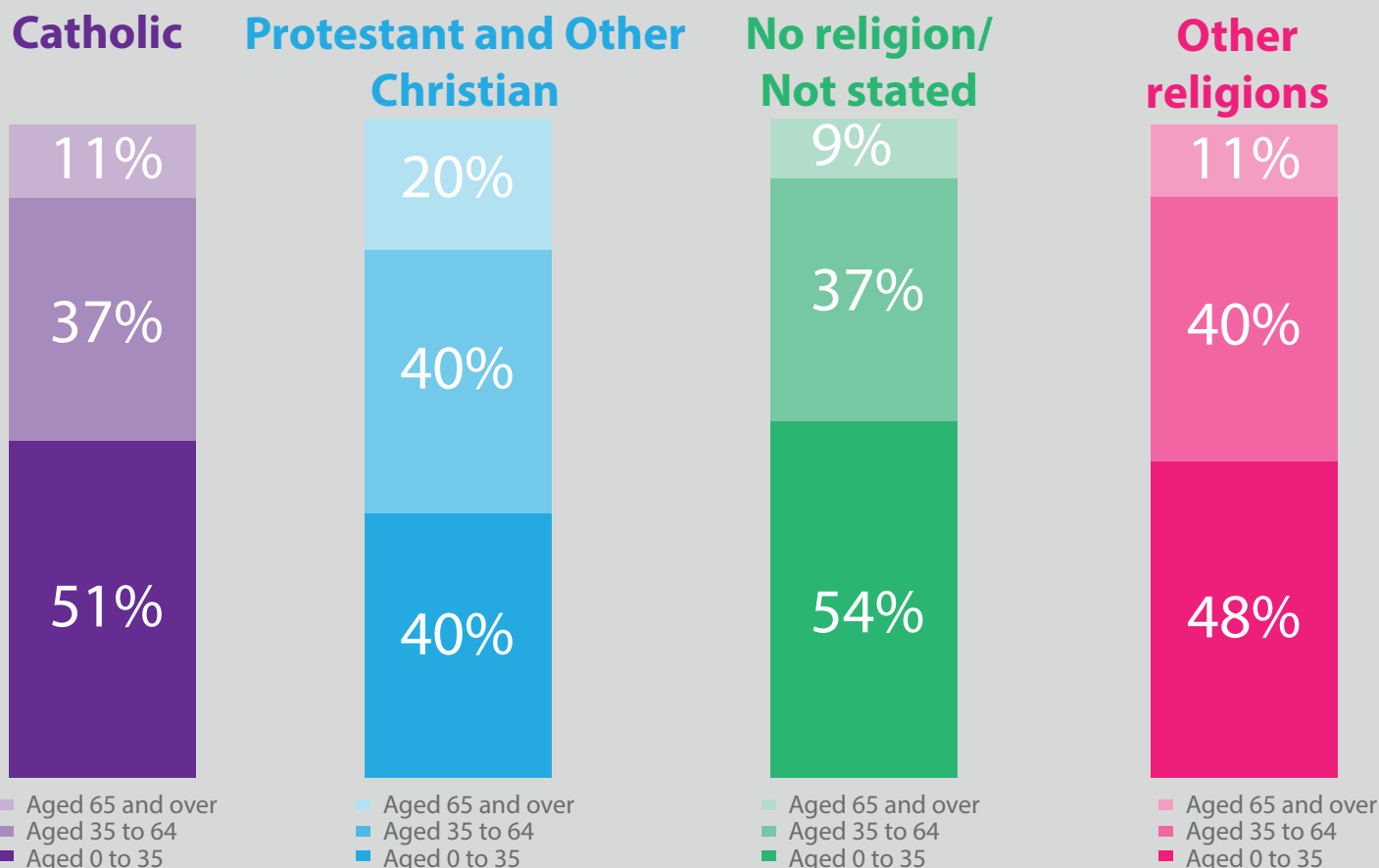
*The first Census of Northern Ireland took place in 1926; earlier figures are drawn from the Census of Ireland.

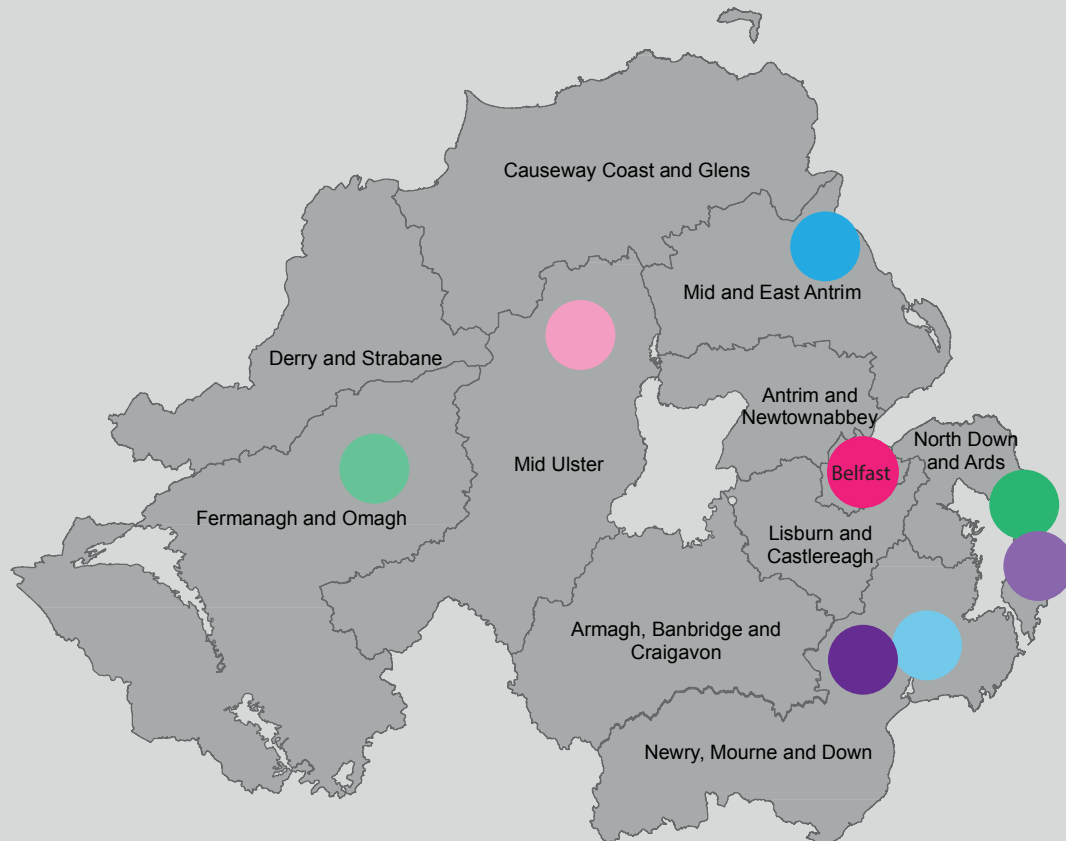
Religion 2001-2011

Geography: Highest and Lowest Rates for Religion (LGD2014)



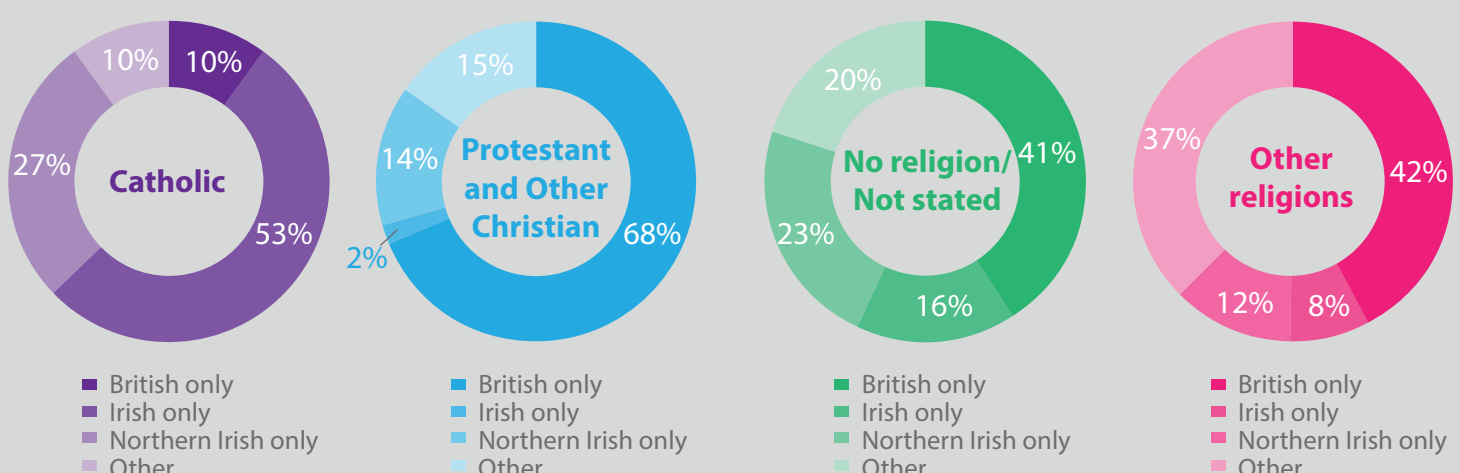

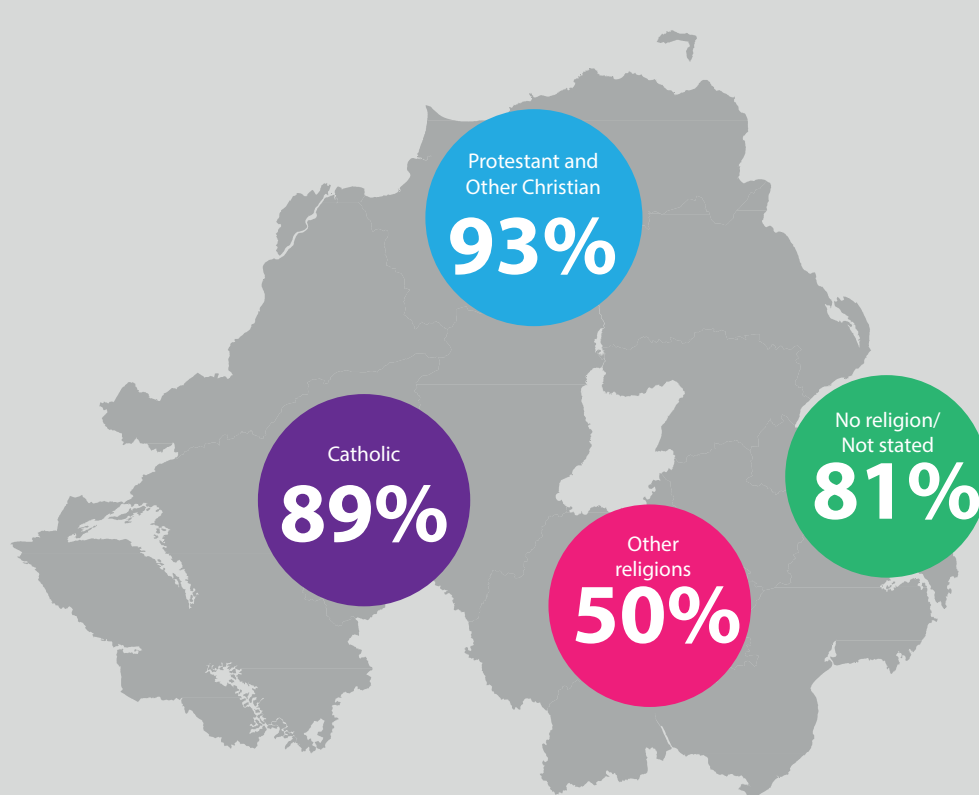

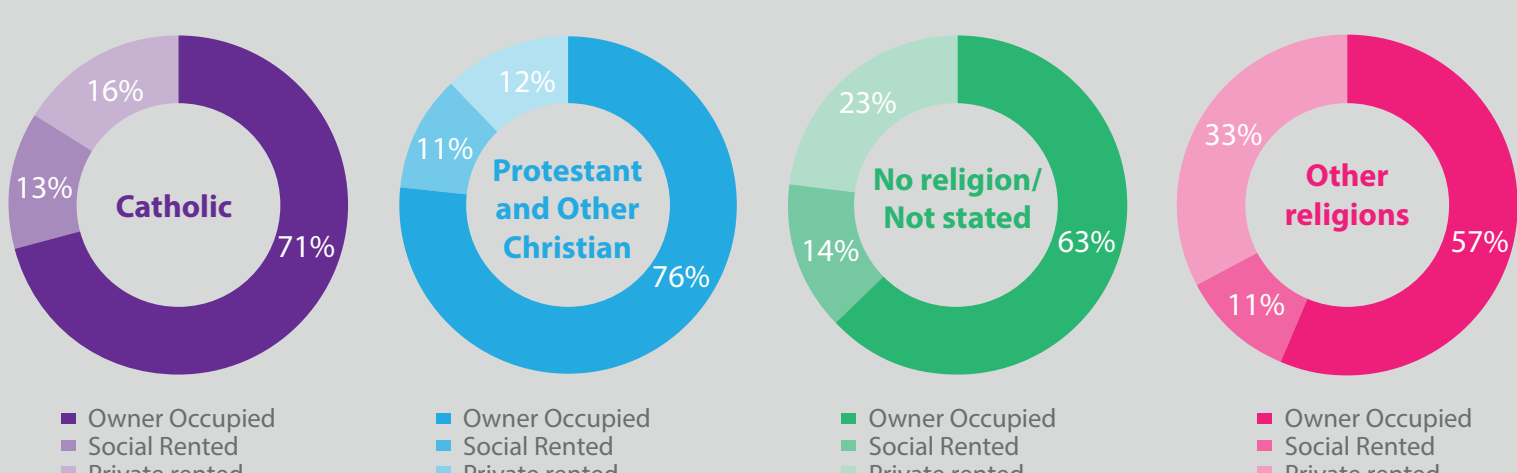
